





#### The Office of Medical Marijuana Use (OMMU)

The Office of Medical Marijuana Use (OMMU) works diligently as the regulating entity of Florida's medical marijuana use program. The OMMU highly prioritizes the safe and legal use of medical marijuana by all qualified patients.

To accomplish this, the OMMU completes routine inspections of the Treatment Centers' cultivation, processing, and dispensing facilities, and requires comprehensive testing of all medical marijuana and low-THC cannabis products through the Certified Marijuana Testing Laboratories before products are made available to qualified patients.

The OMMU also develops rules and processes to safeguard the medical aspect of the program and combat diversion. Finally, the OMMU creates and publishes a variety of educational resources on how to access medical marijuana safely and legally in Florida.



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On the patient profile, click the "Show Cert Docs" button located underneath the patient profile photo and Id Card number.



Upon clicking "SHOW CERT DOCS," you are brought to your Certification Documentation Dashboard. The Dashboard displays all certification documents for your active certification period.





If the patient's qualified physician has created a current, active certification that requires the submission of certain documents to the Office of Medical Marijuana Use, then the patient will see records for any of the following documents displayed on their dashboard:

- 1. "RFE" Request for Exception
- 2. "CMP" Consent for Minor Patient (only required to be completed for patients who are minors)
- 3. "2PC" Second Physician Concurrence (only required to be completed for patients who are minors that are receiving Marijuana in a form for Smoking)





The Certification Documentation Dashboard allows patients to filter and sort their records in many ways. They may filter and sort their dashboard with the following methods:

- 1. Certification Start Date (Sort-able column)
- 2. Document Type (Filter-able and Sort-able column)
- 3. Document Status (Filter-able and Sort-able column)
- 4. Last Date Submitted (Sort-able column)
- 5. Qualified Physician (Sort-able column)




The Certification Documentation Dashboard will display the current status for each document. These documents must be reviewed and approved by the OMMU as required by 381.986, Florida Statutes. The potential statuses that may be seen on this dashboard for each of the respective documents are as follows:

- 1. Not Yet Submitted this status indicates your Qualified Physician has not yet submitted your document to the OMMU for review.
- 2. Submitted this status indicates your document has been submitted to the OMMU by your Qualified Physician.
- 3. Needs More Information this status indicates your document has been reviewed by the OMMU and could not be processed because more information is needed from your Qualified Physician. Your Qualified Physician must re-submit the document after supplying the requested additional information.
- 4. Approved this status indicates your document has been reviewed by the OMMU and has been approved. No other information or documents are needed at this time for this particular request.







The patient's orders dashboard will appear, displaying all orders that the physician has entered for the patient.



#### LEO Understanding Patients' Orders





#### Each order shows:

- Start Date: The date the order is or was open or is scheduled to open.
- End Date: The date the order did or will expire.
- Order Type: The type of marijuana the physician ordered for the patient. The available types are: Medical Marijuana ("THC" products), Low-THC Cannabis ("CBD" Products), or Smoking Marijuana (Whole Flower Marijuana).
- Order Status: Orders are listed as Open, Scheduled, Expired, Completed, or Cancelled.
- Open Orders: Orders from which the patient/caregiver can currently purchase medical marijuana.
- Scheduled Orders: Orders that will become open at a later date.
- Expired Orders: Orders that are past the end date but not all dispensations were made.
- Completed Orders: all dispensations have been made from that order.
- Cancelled Orders: the physician has cancelled the order.
- **Placed By:** The name of the physician who placed the order. Clicking the physician's name will take you to that physician's profile page.
- Purchase Device: Shows if the patient is authorized to purchase a delivery device. This is decided by the physician.
- **Days:** The number of days the order is open.

Click the "+" or "-" keys to expand/collapse the details of each route and view all associated dispensations.



#### LEO Understanding Patients' Orders

Once the order has been expanded you will find:

- The **route(s)** the physician has recommended for the patient to use/take for the type of marijuana.
- Total Amount Ordered: The total milligrams on the order.
- Mg Per Day: The number of milligrams per day recommended by the physician.
- Dispensation history of all items the patient/caregiver has purchased from an MMTC.



#### Reporting to the OMMU





Florida law requires the Department of Health to immediately suspend the registration of a qualified patient or caregiver who is *charged* with a violation of chapter 893, F.S., until final disposition of any alleged offense. Thereafter, the Department of Health may extend the suspension, revoke the registration or reinstate the registration.

The Department of Health relies on law enforcement organizations to report violations that are grounds for suspending or revoking registrations.

The OMMU has two ways for law enforcement organizations to report 893 violations:

- 1. The Registry 893 Violation Electronic Reporting Form.
- 2. Emailing the OMMU.

#### Electronic 893 Reporting





The Registry allows Law Enforcement agencies with authorized users to electronically report Chapter 893 Violations to the OMMU. There are 11 easy steps to follow to report an 893 violation:

**Step 1:** Log into the Medical Marijuana Use Registry (https://MMURegistry.FLHealth.gov/Public/LogIn).


**Step 2:** Locate the patient or caregiver for whom you are reporting the Chapter 893 Violation.

**Step 3:** After locating the respective patient or caregiver profile, click the "Report 893 Violation" hyperlink located underneath the profile photo and ID Card number.




#### Electronic 893 Reporting (continued)





**Step 4:** After clicking the button, you are re-directed to the Chapter 893 Violation electronic form. The form includes pre-populated information related to the patient or caregiver.

Review the pre-populated information to ensure it is correct.


Step 5: Enter the "Date of Offense."

**Step 6:** Select the "County of Offense."

Step 7: Enter the "Case Number."

**Step 8:** Enter any additional "Case Details" or upload any relevant files.

Step 9: Click "Submit."



**Step 10:** A pop-up appears for you to confirm your submission. Click "Confirm" to finish submitting your report to the OMMU.





Step 11: You will be automatically returned to the patient or caregiver's profile page. From here, the OMMU will review your Chapter 893 Violation form submission and make a determination.

There is nothing further required from the LEO as it relates to your Chapter 893 Violation submission.



#### Reporting to the OMMU (continued)





Law enforcement agencies can also notify the OMMU of a qualified patient or caregiver who is charged under chapter 893, F.S., or for a violation under section 381.986, F.S., via email to <a href="MedicalMarijuanaUse@FLHealth.gov">MedicalMarijuanaUse@FLHealth.gov</a>.


Please include the words "Confidential pursuant to s. 119.071(2), F.S." in the subject line or body of the email message. That flags the information as confidential and exempt from disclosure.

Please provide, at minimum, the charged individual's name, DOB, Patient ID (if applicable), and any pertinent details of the violation (date of occurrence, case number, etc.).

#### MEDICAL MARIJUANA IN FLORIDA

- Each qualified patient and caregiver is required to have a valid Medical Marijuana Use Registry (MMUR) identification (ID) card, which must be renewed annually. [§ 381.986(7)(a), Fla. Stat.]
- A qualified patient or caregiver in possession of marijuana or a marijuana delivery device who fails or refuses to present his or her MMUR ID card upon the request of a law enforcement officer commits a misdemeanor of the second degree. [§ 381.986(12)(e)1., Fla. Stat.]
- A person is prohibited from the operation of any vehicle, aircraft, train or boat while under the influence of medical marijuana. [Art. X, § 29(c)(4), Fla. Const.]
- Section 381.986, F.S., does not allow reciprocity agreements with other states. Bringing medical or recreational marijuana Florida from another state into Florida violates s. 893.13, F.S.



- A qualified patient or caregiver who uses or administers marijuana, not including low-THC cannabis, in plain view of or in a place open to the general public; in a school bus; a vehicle; an aircraft or a boat; or on the grounds of a school except as provided in s. 1006.062, F.S., commits a misdemeanor of the first degree. [§ 381.986(12)(c), Fla. Stat.]
- A Florida qualified patient and the qualified patient's caregiver:
  - √ May purchase from a Medical Marijuana Treatment Center (MMTC) for the patient's medical use a marijuana delivery device and up to the amount of marijuana authorized in the physician certification.
  - ✓ May not possess more than a 70-day supply of marijuana, or the greater of 4 ounces of marijuana in a form for smoking or 1.6 times the number of ounces of the amount ordered for marijuana in a form for smoking approved by the department pursuant to s. 381.986(4)(f), F.S. and Emergency Rule 64ER22-3., at any given time.
  - ✓ Must keep all medical marijuana purchased in its original MMTC packaging. [§ 381.986(14)(a), Fla. Stat.] 10/20/22

### LEO Tip Card Packaging





#### MEDICAL MARIJUANA PACKAGING

Section 381.986(8)(e)11.f., F.S., requires Medical Marijuana Treatment Centers (MMTCs) to package the marijuana in a receptacle that has a firmly affixed and legible label stating the following information:

- The marijuana or low-THC cannabis meets the requirements of sub-subparagraph d
- The name of the medical marijuana treatment center
- The batch number, harvest number and the date dispensed
- Issuing physician's name
- Patient's name
- The product name, if applicable, and dosage form
- Recommended dose
- A warning that it is illegal to transfer medical marijuana to another person
- The marijuana universal symbol



- Qualified patients and the qualified patient's caregiver must keep all medical marijuana purchased in its original MMTC packaging.
- Packaging for marijuana in a form for smoking or edibles must be plain, opaque, and white. The universal symbol must be printed on the package and be no less than 10 percent of the overall surface area of the package.
- Receptacles for edibles must have a warning to keep away from children and pets, and a warning stating that the edible has not been produced or inspected pursuant to federal food safety laws.
- Receptacles for whole flower must have a warning to keep the product away from children and a warning stating that marijuana smoke contains carcinogens and may negatively affect health.



The OMMU is statutorily charged with developing and implementing accurate information regarding the legal, healthy and safe use of medical marijuana.




