lateral (adjective) To the side; of or pertaining to the side. (anatomy, zootomy) Situated on one side or other of the body or of an organ, especially in the region furthest from the median plane. Antonym: medial The medial side of the knee faces the other knee, while the outer side of the knee is lateral. A fish senses changes in hydrodynamic pressure with its lateral line. (pathology) Affecting the side or sides of the body, or confined to one side of the body. ===== The term "lateral" has two primary meanings in English. Firstly, it refers to something that is situated on the side of something else, such as an object or a passage, or a sound produced through lateral pronunciation like the "l" sound. ===== In linguistics, lateral sounds are generated by partially blocking the airflow with the tongue, leaving space on one or both sides for air to pass through. This produces sounds that are distinct from other consonant sounds, such as the lateral "l" sound in words like "lake" or "lunch." lateral movement is characterized by being situated or directed to a side; pertaining to or entailing a position, office, etc., that is different but equivalent or roughly equivalent in status. This concept can be applied to various fields such as football, where a lateral pass involves throwing the ball in a direction parallel to the sideline, and sports like rugby, where laterals are used to create scoring opportunities. In everyday language, lateral refers to something that is situated on or relates to one side of an object, surface, or entity. For instance, a branch growing out from the side of a tree is considered a lateral bud. In psychology, lateral thinking involves approaching problems with novel and creative perspectives. The term "lateral" has also been used in various artistic and musical contexts, such as in architecture, where lateral loads refer to forces that act perpendicular to the direction of the building's weight, and in music, where lateral playing style is characterized by a specific technique of playing the strings or frets on an instrument. Furthermore, lateral is often associated with geographical features, such as rivers flowing laterally into lakes or oceans. In medicine, lateral refers to procedures that involve moving a patient from one side of their body to another, such as lateralization in brain imaging.
