# Tourism is booming in Victoria

The latest statistics to December 2023, show record growth for the industry, which is now worth \$38 billion to the economy of the state. Importantly, the economic impact of our industry is projected to grow to \$53 billion by 2028. That's a \$16 billion increase in total tourism spend over the next 5 years.

#### And we need people to help meet demand for this projected growth.

To the end of June 2023, tourism in Victoria employed 257,500, equating to 6.5% of the total jobs filled in all the state. And nearly half of these jobs were in regional towns and centres across every corner of Victoria.

Over that same period, research shows there were nearly 110,000 tourism businesses operating in Victoria, representing 15% of all businesses in the state. That means, approximately 1 in 7 Victorian businesses were tourism related, reinforcing its importance to the state's economy.

What most people don't realise, though, is you can go and get any degree you want; all we ask is that you consider tourism as an industry where you want to apply that degree.








The Attractions sector is a core component of the tourism industry, providing memorable experiences for visitors from intrastate, interstate, and overseas.

#### Attractions ORGANISATIONAL CHART






Events significantly contribute to Victoria's visitor economy and are a primary pillar of the vibrancy and attractiveness of our destination.







