****QUALIFIERS FOR THE LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW**

Whilst we will make every effort to keep to the Timetable, exhibitors are reminded that it is a guideline only – and was compiled well before entries were open! Therefore, we reserve the right to amend timings and ring allocations if necessary. We will announce changes if they become necessary!

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to arrive at the Show field in sufficient time for the commencement of their classes. Classes will not commence prior to any given “Not before” timings. Bridgend Country Show Ltd will not accept responsibility for any exhibitor missing their classes and no entry fees will be refunded in this instance.

Where no “Not before times” are given, Classes will follow on.

Anyone abusing Judges, Stewards or other Officials will be required to leave the Show field – we are giving up our time so you can enjoy yourselves.

Objections must be lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the Class closing and must be accompanied by a £20.00 non-refundable fee. All objections will be judged on their merit. Objections relating to Society classes will be referred to the relevant Society before any judgement is reached.

Please note: All Societies receive copies of the entries prior to the Show running. So, entrants will have been checked. It is Not Acceptable for exhibitors to alter entries to non-registered horses or riders on the day and breaches of this will be reported to the relevant Society and you will be disqualified. So please don't do it.

A one-way system will be in operation for both Show days. Please follow the signs. Vehicles must be parked under the direction of the stewards. The gates will be open from 7.00am on both Show days.

Petrol generators are not permitted.

Please do not muck out your lorries / trailers onto the field – and take your litter home with you!!
There are bins provided and clearly marked throughout the Show fields
All vehicles admitted, along with their contents are left entirely at the owner's risk.

Protective headgear **MUST** be worn by **anyone** riding a horse/pony for any reason. This must comply with the relevant standards in force and must be correctly fastened. This applies to everyone – no exceptions. Anyone not complying will be asked to leave the Show field. Bridgend Country Show Ltd accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation

Sensory Whiskers – please refer to any rulings made by the Society under which you intend to exhibit.

Equine passports and vaccinations: all horses / ponies should have received at least one vaccination before entering any showing classes (foals excepted). Yearly vaccinations are acceptable. Random passports checks may be undertaken.

Entry Fees – please see individual classes.

London International Horse Show Qualifiers - Entries are subject to an £11 additional levy per class.

First Aid Fees are not included in entry fees.

The First Aid Fee is £5.00. No entries will be accepted without payment of this fee.

Entries are via Horse Monkey – Bridgend Country Show.

Late entries are not accepted.

Closing date is June 26th at midday.

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Subject to Clause 1.2 Bridgend Country Show Limited, its Directors, committee, officers, employees, agents or subcontractors (together the **“Show”**) will not be liable for or accountable to any person for:

- (a) any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise, or for any disease, damage or loss that may occur to any person.
- (b) any theft, damage, destruction or loss of property.
- (c) loss or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article or vehicle exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks

1.2) Nothing in this disclaimer shall limit or exclude the Association’s liability for:

- (a) death or personal injury or damage to property caused by negligence on the part of the Show
- (b) any matter in respect of which it would be unlawful for the Show to exclude or restrict liability.

1.3) Each exhibitor, competitor, its employees, agents, or subcontractors (together the **“Exhibitor”**) shall be held solely liable for any accident, loss, injury or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article, vehicle or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.

1.4) The Exhibitor shall indemnify and keep the Show indemnified against all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses and damages, including a claim made against the Show by a third party for death, personal injury or damage to property (including but not limited to any direct, indirect or consequential losses, loss of profit, loss of reputation and all interest, penalties and legal and other professional costs and expenses) suffered or incurred by the Show as a result of or in connection with any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.

1.5) Acceptance of the provisions of this disclaimer shall be a condition of entry.

1.6) The Exhibitor will have in force, maintain and comply with the terms of its own appropriate insurance (with a minimum limit of £5 million per claim for Public, Products and Pollution Liability) to cover all risks and liabilities which the Exhibitor may incur.

1.7) The Show reserves to itself by its Directors or with the authority of that body the Chairman of the Committee the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations and arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters questions or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also to refuse and to cancel any entries and relax any conditions or regulations as the Show may deem expedient.

1.8) The Show reserves to its directors and committee the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from events outside of the control of the Show, the Show shall not accept liability for any indirect or consequential loss, loss of profit, loss of reputation, all interests and penalties financial or otherwise arising thereby, nor for the refund of any fees and charges paid.

Tattersalls RoR NOVICE Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, any height, must have raced in GB and have current RoR Competition Membership. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses will be ridden by the Judge and will be stripped for conformation assessment. Horses to be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships Aintree, August 22nd, 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won: a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society including (inc SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open /Amateur Ridden Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, or any other open class except Tattersalls RoR Challenge Show Series, other Working Hunter type classes or RoR In Hand classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not considered.

Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Ridden Show Series (Formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships.

Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to RoR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years on 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The first THREE go forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2027

All entries MUST be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have RACED in GB. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31st, 2026, the winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

13.

Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2027

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 2027

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31st, 2026, the winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. The Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador

whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In-Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st of January 2025

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused by racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 22nd, 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5,

Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026

Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/ Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS / BSHA Showing series.

Any competitor who qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS Qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS Qualified registration). (2026)

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

Small/Lightweight Hunter type:

Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over,

Lightweight exceeding 158cms, Small Hunter exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 158cms).

Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). Rider to be 15yrs or over.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star

Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Open Racehorse to Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. This class is open to all competitors.

QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE FULL LIHS QUALIFIED MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION.

Veteran Classes

Open to all horses and ponies within the relevant age brackets, with the exception of mares in foal or with foals at foot.

Competitors (to include lead rein handlers) need not be amateurs - horses / ponies that are / have been professionally produced are permitted.

Stallions permitted, handlers / riders must be over 16 years in January of the current year.

Stallions should display a stallion badge. Riders/handlers 16 years and under may compete but must be competent enough to ride/handle their veteran without assistance.

All horses and ponies must be in a sound and healthy condition. Any veteran showing signs of distress or lameness will be asked to leave the ring. The judge's decision of lameness of a horse/pony is non disputable

Remedial shoeing, pads and/or hoof boots are permitted and will not be penalised, providing the horse/pony is sound.

Competitors are discouraged from travelling or competing with any veteran that has undergone any major illness or surgery within the past 6 months. Should they wish to travel and compete, written consent from the treating veterinary surgeon must be given stating that the veteran is fit to do so.

In extreme weather, the judge may stop the class at any point. It is advised that in extremely hot conditions, the veteran may be offered natural cover in the ring if this is available and competitors may remove their jackets, provided riders have long shirt sleeves and handlers have shirt sleeves covering shoulders as a minimum. In temperatures of 30 degrees or more the judge may cancel the class for the welfare of the veterans. This, however, is by decision of the judge on the day.

In severe wet or cold conditions protective rugs can be worn in the line-up. Grooms will be permitted to enter the ring to place the rugs over the horse/pony and must be appropriately attired.

If any horse is deemed to have welfare issues, judges must consider suspending the class if imminent harm is feared.

Lead rein riders (3-7 years of age).

No child under 3 years old may compete. Lead rein riders are not to have attained their 8th birthday before the first of January in the current showing year

Lead rein exhibits must be shown in a snaffle bridle. The lead rein must be attached to the noseband at all times during the class. Riders of lead rein ponies are not permitted to carry whips, with the exception of side-saddle exhibits, where SSA rules apply.

Lead rein handlers must be competent and must have attained their 16th birthday before the first of January in the current showing year.

Lead rein ponies not to exceed 122cm. First ridden ponies not to exceed 128cm.

All competitors in ridden classes must be capable of walk, trot and canter (with the exception of lead rein combinations who are not required to canter).

First ridden combinations (to have attained their 7th but not their 10th birthday before the first of January in the current showing year) do not have to take part in the group canter. The person with parental responsibility for any child on a first ridden pony not wishing to take part in the group canter must inform the steward accordingly before the class begins.

Competitors (to include lead rein handlers) need not be amateurs - horses/ponies that are/have been professionally produced are permitted. **But** riders/handlers may not exhibit under any judge who has had financial interest in that equine, or any other equine belonging to the rider/handler.

Riders/handlers may not knowingly exhibit a horse/pony which has been bred, produced or shown by the judge.

Late entries will not be allowed into the ring once the initial order to trot has been given.

Competitors may not leave or return to the show ring without the judge's/steward's permission. Where a competitor has been granted permission to leave the ring, it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure they return before final judging. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

Any fall of horse and/or rider/handler will result in disqualification.

The judge may disqualify any horse/pony from the class that is not sufficiently under control or is deemed a danger to other competitors or officials.

Should a horse/pony mis-behave during presentation of a final awards, this may result in demotion or disqualification at the judge's discretion.

Mobile phones are not permitted in the show ring.

Judges must refrain from physical contact with any horse or rider during judging.

The judge's decision is final.

Should a competitor be physically unable to trot the horse/pony up in hand, a runner may be allowed to enter the ring at the judge's discretion to do this on behalf of the competitor. The runner must be turned out correctly.

SHOWING GUIDELINES - HORSES and PONIES

Horses/ponies that have suffered injuries in the past resulting in scarring or blemishes will not be penalised within the marking system, providing the horse/pony has completely recovered and is showing no signs of discomfort.

The use of makeup and body oils is permitted, but please be aware of weather conditions.

White scars, blemishes, freeze marking or branding will not be marked down.

False plaits and false tails are permitted providing they do not compromise the welfare of the veteran.

The judge will not ride. An individual show is expected, this may or may not be set by the judge.

Horse / ponies will be stripped. – except in very hot / wet weather where the welfare of the veteran is paramount.

Gallop/extended canter is permitted.

Each competitor will be asked a brief history of the veteran by the judge, where ring time allows.

Sensory hairs located around the mouth, nose, eyes and inner ears are an important sensory organ for the horse and should not be removed for cosmetic purposes, as in line with the Showing Council and various society rulings.

Use of a whip or any other object to either excite or cause fear to any horse or pony is strictly forbidden at all times. This includes the use of any such object to make noise for this purpose e.g. tapping of a whip on a wall or against boots.

SHOWING GUIDELINES - TURNOUT and TACK

Riders/handlers must wear suitable smart attire.

All UK breed exhibits may turnout in attire according to breed and type

Foreign breed turnout and tack is acceptable. A hat disclaimer will be required by the show

Long hair to be neatly fastened and contained within a hair net. Juniors may wear long plaits, but loose ponytails are not allowed.

Handlers

Jacket and/or waistcoat to be of plain colour or tweed. Long sleeve or short sleeved shirt of a discreet colour with tie or stock. Gloves must be worn. Jodhpurs or smart trousers. Blue denim jeans are not permitted. Suitable, smart, safe footwear. No visible jewellery or piercings to be worn as these pose a potential risk of injury. Suitable hats to be worn. No baseball caps.

Showing canes/whips exceeding 76cm will not be permitted.

Riders:

Jacket to be of plain colour or tweed. Shirt of a discreet colour with tie or stock. In the event of extreme heat where the judge permits riders to remove jackets, shirts must have long sleeves. Gloves must be worn. Jodhpurs to be plain, beige or canary yellow in colour. Jodhpur boots or long riding boots. No visible jewellery or piercings to be worn as these pose a potential risk of injury. It is mandatory for all competitors to wear correctly secured riding hats to the current Showing Council hat policy standards (viewable at www.theshowingcouncil.co.uk), with the exception of side saddle or foreign breed exhibits where relevant governing association rules apply. However, the show's hat rules will take precedence and may require side-saddle and foreign breed exhibits to sign a hat disclaimer or may insist that safety hats are worn. It is the competitor's responsibility to check with the hosting show. Showing canes/whips exceeding 76cm will not be permitted (with the exception of side-saddle exhibits where SSA rules apply.

Grooms

Jacket and/or waistcoat to be of plain colour or tweed. Jodhpurs or smart trousers. Shorts or blue denim jeans are not permitted. Suitable, smart, safe footwear. No visible jewellery or piercings to be worn as these pose a potential risk of injury. Suitable hats to be worn. No baseball caps.

Horse/Pony

Tack must be in good, clean condition and correctly fitted.

Stallions must be bitted. Correctly fitted stallion harnesses are acceptable but not compulsory.

No item of tack can be removed or exchanged whilst a class is in progress without the judge's permission.

Plain, discreet protective boots may be used in very exceptional circumstances. Written veterinary advice to do so will be required.

Bits – snaffles, pelhams and Weymouth/bradoon (double bridle) bits are permitted. These are to be single jointed, double jointed, straight bar or may be ported. Tongue plates, and bits with

multiple rotating parts are not permitted. Waterford bits, chain bits and swales bits are not permitted. Gag bits may not be used in flat classes. Bits must be used in the manufactured condition without any additional adaptation to any part. A lip strap must be present if a curb chain is used.

Bit-less bridles are permitted.

Children under the age of 12 years are not permitted to use a double bridle or double reins but split reins or pelham roundings are permitted.

The age of the horse/pony should be clearly displayed on the offside of the bridle where possible.

Nose nets and/or UV masks/glasses required for welfare reasons are permitted.

Only tack permissible in the show ring may be used when warming up at a show. e.g. draw reins, side reins, spurs etc may not be used.

Marking

Conformation is not scored within these classes

Both in-hand and ridden classes will be marked as follows:

- a. Performance, manners and suitability: 50 marks
- b. Condition for age, suppleness and turnout: 50 marks

In the event of a tie, the 'b' mark will take precedence. Should a tie still remain, the affected competitors will then be placed at the judge's discretion.

Over-weight or under-weight horses will be marked down. Riders that, in the opinion of the judge, are too tall or too big for their horse/pony will be marked down and this may result in a zero mark being awarded, or they may be asked to dismount and/or leave the ring.

Finally – have fun, smile and remember – You are taking the best / horse pony home!!

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body for their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland classes. To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show– 4th – 6th August 2026.

The highest placed pony if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd —Riders of home-produced ponies (see definition in NPS Rule Book) can wear a white armband in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS Members are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owners membership card MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS/ NIPNA DALES PONY STUD M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship

Qualification to go no lower than first Reserve (third) provided it is owned by an NPS Member. A pony may only qualify for the Silver Medal Final once in a season.
