## System Orientation Notice. February 2026.

### Why This Notice May Be Relevant

You may encounter RegistryRail Records within your workflows; this notice provides orientation before reliance is required.

It is typically shared within teams to support a common understanding of the functionality of RegistryRail Records created by colleagues, counterparties or external parties.

### What a RegistryRail™ Record Is

A RegistryRail Record is a sealed evidentiary artefact issued at the moment a declaration is made, preserved under neutral custody, rendering any subsequent change detectable.

### What RegistryRail™ Does

RegistryRail applies issuance-time neutral custody, timestamping, and tamper-evident integrity to declarations and supporting materials.

The evidentiary state is fixed at the moment of issuance, producing a sealed artefact that can be retained, cited, and reviewed independently.

It does not evaluate, interpret, verify, or judge submitted content. Assessment, reliance, and decision-making remain entirely external.

Responsibility for Record content remains with the submitting party and any independent reviewers who assess it.

### How a Record Is Created

Records are issued automatically, with no human handling or review.

At creation, the declaration and attachments are time-sealed automatically.

No account setup, login, or technical integration is required to create a Record; an email address is sufficient for delivery.

## Record Outputs

Each Record is issued as two independent artefacts:

1. **Live Record URL**  
A secure link for viewing and sharing, controlled by the creator.
2. **Reviewer Copy**  
A sealed downloadable file intended for long-term retention.

The Reviewer Copy includes:

- timestamps and record identifiers,
- the declaration as created,
- attachments as created, and
- integrity metadata sufficient to detect any alteration since issuance.

Once downloaded, the Reviewer Copy is complete and usable offline as an independent artefact, without reliance on the RegistryRail system being live.

## Access and Control of the Record

Access and sharing are controlled by the creator. The system does not interpret Records or participate in review decisions.

Records are encountered when shared by the creator as part of a professional or institutional workflow.

## System Orientation

Institutions and teams may issue a first Record at €1 to observe RegistryRail in operation. Subsequent Records are issued at €10 each, with no contracts, tiers, or lock-in.

## Reading This Notice in Context

This notice may be provided:

- alongside a Live Record URL,
- alongside a Reviewer Copy, or
- as advance orientation for teams who may encounter Records.

If you are reviewing a specific Record, that Record's artefacts are the authoritative representation of what was created and sealed at issuance.
