

Visual Media Portfolio Requirements
Submit Parts A, B and C

- A. **Past Work/Photography:** Please submit eight to ten pieces of your best pre-existing work. You may include still photography, motion work, or video. Images should be 72ppi, RGB and saved as .jpg. Video should be saved as MP4 or include a link to Vimeo or YouTube.

(30 seconds of video counts as 1 piece of work. A 1:30 video would therefore be considered as 3 pieces. Please do not submit any single video longer than 2 min)

- B. **Video Exercise:** Choose one of the following themes and create a video to represent that theme. You may take multiple shots and edit them together, or otherwise film a single shot for the entirety of the project. **Your video should not be longer than 1 min.**

Environment
The passage of time
A day in the life
A process
Texture / Pattern
Portraiture

- C. **Written Exercise:** Please provide a typed response to the following questions. You may choose to write separate paragraphs for each, or to encompass your answers in one, longer essay.

1. Why are you interested in the Visual Media program?
2. What are your long- and short-term career goals?
3. What are your strengths and weaknesses?
4. What is something you would be happy doing every day for the rest of your career?
5. How did you learn about the program?

Past Work submissions will be awarded 1 to 10 points for each of the following criteria: Creativity, Presentation, and Visual Impact. Your Essay and Video Exercise will be granted 1 to 10 points each as well. Maximum points possible: 50. Minimum for acceptance: 35.

If your first submission is not accepted, you are welcome to resubmit.

The Visual Media program has rolling admissions. You may apply anytime until the program has reached capacity. You are encouraged to apply sooner rather than later as often we fill by the start of Summer quarter. The website will notify people when we have reached capacity for the coming year.
