## Description

- University of California variety
- Short-day
- Medium-dark red fruit.
- Consistently large to very large fruit size. Firm, shiny and consistently conical fruit.
- Flavour very good.
- Yield is very good.
- Good resistance to wet weather.
- Plants are vigorous and plant spacing should be wide enough to allow air movement around the plants at least 200mm to 250mm between plants.

## Strong points

Good tolerance to rain and weather damage

## Weak points

- Flavour can be poor early season and size can drop late season.
- Subject to post harvest rots especially if grown too close and not clean harvested regularly.
- Vigorous plant not well suited to table-top growing systems

**Yield in NZ** Average annual production in the Auckland trial plots (through December) over the past 19 years has been 770 g/plant with berry size 21 g/fruit planted at either 200 or 250mm apart.
