QUARTERLY UPDATE





The Chapel Hill market has entered 2025 at a slower pace. After a noticeable increase in stock late last year, buyer activity has tapered off, and competition has softened across most segments. While a handful of standout results have shown that well-positioned properties can still achieve premium prices, overall demand has been more selective. Open home traffic is down, days on market have edged up, and buyers are taking a more cautious approach. That said, the fundamentals of the suburb remain strong, and sentiment could shift quickly. If interest rates drop 2–3 more times we're likely to see renewed confidence and momentum return heading into the mid-year period.

Originally scheduled for Sunday, 30 March to coincide with National Neighbour Day, the event will now tentatively take place on 18 May at Greenhill Reservoir on Russell Terrace.
