Free 20 Week Programme

What does the programme cover?

This course builds the knowledge and skills needed to navigate life with confidence. You will learn to identify potential risks and develop strategies to keep yourself and others safe. You'll explore future career options and build strong research skills to support informed decision-making. The course also provides insight into real workplace environments through practical learning and a work experience placement. Finally, you will deepen your understanding of your role as a citizen of Aotearoa, including rights, responsibilities, and how society operates.

Who can Enrol

This is a youth qualification designed for all learners aged 16 – 24 (15 with an exemption) who do not already hold a qualification at level 2 or above.

When can I Enrol?

You can enrol throughout the year and these are our key intake dates:

Term 1 – 26 January & 2 March

Term 2 – 20 April & 25 May

Term 3 – 29 June & 17 August

Term 4 – 21 September & 9 November
