Five Initiatives Supported through the Building Communities Grant Program

\$46,730 was awarded this spring through the Building Communities Grant Program.

The Virden Auditorium Theatre Restoration Project received \$20,000 in much-needed funding through the Facilities Construction or Improvement Capital Grant category of the grant program. The funding will support critical upgrades, including new seating, improved lighting, updated railings and carpet, and much-needed repairs to the flooring, lobby, and stage areas.

The RM of Pipestone Handivan Service and the Sandy Lake-Elphinstone Handivan Project were both awarded \$10,000 to support the purchase of new vehicles for their programs.

Two organizations were given funds through the Arts, Culture and Sport category. The Burrows Trail Arts Council received a \$5,000 grant to host four-time world hoop dancing champion Dallas Arcand in Turtle River School Division schools this fall, while the Christian Heritage School in Brandon received \$1,730.68 to create a "storybook orchard" on school grounds.

For this spring's intake, we received over 50 applications from across Westman and the Parkland area, with requests totalling close to 1 million dollars. Since its launch in the fall of 2023, the Building Communities Grant Program has invested \$178,048.68 in 16 projects and initiatives.



14 Students Supported through Sunrise Scholarship Program

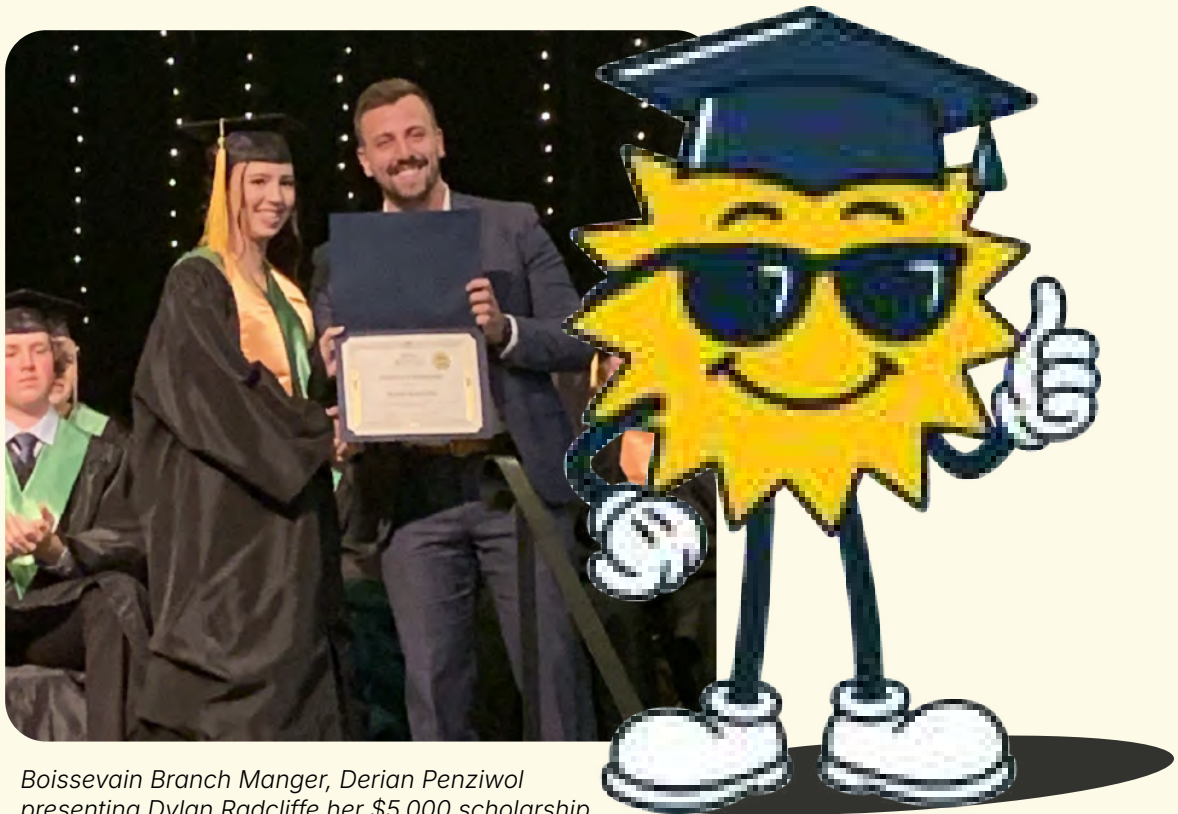
Sunrise Credit Union awarded **14 scholarships** totalling **\$24,000** to students across southwestern Manitoba in June.

Dylan Radcliffe of Boissevain was awarded a \$5,000 scholarship in recognition of being an outstanding high school graduate pursuing post-secondary education.

In addition, Danika Scharff of Virden received the \$3,000 scholarship awarded to a Sunrise Credit Union Summer Student, Claire Taoyu Jin of Brandon received a \$3,000 scholarship for a student continuing their education at Assiniboine College, and Jessica Voth of Cypress River received a \$3,000 scholarship for a student continuing their education at Brandon University.

Ten other students were given \$1,000 scholarships to support their pursuit of post-secondary education this fall.

The selection process was rigorous, with 60 applicants. A five-person committee evaluated each application on academics, leadership, extracurricular activities, volunteerism, community involvement, and essay quality.

Bertholet Claims Our Manitoba Photo Contest

Dylan Bertholet of Lauder, Manitoba, captured the top prize in the 13th annual Sunrise Credit Union Our Manitoba Photo Contest.

A panel of Sunrise staff selected Bertholet's photo, 'Prairie Storm,' as one of the 30 finalists from the 217 entries for this year's contest. A week-long public vote on the 30 finalists, held in April through www.ourmanitoba.org, saw Bertholet's photo garner the most votes and claim the top spot.

All 13 finalists received a canvas print of the winning photograph, appeared on Sunrise Credit Union's branch TVs and social media channels, and will be featured in the 2026 Sunrise Credit Union calendar. Additionally, Bertholet earned the Grand Prize, a \$500 One-Year Term Deposit from Sunrise Credit Union.



Sunrise Supports Northern Wildfire Evacuees



In early June, Sunrise Credit Union donated \$4,000 worth of Brandon transit passes and Manitoba Summer fair tickets to evacuees who had been displaced by wildfires in northern Manitoba and were staying in Brandon.

Sunrise's commitment to the community was further demonstrated when they hosted a drop-off centre for donations for a week. The overwhelming response from the public, who generously contributed toys, games, strollers, snacks, seasonal clothing, and baby items, showcased the true spirit of unity and support in times of crisis.

In addition, Sunrise Credit Union collaborated with other credit unions in Brandon to host a fundraising BBQ event at Sobey's West on June 14. The event resulted in an additional \$1,748.40 being donated to the Red Cross to support wildfire evacuees.



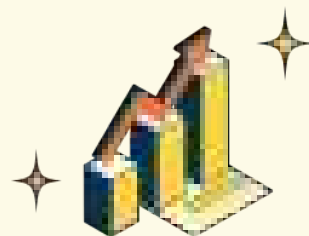
Electronic Recycling Association Pickup in May

Sunrise Out and About



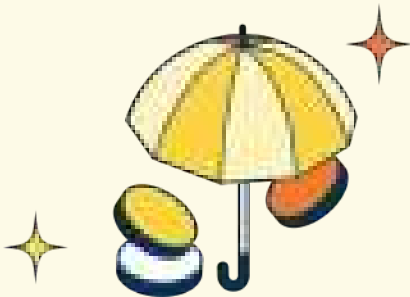
