ABOUT SPORT MANITOBA



GOVERNANCE & LEADERSHIP

The President & CEO along with senior leadership (Governance & Leadership) provide strategic direction to ensure Sport Manitoba achieves its vision and mission.

They provide oversight for corporate operations, policies, and reporting; leads the development of operating and business plans; and advocates to funders, partners, and strategic alliances.

Ultimately, they are responsible for maintaining a productive relationship with the Board of Directors, monitor and develop staff plans, and advance Sport Manitoba's business strategies with a focus on sustainability and development.

Our organization consistently reviews and evaluates its current policies and plans to address the changing environment in an effort to best serve our sport community. In this way, we strive to be a role model within amatuer sport in Manitoba and work with our partners to assist in implementing best practices in all areas of sport.

Leadership & Governance is also responsible for ensuring the overall administration, coordination, and evaluation of human resources plans and programs recognizing individual growth, development and effectiveness which indirectly contributes to organizational development. This includes succession planning and executive transition, orientation and training that enables Sport Manitoba to thrive in the face of change.

SPORT

To meet the priority areas for the upcoming year, the Sport Division has made significant staff changes to better serve our sport community. Sport Development Officers have specific areas of focus for Safe Sport, Indigenous Sport, Women in Sport, Newcomers, Para Sport Development and Good Governance.

In the new year, Sport Manitoba is engaging in gender equity playbook training through Canadian Women & Sport. There, we will look at our own internal processes and programs to be able to support our external partners better in the future as they move forwards towards gender equity.

At Sport Manitoba Performance, the interest from coaches for new ways to service their athletes continues to be high. The Performance team continues to use its online exercise video database that is used extensively with on-site, and off-site training. The team is working on developing new initiatives that reach athletes in a remote environment. Team-talks, workbooks, take-home programs, virtual training sessions, home equipment packages and online articles are just a few of the ways the Performance team is staying connected with provincial athletes and teams during these challenging times.

Sport Manitoba Coaching has the capability and capacity to offer online delivery of our NCCP Multisport modules. We project in-person courses will not be our main delivery method going forward as the opportunity to offer these courses online will reduce the accessibility issues from coaches across Manitoba. Respect in Sport will continue to be a focus for our Provincial Sport Organizations to increase the number of coaches who are actively certified.

Many of the other programs that Sport Manitoba Coaching offers, such as Female Mentorship, Bison Transport Sport LeadHERship Conference, and professional development, will proceed with the online delivery allowing us to maintain high-quality services.

MARKETING

The Marketing Division creates and manages Sport Manitoba's overall brand experience, drives revenue generation through the promotion of our diverse program and service offerings, and promotes the many opportunities for sport participation and the positive contributions sport makes in our communities. We work collaboratively with all organizational divisions and sport partners to create powerful and engaging campaigns, initiatives, advertisements and events to reach our diverse markets. We actively seek to create new revenue opportunities through the development of dynamic programs, events, sponsorships and corporate outreach.

The unknowns around pandemic restrictions will continue to impact Sport Manitoba's revenue generation potential in 2020–21, from both facility services and sponsorship standpoints. Welcoming members, clients, patients and the public back to our facility and attracting new facility users will be a priority. Further investment in and refinement of online and virtual opportunities will be a focus this year as will key communications identified in MAPS, including: safe sport; the dangers of early sport specialization; recruitment, retention, training and mentorship of officials; access to sport initiation programs; and the value of sport to our communities.

FINANCE & OPERATIONS

The Finance and Operations Division provides oversight of the financial health and facility operations for Sport Manitoba. It is responsible for internal financial management, adopting best practices and developing budgeting, financial reporting and management practices. They provide accurate, reliable and effective financial reporting and are entrusted with the financial and capital resources; including facilities. This year, projections and cash flows will be required on a regular basis as we come out of the pandemic and rev up our revenuegenerating programs, services, and events.

The Division provides leadership with financial information necessary to make strategic decisions at any time during the fiscal year. It supports all audit and compliance obligations and oversees risk management, minimizing Sport Manitoba's exposure. This includes managing and improving operations by measuring and reporting regularly on key numbers that are crucial to the success of the organization. Moving forward, Sport Manitoba will be required to measure and report on these key numbers on a more regular basis.

The activities expected from the Division cover a wide range, from accounting, to providing information, to assisting managers in making strategic decisions. In addition, it provides and supervises the management of the physical operation of the Sport Manitoba facility and the provision of administrative services to sport. This provides timely, efficient, and cost-effective services. It also provides direction and coordination for developing and maintaining Sport Manitoba's information technologies and systems, ensuring that technologies meet the needs of the users.

The Finance and Operations Division provides leadership with financial information necessary to assist the many sport partners with monthly bookkeeping and audit preparation as well as identifying weak or trouble areas.

This area will be particularly important in 2021-2022 as we recover from the pandemic. Sport Manitoba will monitor sport partners to ensure all are in good financial health.






2022 REVENUE

IMAGINE CANADA

Sport Manitoba was the first non-profit sport organization in Canada to receive Imagine Canada standards program accreditation in 2014. In February 2020, Sport Manitoba was successfully re-accredited by Imagine Canada's Standards Program for another five years. With this ongoing achievement, we are part of a growing community of more than 200 organizations dedicated to operational excellence.

The Imagine Canada certification program is designed to strengthen practices and public confidence in the charitable and non-profit sector. It offers accreditation to charities and non-profits that demonstrate excellence in five key areas with 73 standards: Board Governance, Financial Accountability, Fundraising, Staff Management, and Volunteer Involvement.

Sport Manitoba continues to participate in the Imagine Canada certification program to demonstrate our ongoing commitment to operate within the high organizational standards of the program.
