Many Communities

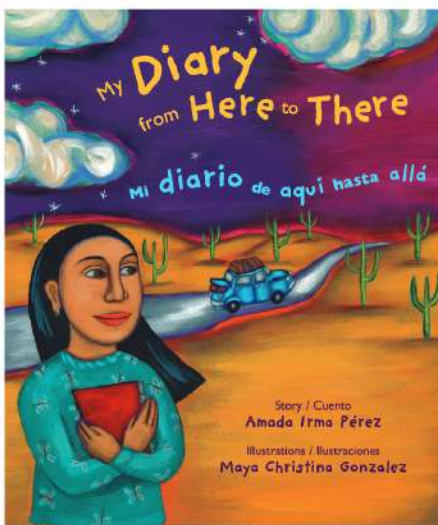
Students encounter multiple perspectives, both from within and beyond their own communities.
