

SVWC PARTNERS WITH CYCLING WITHOUT AGE

May 22, 2026 marked the official launch and ribbon-cutting celebration for Shenandoah Valley Westminster-Canterbury’s partnership with Cycling Without Age, a milestone that reflects our ongoing commitment to creating meaningful outdoor experiences and connections for residents.

Founded in 2012 by Ole Kassow in Copenhagen, Cycling Without Age has grown into a global movement spanning more than 40 countries, with 3,500 chapters, 6,000 trishaws, and more than five million rides provided worldwide. Virginia is now home to at least six chapters, including the Winchester chapter launched by Steve Policastro in early 2023.

Thanks to the generosity of the SVWC Foundation, a trishaw was purchased to bring the program to campus. Cycling Without Age Winchester will provide a rotation of fourteen dedicated, trained volunteers to provide rides across the SVWC campus on Saturdays and Sundays.

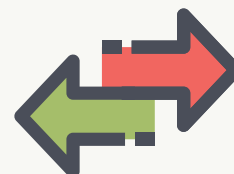
