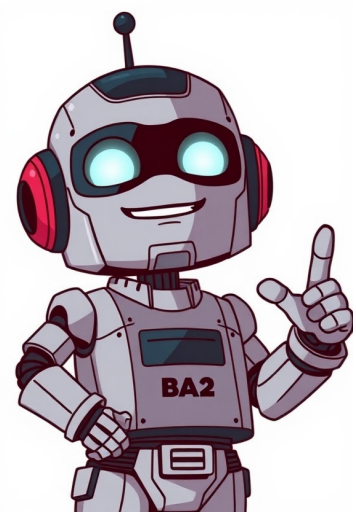

The Note+ 2 stylus offers a versatile writing experience, thanks to its lightweight aluminum body weighing only 14g. This allows for extended usage periods without fatigue. The device features two customizable buttons, which can be set up in supported apps to execute specific commands, such as undo and redo, facilitating efficient correction of mistakes in notes or illustrations. The Note+ 2 comes with three interchangeable tips - soft, medium, and hard - catering to individual preferences for a tailored writing experience. Additionally, the stylus boasts palm rejection and pressure sensitivity capabilities, provided that the used app supports these features (the list of compatible apps includes prominent note-taking and art applications). Built-in angle detection technology enables varying line widths by simply tilting the stylus. The Note+ 2's slim design fits comfortably in the hand, with a flat side providing a secure grip and magnets for attaching it to the iPad when not in use. Battery life reaches up to eight hours, rechargeable via USB-C within an hour, or five minutes for an additional hour of usage. ===== The Baseus Smooth Writing 3 is a suitable writing tool option that offers affordability and reliability, although it lacks wireless charging capabilities. Although the 140mAh cell has limited power, plugging in the USB-C cable for half an hour can recharge it to its full capacity. The device works with various iPad models, including the iPad Pro 12.9-inch (3rd-6th gen), iPad Pro 11-inch (1st-4th gen), iPad Air (4th-5th gen), and iPad mini (6th gen). A comparison between the original and new Apple Pencil reveals several improvements in its design, including a shorter length with a flat edge that can trigger app-specific functions. The newer pencil features magnetic attachment to the iPad, reducing rolling off the desk. Additionally, it charges wirelessly, eliminating the need for a Lightning connector. The Baseus Smooth Writing PS4 360 offers some new features compared to its predecessor, such as improved functionality and usability. Although the power button is now located at the top of the stylus, the device still maintains its lightweight construction with magnetic attachment points on the underside. The touch-sensitive area allows users to execute pre-assigned commands or scroll through documents. However, some apps do not function correctly with these features.
