

## WH Questions with the BE Verb in the Simple Present

WH Questions Words: *Who, What, Why, When, What time, Where, and How*

Notice that the BE Verb comes after the WH Question Word in WH Questions.

You **are** in the library.

Where **are** you?

He **is** sick.

How **is** he?

They **are** flowers.

What **are** they?

## WH Questions in the Simple Present with Regular Verbs

You must use **Do** and **Does** to help form WH Questions with Regular Verbs. Who and What questions can be tricky! Go to the drill on Who and What Questions in the subject and object positions for more extensive practice.

### Structure:

- I work **every day**.
- **When do** you work?
  
- He works **in the computer lab**.
- **Where does** he work? (Notice the -s on works moves to does.)
  
- They work **fast**.
- **How do** they work every day?

Change the statements to a WH Question using **Who, What, Why, When, What time, Where, and How**. Use **DO** or **DOES** to help form the questions.

**Example:** My kids like to play **video games**. What do your kids like to play? OR What do your kids like to do?
