### HYDROPONICS

In hydroponics, students are getting hands-on experience with how plants grow and thrive. They are learning how to harvest plants properly and exploring how different hydroponic systems work. The class has also been diving into the history of aquaponics and how it connects plant growth with fish systems. In addition, students are studying the life cycle of plants and learning the differences between asexual and sexual reproduction in both plants and animals.

Our students have been exploring a variety of dishes, from healthy options to Asian-inspired meals. Recently, they created fresh salads using ingredients already in our kitchen, guided by Chef Mr. Alexander. A standout twist was using tortilla strips as croutons, along with a homemade pico de gallo enhanced with lime and orange zest. They also prepared chili chicken lo mein with egg rolls, featuring a homemade sauce made from soy, chili, and oyster flavors. The dish was a big success and enjoyed by many students!



### CLASSROOM

Here's a quick look at Ms. Fuller's 10th Grade Global History class. Students rotated through stations during a lesson on Imperialism in India, responding to short-answer questions at each station using different colored markers to track their thinking along the way.
