I bought my home in PSA1 (Priority Service Area #1) for retirement. Upon purchase, the septic was inspected and passed. I used this home a few days a month for several years until retirement. After moving into the home full time, I quickly learned the septic could not handle full time usage. I now limit the number of times the toilet is flushed daily and do not use my home for laundry. (Things I did not expect to experience in my retirement years...)

I have been told that there is nothing that can be done for my septic due to the property being **too small** and **too close to the lake**. The septic cannot be brought up to Indiana Code. And calling it a septic is probably a stretch. I believe it is a dry-well.

That is just my experience. As I look around at neighboring properties (very small, close to the lake) I can't imagine their septic systems (probably dry-well) functioning any better than my own.

Some days, the <u>smell of septic is prominent</u>.

I thought retirement in a little home on a little lake in Marshall County would be nice. Instead, I'm worried about the future of my home. Worried, I will be forced to "pump and dump" or abandon my home.

I think the MCRSD should stay active, keep applying for grants, and have the project ready to move forward when funds become available.

I am not signing my name to this letter out of fear. The people trying to tear down the MCRSD have been slandering and hateful toward those in favor.
