### Stay Connected to the Progress

*Construction is on track for completion by the end of June, with our team preparing to transition into the new clinic in August. Thank you for helping bring this vision to life.*

It will include a dedicated cardio room, as well as an expanded waiting area that will double as a space for after-hours patient education classes. In addition, a drive-through option for our medication dispensary will improve access and convenience for those we serve.

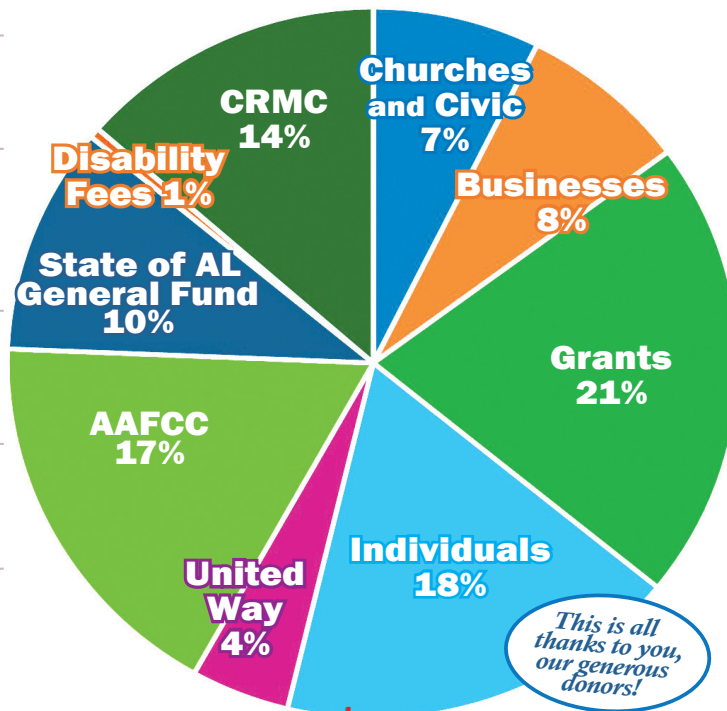
