## **Class Duration:**

• six weeks

## **Course Textbook:**

• Spiritual Slavery to Spiritual Sonship by Jack Frost

## **Course Description:**

This course is designed to connect the student to the heart of Father God. The study traces the Father's relationship with His people, including the patriarchs of the Old Testament with Jesus Christ His Son in the New Testament. Students will have personal opportunities to explore their relationship with Father God and will be given practical instruction on going deeper in their relationship with Father God.

## **Course Goals and Objectives:**

#### Students will

- recognize patterns that God the Father established to establish and grow relationship with His people
- explore the heart and true nature of the Father
- understand how to establish a deeper connection with Father God
- recognize how Jesus the Son walked in His relationship with Father God
- explain ways the enemy capitalizes on moments of failure to sow seeds of fear, shame, guilt, and intimation
- explain how Jesus focused His life on being a Son
- contrast the differences between a son and a daughter
- apply foundational truth about sonship to their own lives and show how this teaching will be transformational in their ministry.
