The curriculum we are using incorporates spelling (and comprehension). • If your child is at the comprehension level, you can choose a spelling curriculum or I can suggest some. <p>Handwriting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergent and early readers will NOT need a handwriting curriculum. The curriculum we are using incorporates it. • All other children - families can choose to do this if it is something that needs attention. <p>Writing - Bridge subject</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rough drafts completed at school will be sent home to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Revise (reinforce types of sentences, adding details) ◦ Edit (reinforce punctuation, spelling) ◦ Publish and bring back to school to celebrate <p>Literature</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read a variety of genres and enjoy reading together <p>Typing</p>
