Denū Hotel & Spa to Open in Downtown Phoenix in 2026

Just steps away from Chase Field and the Phoenix Convention Center, <u>Denū Hotel & Spa will offer a new retreat</u> in <u>Downtown Phoenix</u> starting in fall 2026. Ideal for business travel and leisure, this new lifestyle hotel will feature 236 rooms, 16 suites and more than 22,000 square feet of meeting/event space. "Denū" translates to "Valley of the Sun" and the hotel draws inspiration from the desert's energy, encouraging guests to embrace renewal by unwinding at the full-service wellness spa, lounging in the urban-designed presidential suite and soaking in the rooftop pool overlooking the city skyline. The news of the new hotel was announced in summer of 2025.

The Spa at the JW Marriott Scottsdale Camelback Inn to Get \$24 Million Transformation

Reopening in January 2026, the redesigned Spa at the JW Marriott Scottsdale Camelback Inn will invite guests to experience the wellness benefits of the Sonoran Desert. The transformed spa will embrace the ariVéa philosophy, an individually crafted pathway to holistic health that combines the natural energy of Arizona's deserts with timeless rituals and treatments. This sanctuary offers desert-inspired treatments using indigenous ingredients, a trio of tranquil hydrotherapies and a studio where guests can engage in mindfulness sessions. After spending time enjoying the salt sauna, cold therapy and aromatherapy steam of the indoor wellness circuit, guests can refuel at the brand new Ora Cafe, where dishes are crafted by a licensed nutritionist. The news of the redesign was announced in summer of 2025.

The REMI Scottsdale Now Open

The <u>REMI Scottsdale</u>, <u>Autograph Collection</u>, is a boutique hotel located in the heart of <u>Scottsdale's Entertainment District</u>. Intertwining luxury with a dynamic atmosphere, this 161-room hotel features five dining venues, VIP access to the adjacent Maya Day + Nightclub and stunning sunset views from its rooftop pool, the highest one in the city. Guests looking to soak up the sun can book one of the two Loft Suites patios that open to the hotel's pool deck. They can enjoy the hotel's culinary experiences, including savory dishes at the Japanese Steakhouse, elevated comfort food at the modern diner and curated cocktails at the Rooftop Bar alongside the pool. The REMI Scottsdale opened in July 2025.

Enjoy an Al-Powered Massage at the W Scottsdale

Those ready to combine technology and tradition should experience a one-of-a-kind massage at the <u>AWAY Spa</u> in <u>W Scottsdale</u>, now offering Arizona's first AI-powered massage in collaboration with Aescape. This cutting-edge treatment features intelligent robotic arms guided by advanced AI technology to deliver a customized full-body massage. Guests can personalize their session by selecting pressure levels, target areas, and massage styles while the system responds and adjusts in real-time. This new massage started in June 2025.

Hotel Valley Ho in Scottsdale Announces \$18 million Renovation

The historic, mid-century designed <u>Hotel Valley Ho</u> in <u>Old Town Scottsdale</u> is undergoing an \$18 million renovation to refresh its rooms, fusing vintage aesthetic with modern design. This marks the largest renovation since opening in 1956. Renovated rooms in the hotel's original wings are now open to guests to enjoy after exploring Old Town's galleries, dining at the on-site restaurant, <u>Zuzu</u>, or learning about the hotel's storied history on the 90-minute Magical History walking tour. The renovated rooms opened in July 2025.

Top of The Lodge: A New Stay at Castle Hot Springs

Perfect for a girls' getaway or a trip with extended family, <u>Top of The Lodge</u> is a new luxury suite at <u>Castle Hot Springs</u>. The suite features three bedrooms, four bathrooms and a wraparound deck with stunning views of the Sonoran Desert. Just steps away from Castle Hot Springs' Bar, 1896, and its farm-to-table restaurant, Harvest, guests have easy access to exceptional dining. On-site activities include swimming in the remedial hot springs, touring the farm and hiking or biking. This new suite opened in July 2025.

Cottonwood's Tavern Hotel Offers a Paw-Sitively Perfect Escape

Opened in August 2025

<u>The Taven Hotel</u> has new luxurious accommodations just for four-legged friends. In addition to the <u>Tavern Dog Cottage</u>, which opened a couple of years ago, The Tavern has a new <u>Dog Suite</u> designed with furry best friends in mind. The all-new Dog Suite is a 450-square-foot retreat for two humans and up to two pups (65 lbs. max), with a lavish bathroom, plush king bed, soft-topped mattress and plenty of space to spread out. Visitors and their furry friends can pick up some new toys at the nearby Paw on

<u>Main Street</u>, take a walk through <u>Dead Horse Ranch State Park</u> and grab a puppuccino at the walk-up window at Crema Craft Kitchen + Bar across the street.

Mountain Modern Sedona Now Open

The new Mountain Modern Sedona is ideal for guests seeking wellness or adventure. In addition to numerous wellness activities and "noctourism" classes, the hotel offers an on-site restaurant, pool and custom storage for guests' outdoor adventure gear. Wellness activities include crystal bowl sound baths, chakra exploration and exploring Sedona's famous vortexes. The pet-friendly hotel offers a full-service outdoor dog spa, pet-focused activities and a menu for furry friends at the onsite restaurant. After spending the day exploring Sedona's red rocks, visitors will soak in views of Sedona's dark skies at Mountain Modern's evening yoga and stargazing sessions. In the mornings, guests can wake up to a sunrise ceremony inspired by American Indian traditions. Opened in April 2025.

Stay at the Taawaki Inn, A Hopi-owned and Operated Hotel In Clarkdale

The Taawaki Inn in Clarkdale is the only Hopi-owned and operated hotel outside the Hopi sovereign nation, offering visitors an opportunity to experience Hopi culture while staying in the Verde Valley. The Hopi-inspired design of this 44-room hotel, which opened last summer, has an aesthetic that mirrors a traditional Hopi home, allowing guests to see Hopi artists' artwork and craftwork on display. Visitors can shop for authentic Hopi handcrafted goods at the on-site gallery, participate in one of the resort's cultural events, or visit Tuzigoot National Monument, an ancient pueblo site along the Hopi migration route, to get a glimpse of how Hopi ancestors lived. Celebrating its 1st anniversary in July 2025.

Hidden Gem Getaway: Acoustic Cellars Lodge in Verde Valley Wine Country

Those who want to enjoy wine, wellness and live music can now visit the newly opened Acoustic Cellars Lodge in Cornville, nestled in the Verde Valley, one of Arizona's three American Viticultural Areas. Options include joining the lodge's AZ Wine Crawler tour and visiting several wineries in Sedona and Verde Valley, where guests can savor award-winning wines while soaking in the picturesque scenery. At this cozy lodge, visitors can spend the day playing pickleball, petting the alpaca and relaxing in the hot tub. In the evening, they can unwind at intimate onsite concerts from the lodge's owner, Leon J, an award-winning Heritage Blues Hall of Fame artist. Opened July 2025.

The First Grand Hyatt Property in Arizona Is Now Open

Formally known as The Hyatt Regency Scottsdale Resort & Spa at Gainey Ranch, the resort has finished its million-dollar renovation and has been rebranded as the <u>Grand Hyatt Scottsdale Resort & Spa</u>, making it the first Grand Hyatt property in Arizona. Guests will enjoy the newly renovated guest rooms, pools, spa, fitness center and event spaces while exploring the endless activities within <u>Scottsdale</u>. Opened October 2024.

Highland Grand Canyon is the Newest and Closest Glamping Retreat to Grand Canyon's South Rim Opened in May 2025

<u>Highland Grand Canyon</u> is just four miles from the <u>Canyon</u>. Nestled beneath tall ponderosa pines, it offers a quiet forest setting where guests can stay close to the park, yet feel worlds away from the crowds. Elk and deer often pass through the property, and with the Canyon minutes away, it is the perfect setting for a once-in-a-lifetime trip to the Grand Canyon. Highland is open seasonally from May 1 to Oct. 20.

Tin Can Alley Airbnb Welcomes Travelers on Route 66

With the Route 66 Centennial celebration next year, <u>Kingman</u> is ready to welcome visitors to the newly opened <u>Tin Can Alley</u>. Here, guests can stay overnight in renovated vintage Airstream trailers, footsteps away from the city's numerous museums, retro diners and memorabilia shops. Visitors can start every adventurous day at <u>Mud on 66</u>, the onsite coffee shop in a transformed mid-century tavern, and end it at <u>Scoops on 66</u>, a refurbished 1939 Mobile gas station serving ice cream. Opened May 2025.

New Campground Near Petrified Forest National Park

Opened May 2025

Visitors can watch a vibrant sunset over the vast, tranquil badlands near <u>Petrified Forest National Park</u> at the recently opened <u>Tickled Pink Flamingos Vintage Campground and Retreat Center</u>. Directly off Route 66, roadtrippers can relax in one of the five cozy campers and enjoy a campfire under the stars while taking in the peaceful solitude of their remote surroundings. <u>Tickled Pink Flamingos</u> blends vintage charm with nature's beauty, making it an ideal stop when exploring the Mother Road during its upcoming 2026 centennial.

Flagstaff's First-Ever Dual-Branded Hotel Opened in August 2025

Visitors participating in Flagstaff's numerous outdoor activities can stay at the city's first dual-branded hotel featuring Home2 Suites by Hilton and Tru by Hilton. The 113 suites at Home2 Suites by Hilton are ideal for guests seeking an extended stay to explore Flagstaff, while 91 streamlined guest rooms at Tru by Hilton are designed for Route 66 roadtrippers looking for a quick, yet vibrant pitstop near the Mother Road. Just a short drive away from Lowell Observatory and Flagstaff Extreme Adventure Course, guests can unwind after a day of adventure in the hotel's heated pool and dine at the onsite Pines Bar & Bistro. Opened August 2025.

Trailborn Grand Canyon

The <u>Trailborn Grand Canyon</u> is a newly restored hotel on <u>Route 66</u> in <u>Williams</u>, a historic town known as the Gateway to the Grand Canyon. Thanks to Trailborn's location, guests can easily ride the <u>Grand Canyon Railroad</u> to visit the <u>South Rim of the Grand Canyon</u> or enjoy the retro diners and shops along <u>Route 66</u> in Williams. Families can book off-site excursions with local experts to go on guided hikes, stargazing tours and helicopter rides. This is an ideal stay for road trippers eager to visit Arizona during the <u>Route 66 centennial celebration</u> in 2026. Opened early 2025.

Reimagined Dorrance Planetarium in Phoenix

Reopened in October 2025

Visitors and locals can explore the galaxy at the reimagined <u>Dorrance Planetarium</u> at the <u>Arizona Science Center</u> in downtown <u>Phoenix</u>, which reopened on Oct. 18, 2025. The planetarium is the most technologically advanced in North America, 100 times brighter than most planetarium projection domes, thanks to a partnership with the immersive tech company Cosm. This 8K+ resolution digital dome transports guests into space, black holes and the stars of Arizona's dark skies. It's a must-visit for space lovers, science enthusiasts and anyone looking for an awe-inspiring journey beyond Earth.

Rockin' River Ranch State Park is Now Open Five Days Weekly

New hours started in September 2025

Outdoor enthusiasts can now explore Arizona's newest state park, Rockin' River Ranch State Park in Camp Verde, Thursdays through Mondays, following the addition of two new days to its schedule. Visitors can enjoy six scenic and easy hiking trails that weave through pastures and riparian areas along the Verde River. Once a guest ranch, the park is ideal for picnicking, bird and wildlife watching, kayaking or fishing on the Verde River.

Arizona's First Upscale Supper Club Opens in Scottsdale

Elevated fine dining and entertainment can be enjoyed at the new <u>SHIV Supper Club</u> in <u>Scottsdale's Entertainment District</u>. This luxurious and intimate culinary experience offers world-class cuisine paired with craft cocktails and immersive entertainment. On weekends, the Supper Club transforms into <u>The Dessert Room</u>, where guests can indulge in 12 ever-changing, unique desserts crafted by acclaimed Pastry Chef Nundi Harris. Reservations are required. Opened in May 2025.

Phoenix Zoo's New 'Big Cats of Arizona' Habitat Opens

Guests at <u>Phoenix Zoo</u> can enjoy an up-close view of mountain lions and jaguars thanks to the new "Big Cats of Arizona: This new area includes the Zoo's first-ever "catwalk," allowing guests to walk directly below the big cats as they move overhead. Visitors can view the majestic cats from multiple angles while learning the importance of conserving these species. Opened in April 2025.

Surf in the Sonoran Desert

Hang ten at <u>Revel Surf</u> in <u>Mesa</u>, Arizona's only surf park, which welcomes newbies and experts to surf customizable waves and enjoy a beach day in the desert. Opened in February 2025, this park offers lessons on how to surf its lagoon's waves, which can reach up to six feet. Experienced surfers can focus on perfecting their techniques at the stationary deepwater area, conquering its consistent 33-foot-wide wave face. Opened in February 2025.

Enjoy American Indian Art on the New Salt River Arts Trail

Visitors should take time to observe baskets, paintings and sculptures made by members of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRPMIC) while venturing along the new Salt River Arts Trail woven throughout the Talking Stick Entertainment District. A visit to all 13 stops along the trail provides guests a way to experience SRPMIC's culture, creation stories and meaningful symbols. Those who visit the majority of the artwork along the trail will earn enough points to receive a free, exclusive T-shirt made by SRPMIC artist Dwayne Manuel at the Salt River Visitor Center. Visitors can then rock their custom shirt while gaming at Talking Stick Casino or catching a baseball game at Salt River Fields, spring training home of the Arizona Diamondbacks and Colorado Rockies, just to name a few other fun activities available within the area. Opened early 2025.

New Desert Diamond Casino White Tanks Opens West of Metro Phoenix

Visitors can try their luck at the new <u>Desert Diamond Casino White Tanks</u> in Waddell, west of Glendale. Owned and operated by the Tohono O'odham Nation, visitors can play roulette and poker before trying for the jackpot at one of the facility's 900 slots. Guests can celebrate their winnings by rewarding their taste buds at the casino's Morton's Steakhouse, pub or food hall while enjoying a cocktail or pint. Opened in December 2024.

New Mountain Bike Trail System Opens in Prescott

Now open to the public, the new <u>Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail System</u> in <u>Prescott</u> is designed so every biker, including recumbent hand-pedaled bikers, can experience the thrill of mountain biking through towering ponderosa pines. The first of their kind in the state, the 9.2 miles of gravity flow trails are bike-specific for all mountain bikers to enjoy, offering varying difficulties, multi-lap options and bike-only areas. A planned second phase will add 6.9 miles of trails to the public in Fall 2025.

Meteor City Reopens with a New Dino Drive-Thru

Reopened in May 2025

Families can spot more than 30 towering dinosaur statues at <u>Meteor City</u>, a longtime Route 66 roadside attraction recently revived for the next generation of roadtrippers. Easily recognizable by its massive geodesic dome, Meteor City is located 20 miles west of Winslow. Once a trading post and Texaco gas

station, Meteor City continues to evolve, offering fun activities while embracing the quirky spirit of Route 66. At the new <u>Dino Drive-thru</u>, travelers can drive through the one-of-a-kind dinosaur park with over 30 dinosaurs on display. Families can spend the afternoon mining for gemstones, creating graffiti art on a vintage Volkswagen and playing retro arcade games.

Route 66 Dog Park Newly Opened in Kingman

Opened September 2025

<u>Kingman</u> erected a drive-thru Route 66 shield for visitors to take the perfect photo and commemorate their drive along Route 66. For those traveling with their fur babies, Kingman offers yet another reason to make a stop. The newly opened <u>Route 66 Dog Park</u>, located next to the Route 66 Museum, provides plenty of space for dogs to run and offers a dog drinking fountain. The most bark-worthy attraction at the park is a 5-foot-tall dog walk-through Route 66 shield.

Enjoy New Musical Road Driving Into Winslow

Opened in September 2025

Route 66 roadtrippers can now hear their tires play the iconic tune of The Eagles' "Take it Easy" while cruising into Winslow thanks to the new custom-designed singing road installed as part of the upcoming Route 66 centennial celebration in 2026. The city of Winslow, with the help of ROADTUNES, installed a synthetic asphalt material that, when driven over at the exact speed of 35 miles per hour, will make the tires vibrate and create the tune of a verse in the song "Take it Easy" that mentions Winslow. Located on the east side of town near the 9/11 Memorial Park, drivers can roll down their windows and hear their tires play the catchy verse, "Standin' on a corner in Winslow, Arizona, such a fine sight to see", to kick off their visit before exploring Winslow's Standing on the Corner Park, Old Trails Museum and La Posada Hotel.

Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn Reopens

Travelers in Northern Arizona can once again explore <u>Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn</u>, located along Arizona's Historic Route 66 and home of the largest dry caverns in the U.S. The famous site reopened to visitors in June after extensive renovations. Visitors can descend 220 feet underground to tour the caverns, winding through the rock walls while learning about the cavern's history. After working up an appetite, visitors are encouraged to enjoy a meal at the <u>Crystal Restaurant</u>, which is located directly inside the caverns. The property also has newly renovated accommodations, including a_ranch house, cabins, a bunkhouse, standard rooms or a tent site. Visitors can also stay at the <u>on-site RV Park</u>, which features bathhouses for roadtrippers to enjoy. The Caverns make a great stop when driving along Route 66 to celebrate its centennial in 2026. Reopened in September 2025.

Petrified Forest Museum Association's 'The Bend on 66' Opens in Holbrook

The Petrified Forest Museum Association recently opened <u>'The Bend on 66'</u> its new headquarters, educational outlet and store in downtown <u>Holbrook</u>. The store offers a blend of park information, books and nostalgic collectible items. Designed to embody the classic retro flair of Route 66, the store serves as a great starting point for visitors to learn more about the Petrified Forest before visiting the park. Opened July 2025.

Flagstaff Welcomes New Astronomy Discovery Center

The new Kemper and Ethel Marley Foundation Astronomy Discovery Center at Lowell Observatory in Flagstaff opened in November 2024. The center offers visitors an opportunity to journey into the universe through the lens of astronomy with interactive exhibits and experiences. Designed to educate and delight guests of all ages, children can enjoy building their own rockets at the Orbits Curiosity Zone while adults learn about the planets and constellations by marveling at the Universe Theater's two-story, 165-degree curved LED screen. Once the sun sets, everyone is invited to the open-air rooftop planetarium to witness Flagstaff's famous starry dark skies and look for Pluto, discovered at Lowell almost a century ago. Opened November 2024.

New Skiing and Mountain Biking Trails in Flagstaff

Thrill seekers can race down <u>Flagstaff's</u> new skiing and mountain biking trails, the newest additions to the city's countless outdoor recreation opportunities. Thanks to the new Aspen Chairlift that opened during the 2024 ski season, <u>Arizona Snowbowl</u> has four new beginner ski trails where newbies can learn how to master skiing. For those on wheels instead of skis, they can ride down the city's two new directional mountain biking trails, Meteorite and Full Sail, both biking-only downhill trails on the Mount Elden Dry Lakes trail system. Racers can fly down the Meteorite Trail, a steep, technical trail, before riding on the Full Sail Trail, a flow trail with several jumps. These new trails opened in late 2024.

Southern Arizona – Arizona Attractions

Tucson's New Astro Trail

Stargazers can take <u>Tucson's new Astro Trail</u>, which offers self-guided dark-sky experiences and astronomical attractions across southern Arizona. Visitors embarking on the trail can peer into the cosmos by touring multiple observatories, exploring science museums, or camping under the night sky in designated dark sky parks. They can stay overnight at <u>Kitt Peak Observatory</u>, spot constellations at <u>Saguaro National Park</u> and learn about aerospace at the <u>Pima Air & Space Museum</u>, just a few of the astronomy adventures showcased on the Astro Trail. The Trail opened in early 2025.

Stargaze in Arizona's Two Newest Dark Sky Communities: Tubac and Bisbee

After dark, visitors can marvel at the starry skies over Arizona's two newly certified Dark Sky communities, <u>Tubac</u> and <u>Bisbee</u>. These Southern Arizona small towns earned the designation for their ongoing efforts to reduce light pollution, allowing for clearer skies where stargazers can spot constellations, shooting stars and planets. <u>Tubac</u> and <u>Bisbee</u> are also known for their thriving art scenes, which visitors can explore during the day before enjoying twinkling stars at night. With these two additions, Arizona now has <u>23 dark-sky communities</u>, places and parks. Communities earned the designation in late 2024.

New Tucson Military Vehicle Museum Puts Visitors Behind the Wheel

The ability to observe and even drive rare military vehicles from different periods and countries is now available at the new <u>Tucson Military Vehicle Museum</u>, located next to the world-renowned Pima Air & Space Museum in Tucson. One of only a few military vehicle museums in the Southwest, this new museum has 100 armored fighting vehicles from around the world, various immersive exhibits and different riding and driving experiences available. Opened March 2025.

Tucson Auto Museum Reopened

Car enthusiasts can enjoy the <u>Tucson Auto Museum</u> at its new, easily accessible location. More than 70 cars are displayed through the museum, including vintage, Hollywood-inspired and limited edition vehicles. Visitors can catch a glimpse of two rare Davis Divan cars, of which only 17 were ever produced, and an Aqua Car that can ride on water, and take a picture in front of a replica of the Batmobile from the famed Batman TV series of the 1960s. Car meet-ups and car shows are held in front of the museum all year round. The museum reopened in April 2025.

New Places to Visit in Kingman

The heart of Arizona's Route 66, <u>Kingman</u>, is getting ready for the centennial by upgrading its famous <u>Arizona Route 66 Museum</u> and offering new hotels. Only a mile from the historic route, a new property recently opened, the dual-branded <u>Wingate by Wyndham/Hawthorn Extended Stay</u>, featuring EV charging stations and a pool where roadtrippers can cool off. These new additions occurred in early 2025.

Prescott's New Whiskey Trail Pass

Launched in September 2025

Visitors can immerse themselves in the Western charm of <u>Prescott's</u> famous Whiskey Row with the new <u>Prescott Whiskey Trail</u>, a free digital pass that showcases the best bars downtown. After downloading the pass, thirsty participants can explore 24 bars and saloons, each offering signature whiskeys or pints. At each stop, users check-in by completing a custom trivia challenge or scavenger hunt-style riddle to earn points to unlock prizes and perks along the way. Download the pass here.

New Arizona Wild Bunch: Family Pass

Families traveling with kids can discover all of Arizona's best family-friendly activities with the new Arizona Wild Bunch: Family Pass. The free passport offers an interactive map and guide that showcases more than 60 kid-approved attractions and destinations across the state. With this pass as a resource, families can easily plan their trip and embark on fun adventures like riding the Grand Canyon Railway in Williams, expressing creativity at the i.d.e.a Museum in Mesa, or exploring five completely different environments at Biosphere 2 near Tucson. With an abundance of outdoor adventures, museums, zoos and hands-on activities — there's something fun to discover for the whole family. The pass launched in the summer of 2025.

Flagstaff's New Route 66 Passport

Visitors can easily explore all the Route 66 activities <u>Flagstaff offers with the free Discover 66 Things to Do on Route 66 Passport</u>. After downloading the passport, travelers will learn more about Route 66 by taking the self-guided <u>Walk This Talk Tour</u>, visiting the Route 66 Preservation Project and heading to the Flagstaff Visitor Center to see the Route 66 street mural. With the new passport's help, they can discover exciting activities along the Mother Road, the best restaurants downtown and retro motor lodges to stay at along Route 66. As the first city to earn a Destination Verified Seal from Wheel the World, a website dedicated to connecting people with disabilities with recommended activities in destinations, Mesa's new guide also includes accessible trails, accommodations and resources. Arizona's First Nonstop Flights to Asia

The launch of direct flights between Taiwan and Phoenix from Taiwan-based carriers <u>China Airlines</u> and <u>STARLUX Airlines</u> will start in late 2025 and early 2026, signaling a new era of connectivity between Arizona and Asia. These new routes connect the state to potential visitors from more than 20 major markets across the region. Asia is the state's fastest-growing international market, with visitation increasing 42% year-over-year so far in 2025. The new flight was announced in June 2025.

STARLUX Airlines Announces Partnership with American Airlines

Announced in August 2025

Following the announcement of its new nonstop flights between Phoenix, Arizona, and Taipei, Taiwan STARLUX has revealed a new partnership with American Airlines. As a key hub in the Southwestern U.S. for American Airlines, Phoenix offers strategic advantages for travelers. STARLUX has scheduled its Phoenix flights to allow smooth connections to American flights bound for major U.S. cities such as New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, Charlotte, Miami, Dallas, Las Vegas and more.

New Nonstop Frontier Flight between Tucson and Dallas-Fort Worth Began in October

Frontier Airlines offers nonstop service between <u>Tucson International Airport (TUS)</u> and Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) twice a week, starting Oct. 9, 2025. This marks Frontier Airlines' third nonstop destination since returning to TUS earlier in the year. The new flight was announced in July 2025.

Air France Increases Nonstop Flights between Phoenix and Paris

Air France now offers nonstop service between Phoenix and Paris five times a week on an Airbus A350-900, a fuel-efficient aircraft known for its reduced environmental impact. This increase in flights for Air France's first-ever nonstop flight between Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport (PHX) and Paris Charles de Gaulle International Airport started just in time for the inaugural flight's first anniversary in May 2025. The news of the increase in flights was announced in May 2025.

Sharlot Hall Museum in Prescott is Now an Officially Recognized Arboretum

Plant lovers can wander among 89 species of trees and woody plants at <u>Sharlot Hall Museum</u> in Prescott, a newly recognized arboretum. Visitors can explore the museum's four-acre campus, including the Yavpé Ethnobotany Garden, created with the help of the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe. Or, they choose to stroll through the stunning Memorial Rose Garden, home to 180 rose varieties and dedicated to Arizona's early pioneer and frontier women. Visitors can also explore the museum's eight historic buildings, including the log cabin Governor's Mansion built in 1864 for the first Governor of the Arizona Territory, John Goodwin. This landmark houses exhibits on pioneer life, the history of the Yavapai people and early vehicles. The museum earned the recognition in April 2025.

New Aeromexico Nonstop Flights Between Phoenix and Mexico City Commenced Spring 2025 In March 2025, Aeromexico and Delta Airlines partnered to launch new daily nonstop flights between Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport and Mexico City International Airport. This marks the second airline at Phoenix Sky Harbor to offer non-stop flights between Phoenix and Mexico City, as demand for routes between these destinations keeps growing.

Paleontologists Name A New Species of Tanystropheid Reptile at Petrified Forest National Park Announced in August 2025

Paleontologists at <u>Petrified Forest National Park</u> named a new aquatic reptile whose fossils were discovered in the park. The Akidostropheus oligos, a tanystropheid reptile that lived in the Triassic period, was smaller than a pinky and had a long neck for its body size. In collaboration with the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, the Petrified Forest named the reptile after its distinct

appearance, with Akidostropheus oligos meaning "tiny spiked back bone," referring to its distinctively small neck vertebra with a unique spike on top. The fossils were found in the "Thunderstorm Ridge" area of the park by collecting rocks, rinsing the rocks with water through a fine metal screen and looking at the sediments under a microscope to find the microfossils of the Akidostropheus oligos.

Grand Canyon National Park South Rim Remains Open While North Rim Closes for Season

The visitor season at the North Rim of Grand Canyon National Park has been cut short by destruction from the Dragon Bravo Fire. The North Rim is now closed for the remainder of the 2025 season, which runs through November 30, 2025. While the North Rim is closed, all the South Rim businesses, hotels and surrounding communities such as Tusayan, Valle, Williams and Cameron remain open, fully operational and ready to welcome guests. in Thailand at Lom Wong, offering diners a chance to try unique dishes from small villages across the
country. This family-run restaurant invites guests to savor Won Pen's fried chicken, pork belly curry and
egg noodles with a cocktail while enjoying the intimate yet welcoming atmosphere. The James Beard
Foundation celebrates individuals transforming America's food culture by recognizing chefs and
restaurants that uphold a standard of high quality. The restaurant earned the award in June 2025.

Visit one of Novel Ice Cream's three locations (downtown Mesa, Old Town Peoria or downtown Phoenix) for the best summer dessert. The ice cream shop earned the award in July 2025.
