Using Your Money Wisely: Biblical Principles Under Scrutiny by Larry Burkett

Course Description:

This course teaches students about the biblical foundations regarding provision, money/wealth and fruitfulness in the Kingdom of God. Students will learn about the purpose of the economy of God on the earth. Students will learn how to apply kingdom stewardship in their personal finances. The Kingdom principle of generosity will be the focus to empower students to exercise generosity in their giving and service. Practical guidelines will be offered to help students develop kingdom wealth.

Course Objectives and Goals:

To enable the student:

- to gain knowledge of the principles of Kingdom economics
- to gain knowledge of how to manage their money based on biblical principles
- to learn how to utilize biblical truth as a foundation for personal stewardship
- to learn how to be generous in giving of both money and time
- to learn from the examples of Joseph and other patriarchs how they managed wealth
- to learn from Christ how he taught his disciples to manage kingdom wealth

Class Methodology of Teaching:

- Class lectures
- Student interaction
- Interaction with the Biblical text
- Question and answer opportunities

Course Requirements:

1. Participate in class discussion.
2. Outside assignments (homework):
