Early Zionists, such as David Ben Gurion, made clear their intent to "brisk away" - i.e. ethnically cleanse -Palestinians.

WHAT IS PALESTINE?

Palestine is the land between the Mediterranean Sea and the Jordan River, historically home for centuries to a predominantly Arab population called Palestinians.

Israel's creation in 1948 displaced over 700,000 Palestinians and destroyed hundreds of villages—an event known as the Nakba, or "catastrophe." Today, Palestine usually refers to the West Bank (including East Jerusalem) and Gaza Strip—still under Israeli military occupation and blockade. Palestinians continue to seek freedom, self-determination, and justice.

WHAT IS THE FIGHTING ABOUT?

Land and Displacement

Palestinians face ongoing land loss through Israeli settlements, home demolitions, and military occupation. They are denied both the right to return to ancestral homes and the right to a sovereign homeland.

Human Rights Violations & Discrimination

As Israel defines itself as a Jewish state, Palestinians face unequal treatment under the law. This includes arbitrary detention (over 10,000 political prisoners), harsh movement restrictions through blockades and checkpoints, and routine deadly violence.





Post-October 7, 2023

Israel has killed an estimated hundreds of thousands of Palestinians since Oct 7, 2023. Exact numbers are not known since the fighting is ongoing and many people are missing or presumed dead.



IS THERE A SOLUTION?

Some advocate a two-state solution: an independent Palestinian state alongside Israel—often along the 1967 lines with land swaps—paired with security guarantees, arrangements for Jerusalem, and a resolution of the refugee question. Others call for a single, democratic state where Palestinians and Jewish Israelis share equal rights, protections, and political representation regardless of ethnicity or religion.

Whichever framework prevails, the status quo—one state controlling another people through routine physical and psychological oppression—is unacceptable. As Pope Paul VI declared: "If you want peace, work for justice." A just peace requires Catholics and all people of conscience to insist on justice.
