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Lucid Air continues to surprise the EV world with its impressive range abilities, luxurious features, and rapid acceleration. The Air Sapphire model can even rival a Tesla Model S Plaid, reaching speeds faster than 2.6 seconds to go from 0-60mph. As we approach 2025, let's take a closer look at what changes have been made to the Air lineup, making it competitive with one of the longest ranges on the market or if it's time to switch to other options.Since its launch in 2021, Lucid Air has been a game-changer. With record-breaking EPA-estimated range and impressive acceleration, the Air Dream Edition Range delivered an astonishing 520 miles, while the Dream Edition Performance hit 60mph in just 2.6 seconds. Following this success, Lucid introduced new trims with strong specs, competitive pricing, and a growing fan base.The most notable change for the 2025 lineup is the reduced battery capacity from 88.0 kWh to 84.0 kWh on the Pure trim. However, this reduction didn't affect range; instead, it improved by just one mile, reaching 420 miles of maximum EPA-estimated range due to weight reduction and an energy efficiency rating of 146 MPGe.A heat pump is now standard across all trims, allowing drivers to conserve energy while using climate controls or preconditioning the car. This update also contributed to gains in range across several trims. Additionally, new control hardware with increased processing power aims to reduce system lagging and bugs, enhancing the overall driving experience.Lucid Air owners of 2025 will also receive a complimentary scheduled maintenance plan covering two years or 24,000 miles, as well as new driver-assistance features like blind-spot monitoring, adaptive cruise control, and a 360-degree exterior camera system.The author compares their experiences with a Lucid Air Touring and Tesla models. They mention that Lucid's driving experience is more refined, comfortable, and quiet compared to Teslas. The Lucid also has more interior space and better software responsiveness. However, the author notes that Lucid's driving assistance system, DreamDrive Pro, takes some getting used to and isn't as polished as Tesla's Autopilot. In contrast, the author finds charging with non-Tesla networks to be a hassle, but they have had good experiences with Lucid's service model.That I can text my own Lucid service rep is amazing, but concerns about sustainability with scaling arise. Living far from a service center (3+ hours) makes me wonder if long-term practicality will be affected by increased sales. It reminds me of Tesla's early days, which were very hands-on and customer-focused, but changed over time. Now, Tesla's service is slow at best.Reliability-wise, I've experienced a minor issue with the voice assistant, but both national customer service and my local service rep are working on it and will replace the main panel (at no cost) in my driveway. Two door handles froze shortly after owning an S, but that was easily resolved.A Few Annoying Quirks:* Unlocking responsiveness can be unpredictable.* The turn signal sound doesn't have a consistent tempo.* There's noticeable motor noise.* Exterior design is subjective; the Lucid lacks visual impact like my Model S used to have.Despite some issues, I love my AT. Comfort, ride quality, and driving experience are top-notch. Lucid needs work on charging infrastructure and refining autopilot to match Tesla's, but recent software updates give me hope for continued improvements. Service has been excellent so far.Overall, the Air is quiet luxury with serious engineering chops. The cabin feels like a Scandinavian lounge. Drive is fantastic, with composure, space, and smooth ride that could be prescribed for anxiety.CEO and CTO for over five years, stepped down to become Strategic Technical Advisor to the Chairman of the Board in February 2025. Driver assistance and Autopilot comparisons are inconclusive, but Lucid aims for a different type of driver. Overall, Lucid offers a unique approach to driving, focusing on the road rather than showmanship.620-horsepower engine enables acceleration from 0-60 mph in just 3.4 seconds, with an estimated EPA range of 406 miles. However, the Sapphire's capabilities are offset by its hefty price tag.The Lucid Air offers a range of advanced safety features, including automatic emergency braking and adaptive cruise control. An optional DreamDrive Pro suite adds lane keep assist and sensor hardware for Level 3 autonomous driving capability. The car also boasts ample cargo space and a spacious interior, with a large trunk and roomy frunk. The infotainment system features a 34-inch display with multiple units, including a touchscreen for navigation and climate control.The 2025 Lucid Air models come with various trim levels, each offering distinct features and price points.
