Course Description:

This course extensively studies and thoroughly explains the five-fold ministry of apostles, prophets, evangelists, shepherds, and teachers. Each of the five ministries will be accurately defined and distinguished. Students will be trained to identify, recognize, and honor these five ministries as the means through which Christ is building His victorious church.

- explain the importance of each of the five-fold ministries
- distinguish each of the ministries from the others
- point out the costs of ignoring any or all of the ministries
- examine challenges that prevent the five-fold from working together
