10-Year Infrastructure Strategy: transforming the system

- Sets out three-pronged approach to ensure infrastructure investment drives growth to all parts of the country:
 - Reforming institutions and delivery approach
 - NISTA's creation Place-Based Business Cases New Towns reform of Government Major Projects Portfolio – streamlined assurance
 - Providing certainty, confidence and stability
 - £725 bn of investment over 10 years Infrastructure Pipeline bespoke mega-project funding/governance
 - Removing barriers to delivery
 - Development of spatial approach (led by NISTA) faster consenting – procurement that supports skills and supply chains.



The Infrastructure Pipeline: make it work for you

- Comprehensive database of information for construction firms and investors looking to understand future demand
 - covers 780+ planed public and private sector projects worth over £500bn over next decade
- Positive feedback from industry NISTA now iterating design to offer more skills/jobs insights
- Enabling supply chain investment in capacity and capability and encourage private investment.

Significant opportunity for Strategic transport bodies

- LA members can use pipeline and spatial plans to align FE offer with future skills demand
- opportunity for richer conversations with local industry
- Keen to hear your views on how future iterations can better support your planning.



Placemaking: spatial infrastructure planning

- Government determined to ensure infrastructure investment supports sustainable growth in all parts of the country
- Success requires an effective mechanism to co-ordinate infrastructure planning at local, regional and national scale
- NISTA is leading on this through our Infrastructure Spatial Planning Unit:

Local authorities and MCAs have crucial role to play in success of spatial planning

- Government is making place-making a reality onus is now on local leaders to step up and make the most of the opportunity
- ADEPT members should already be thinking about how your local growth plans will fit with spatial plans for key infrastructure sectors
- Spatial planning should work hand-in-hand with your other strategic priorities (e.g. climate resilience, net zero, biodiversity and environmental protection)
- Mutually reinforcing, not competing, approaches



Better transport connectivity: unlocking regional and local growth

- Strategy recognises transport infrastructure's crucial role in driving sustainable growth
- Integrated settlements simplify funding and support transformational change in transport
- Significant investment geared towards addressing historic underinvestment in North and Midlands: £15.6 bn by 2031-32 for local transport settlements, and £2.5 bn for East West Rail as spine of OxCam growth arc
- Maintenance is back in vogue Government has recognised the importance of effective maintenance to maintaining connectivity within and between towns and cities
 - £24 billion in funding 2026-27 to 2029-30 to maintain existing motorway and roads networks
 - £1 billion new Structures Fund to repair ageing bridges and flyovers
 - Gives LAs more certainty to plan and prioritise maintenance over the long term
