I am not a resident but am a homeowner on Cook Lake and property owner on Holem Lake. Until our purchase 20+ years ago, our house was a primary residence. We have had no septic issues and previous owners had no issues to the best of my knowledge. Like other properties in our addition, ours is a 40'+6' lot with houses on both sides. Because of present Health Dept. regulations, there is no improving our system.

Opponents of the sewer project say there are options available. The Health Dept. representative sad the will "work with us". Are they going to ignore the regulations they support? The said "options" do not solve all problems and are not cheap. No matter what system is used, excess water must be dealt with.

At this point in time, I realize all primary work has not been completed, project cost bids are not available and state grants are up in the air or down the toilet.

I trust the knowledge and wisdom of the Sewer District committee because they are guiding their future as well as mine.

I <u>DO</u> support the sewer project because I know the users pay for the project, use and maintenance of the system. None of this is free.
