

Clinic Welcomes New Nurse Practitioner


Patricia Calvert, CRNP, brings 26 years of nursing experience to Good Samaritan

The answer is a resounding "Yes!" Good Samaritan Health Clinic continues to meet a critical need for healthcare for people in need

in our community. According to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation via the Alabama Department of Public Health, **21% of Cullman County adult residents are uninsured**. This equates to over 10,000 people without health insurance in Cullman County ranking **Cullman 11th in the state** with only 10 Alabama counties having a higher uninsured adult population rate. In comparison, the state's average is only 18% uninsured. What these statistics show is a clear indication that the people of Cullman County need our services more than ever.

Did you know that even with the Affordable Care Act (ACA), there are still many uninsured in our community?

That's right! According to the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics, many individuals find themselves in a 'coverage gap', where their income is too high to qualify for Medicaid, and yet too low to receive the public subsidies and tax credits necessary for them to purchase insurance on the health care marketplaces. This can put people in a difficult position. According to a local Certified Application Counselor for the ACA, a single household (HH) must make a minimum of \$12,140 per year and 2 person HH must make a minimum of \$16,460 in order to qualify through ACA. Many people are left out and therefore in urgent need of our services for free, quality healthcare to maintain their health now and in the future.

"There are a lot of folks out there who can't afford the new coverage that their insurance company is providing." As Medical Director Dr. Jeremy Stidham explains, There are a lot of folks out there who can't afford the new coverage that their insurance company is providing. The increased deductibles and increased co-pays have forced them right out of their plans." This is a significant concern for these individuals. Many of our patients have chronic medical conditions that require daily medications and frequent office visits. Without Good Samaritan Clinic, these

patients would not have a continuum of quality health care or prescriptions and would be forced to use the emergency room for their care, which is not sustainable for them, the hospital, or our community. That's just one of the many reasons why the Clinic plays such a vital role in Cullman County.

"We keep data regarding the patient care at the clinic, and we find it better than the national averages and better than our community averages. The primary care is the key to what we do here. By providing primary care to the people of Cullman who need it, we are not only preventing diseases that they may otherwise have had but we are finding diseases in earlier stages where they can be treated."

Thanks to the care they receive here, our patients are given the opportunity to manage their conditions and are able to lead healthy, productive lives.


