**The Spa at Camelback Inn Reopens After \$24M Renovation**

After a \$24 million transformation, [The Spa at Camelback Inn](#) recently reopened at the [JW Marriott Scottsdale Camelback Inn Resort & Spa](#) in Paradise Valley, welcoming guests to discover wellness and reawaken their senses with treatments inspired by the Sonoran Desert. The spa embraces the ariVéa philosophy, an individually crafted pathway to holistic health that combines the natural energy of Arizona’s desert with timeless rituals and treatments. Guests can find serenity enjoying an adobe mud wrap, participating in a trio of tranquil hydrotherapies, joining a wide variety of classes at the new wellness studio and enjoying meals at the new Ora Cafe.

**AC Hotel Scottsdale Old Town**

Visitors can stay just steps away from [Old Town Scottsdale's](#) nightlife and charming Arts District at the new [AC Hotel Scottsdale Old Town](#). Here, guests can spend the day poolside at the rooftop pool before dining at Cielito, the rooftop restaurant that offers Northwest Mexico-inspired cuisine and stunning views of the city. After long days of exploring or attending conferences, guests can wind down in their desert-inspired, pet-friendly rooms. Opened February 2026.

Families seeking a longer-term stay can book the [Canyon Vista](#), a new private residence offered at [Enchantment Resort](#), located in Boynton Canyon in [Sedona](#). Canyon Vista is a two-bedroom home with a

Completed in early 2026.

The 137-room resort will feature redesigned guestrooms and an enhanced spa where guests can relax in the dry sauna or take a cold plunge. ### **Hotel Valley Ho in Scottsdale Completed its \$18 million Renovation**

Highland is open seasonally from May 1 to Oct. 20. Opened in May 2025

### **Tin Can Alley Airbnb Welcomes Travelers on Route 66**

With the Route 66 Centennial celebration, [Kingman](#) is ready to welcome visitors to the newly opened [Tin Can Alley](#). Here, guests can stay overnight in renovated vintage Airstream trailers, footsteps away from the city's numerous museums, retro diners and memorabilia shops. Visitors can start every adventurous day at [Mud on 66](#), the onsite coffee shop in a transformed mid-century tavern, and end it at [Scoops on 66](#), a refurbished 1939 Mobile gas station serving ice cream. Opened May 2025.

Visitors can watch a vibrant sunset over the vast, tranquil badlands near [Petrified Forest National Park](#) at the recently opened [Tickled Pink Flamingos Vintage Campground and Retreat Center](#). [Tickled Pink Flamingos](#) blends vintage charm with nature's beauty, making it an ideal stop when exploring the Mother Road during its upcoming 2026 centennial. Opened May 2025.

Visitors participating in Flagstaff's numerous outdoor activities can stay at the city's first dual-branded hotel featuring [Home2 Suites by Hilton](#) and [Tru by Hilton](#). The 113 suites at Home2 Suites by Hilton are ideal for guests seeking an extended stay to explore Flagstaff, while 91 streamlined guest rooms at Tru by Hilton are designed for Route 66 roadtrippers looking for a quick, yet vibrant pitstop near the Mother Road. Opened August 2025.

Thanks to Trailborn's location, guests can easily ride the [Grand Canyon Railroad](#) to visit the [South Rim of the Grand Canyon](#) or enjoy the retro diners and shops along [Route 66](#) in Williams. Families can book off-site excursions with local experts to go on guided hikes, stargazing tours and helicopter rides. This is an ideal stay for road trippers eager to visit Arizona during the [Route 66 centennial celebration](#) in 2026. Opened early 2025.

## **Arizona Attractions**

### ***Greater Phoenix and Central Arizona***

#### **Arizona Baseball Museum Now Open in Mesa**

Baseball fans can discover Arizona's longstanding passion for the sport at the recently opened [Arizona Baseball Museum](#) on the [Mesa Historical Museum](#) campus in [Mesa](#). Wandering through the exhibits, visitors can witness baseball as a favorite pastime for miners and military personnel during the 1800s, learn the origins of the [Cactus League](#) and see fans' favorite Spring Training memories throughout the years. Open year-round. Opened February 2026

### **Western Spirit: Scottsdale's Museum of the West Opens 4 New Galleries**

Families can stroll through four new galleries at the new [Louis Sands IV Center](#), a 12,000-square-foot expansion at [Western Spirit: Scottsdale's Museum of the West](#). The new galleries offer bronze sculptures of the Southwest, American Indian jewelry, clay artwork and the Working Partners exhibit, which displays masterpiece artwork from the Basha Collection. Western enthusiasts and art lovers can spend the afternoon exploring the museum's vast collection of Western attire, tools, movie posters and art. Opened March 2026

### **Verde Canyon Railroad Revives Morning and Starlight Train Rides**

Families can ride into Verde Canyon in [Clarkdale](#) on the [Verde Canyon Railroad's](#) Morning or Starlight Adventures train rides, both now available every Saturday through the end of the year. The Morning ride offers views of the canyon's towering walls, massive cottonwood trees and the Verde River's emerald water, combined with brisk morning weather and the golden light, best taken in from the train's open-air viewing area. Or, riders can catch a signature Arizona sunset on the [Saturday Starlight Adventures](#) ride, watching the colorful sky transform into a dark blanket of stars for a one-of-a-kind stargazing experience.

### **International Dark Sky Discovery Center**

Families will be able to peer into the galaxy at the new [International Dark Sky Discovery Center](#) in [Fountain Hills](#), which will feature the largest telescope in the Phoenix metro area open for public viewing. At the center, visitors will learn about astronomy by marveling at the Craig and Ruth Gimbel Planetarium, equipped with state-of-the-art tilted dome technology. Visitors will also enjoy views of dark skies at the Inspiration Theater. Space enthusiasts of all ages will be eager to explore the interactive exhibit hall and become scientists with hands-on learning experiences. Opening January 2027.

### **The Rough Rider: A New Biking Race**

Bikers can race through the Prescott National Forest competing in [The Rough Rider](#), a new three-day gravel stage race in [Prescott](#) that combines challenging terrain, scenic views and Western charm for a one-of-a-kind race. The three-day race starts in the mining town of Jerome with racers conquering switchbacks before arriving at Watson Lake in Prescott. On the second day, riders pedal through the pines of the Prescott National Forest until racing back into downtown Prescott. On the last day, racers take off from downtown to the Thumb Butte corridor into the wilderness before finishing the race at downtown Prescott's Courthouse Square. Race is Oct. 30 - Nov. 1, 2026.

### **Reimagined Dorrance Planetarium in Phoenix**

Visitors and locals can explore the galaxy at the reimagined [Dorrance Planetarium](#) at the [Arizona Science Center](#) in downtown [Phoenix](#). The planetarium is the most technologically advanced in North America, 100 times brighter than most planetarium projection domes, thanks to a partnership with the immersive tech company Cosm. This 8K+ resolution digital dome transports guests into space, black holes and the

stars of Arizona's dark skies. It's a must-visit for space lovers, science enthusiasts and anyone looking for an awe-inspiring journey beyond Earth. Reopened in October 2025.

### **New Mountain Bike Trail System Opens in Prescott**

The new [Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail System](#) in [Prescott](#) is designed so every biker, including recumbent hand-pedaled bikers, can experience the thrill of mountain biking through towering ponderosa pines. The first of its kind in the state, the 9.2 miles of gravity flow trails are bike-specific for all mountain bikers to enjoy, offering varying difficulties, multi-lap options and bike-only areas. The second phase added 6.9 miles of trails to the public in Fall 2025.

### **Sharlot Hall Museum in Prescott is Now an Officially Recognized Arboretum**

Plant lovers can wander among 89 species of trees and woody plants at [Sharlot Hall Museum](#) in Prescott, a newly recognized arboretum. Visitors can explore the museum's four-acre campus, including the Yavpé Ethnobotany Garden, created with the help of the Yavapai-Prescott Indian Tribe. Or, they choose to stroll through the stunning Memorial Rose Garden, home to 180 rose varieties and dedicated to Arizona's early pioneer and frontier women. Visitors can also explore the museum's eight historic buildings, including the log cabin Governor's Mansion built in 1864 for the first Governor of the Arizona Territory, John Goodwin. This landmark houses exhibits on pioneer life, the history of the Yavapai people and early vehicles. The museum earned the Arboretum recognition in April 2025.

## ***Northern Arizona – Arizona Attractions***

### **New Full-Rim Guided Hike Around Meteor Crater on Route 66**

Visitors can now take [a guided hike around the full 2.5-mile rim of Meteor Crater](#) near [Winslow](#). The 550-foot-deep crater, which was created by a catastrophic impact 50,000 years ago, is the best-preserved site of its kind on Earth. On this new private hike, offered every Saturday morning through 2026, participants go beyond public trails to access hidden vantage points and rare views while receiving insider information on the crater's preserved geology and history. After the hike, visitors can explore the [Meteor Crater Discovery Center and Space Museum](#) to enjoy interactive exhibits and astronaut-training artifacts. Reservations required.

### **Seasonal Native Artisans Vendor Market Returns to Grand Canyon**

Visitors in search of authentic goods handcrafted by American Indian artists can now browse the wares at the [Native Artisans Vendor Market](#), which recently returned to the Grand Canyon for its fifth consecutive season. At this spring-to-fall outdoor market, visitors can meet with Indigenous artists to learn about their tribal communities and the story behind their artwork, including jewelry, pottery and sculptures. The market will be open 9 a.m.–4 p.m. daily at the Grand Canyon Visitor Center at the South Rim of [Grand Canyon National Park](#), and every Thursday through Monday at the [Tusayan Pueblo Museum](#), through October.

### **Highway Hot Dog Opens On Route 66**

Road trippers can enjoy all-beef hot dogs at the newly opened [Highway Hot Dog](#) in [Seligman](#). Families can stop here for hot dogs, sandwiches, lattes and gelato before exploring Seligman's history and gift shops. Located in a historic building that was a theater and a sweet parlor, Highway Hot Dog is owned by the same restaurant entrepreneurs of Seligman's beloved Westside Lilo's Cafe. Opened in early 2026.

### **GPS Guided Route 66 Audio Tour**

The recently launched [GPS Guided Route 66 Audio Tour](#) provides road trippers with historic information and driving instructions as they cruise along Arizona's Route 66. Created by the [Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona](#) and developed by the Guide Along, the audio tour offers intriguing tidbits and tips. Visitors can purchase the tour for \$26 from the Guide Along website, the App Store or the Play Store. Drivers can also purchase additional tours for area attractions, including the [Grand Canyon National Park South Rim](#) and the [Petrified Forest National Park](#). It is available for download throughout the centennial celebration.

### **New Route 66 Experiences in Flagstaff**

In Flagstaff, [Route 66 to the Grand Canyon](#), a family-friendly comedy written by acclaimed filmmaker and writer Peter Kershaw debuted at the [Doris Harper-White Playhouse](#) on February 8, 2026. This interactive and heartfelt play will also be held at the [Museum of Northern Arizona](#) throughout 2026. Along with the play, the Museum of Northern Arizona offers a new exhibit, "[Wagon Road to Mother Road](#)" which showcases the evolution of travel in northern Arizona from the Beale Wagon Road to Route 66. The exhibit runs through October 26, 2026, and is based on the museum's archaeological surveys in [Petrified Forest National Park](#). Lowell Observatory has opened a new tour called "[Cosmic Highways: A Centennial Tour](#)" that follows the astronomical discoveries of Percival Lowell, the founder of Lowell Observatory, made along Route 66 in Arizona. In addition, Flagstaff will host a Route 66 Centennial celebration on June 6, 2026.

### **Meteor City Reopens with a New Dino Drive-Thru**

Families can spot more than 30 towering dinosaur statues at [Meteor City](#), a longtime Route 66 roadside attraction recently revived for the next generation of roadtrippers. Easily recognizable by its massive geodesic dome, Meteor City is located 20 miles west of Winslow. Once a trading post and Texaco gas station, Meteor City continues to evolve, offering fun activities while embracing the quirky spirit of Route 66. At the new [Dino Drive-thru](#), travelers can drive through the one-of-a-kind dinosaur park with over 30 dinosaurs on display. Families can spend the afternoon mining for gemstones, creating graffiti art on a vintage Volkswagen and playing retro arcade games. Reopened in May 2025.

### **Route 66 Dog Park Newly Opened in Kingman**

[Kingman](#) erected a drive-thru Route 66 shield for visitors to take the perfect photo and commemorate their drive along Route 66. For those traveling with their fur babies, Kingman offers yet another reason to make a stop. The newly opened [Route 66 Dog Park](#), located next to the Route 66 Museum, provides

plenty of space for dogs to run and offers a dog drinking fountain. The most bark-worthy attraction at the park is a 5-foot-tall dog walk-through Route 66 shield. Opened September 2025.

### **Enjoy New Musical Road Driving Into Winslow**

Route 66 roadtrippers can now hear their tires play the iconic tune of The Eagles' "Take it Easy" while cruising into [Winslow](#) thanks to the new custom-designed singing road installed as part of the Route 66 centennial celebration in 2026. The city of Winslow, with the help of ROADTUNES, installed a synthetic asphalt material that, when driven over at the exact speed of 35 miles per hour, will make the tires vibrate and create the tune of a verse in the song "Take it Easy" that mentions Winslow. Located on the east side of town near the 9/11 Memorial Park, drivers can roll down their windows and hear their tires play the catchy verse, "Standin' on a corner in Winslow, Arizona, such a fine sight to see," to kick off their visit before exploring Winslow's Standing on the Corner Park, Old Trails Museum and La Posada Hotel. Opened in September 2025.

### **Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn Reopens**

Travelers in Northern Arizona can once again explore [Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn](#), located along Arizona's Historic Route 66 and home of the largest dry caverns in the U.S. The famous site reopened to visitors in June after extensive renovations. Visitors can descend 220 feet underground to tour the caverns, winding through the rock walls while learning about the cavern's history. After working up an appetite, visitors are encouraged to enjoy a meal at the [Crystal Restaurant](#), which is located directly inside the caverns. The property also has newly renovated accommodations, including a ranch house, cabins, a bunkhouse, standard rooms or a tent site. Visitors can also stay at the [on-site RV Park](#), which features bathhouses for roadtrippers to enjoy. The Caverns make a great stop when driving along Route 66 to celebrate its centennial in 2026. Reopened in September 2025.

### **Petrified Forest Museum Association's 'The Bend on 66' Opens in Holbrook**

The Petrified Forest Museum Association recently opened '[The Bend on 66](#)', its new headquarters, educational outlet and store in downtown [Holbrook](#). The store offers a blend of park information, books and nostalgic collectible items. Designed to embody the classic retro flair of Route 66, the store serves as a great starting point for visitors to learn more about the Petrified Forest before visiting the park. Opened July 2025.

### ***Southern Arizona – Arizona Attractions***

#### **Embark on Tucson's New Sonoran Hot Dog Trail**

Foodies can devour delicious Sonoran hot dogs all across [Tucson](#) by following Visit Tucson's new [Sonoran Dog Trail](#), a free, self-guided culinary tour showcasing this unique regional entree. A Sonoran dog is a bacon-wrapped hot dog tucked into a bolillo roll and topped with Southwestern ingredients, including salsa verde, pinto beans and jalapeños. Local stands and restaurants on the tour include [BK Tacos](#), [Percheron Mexican Grill](#) and the famous [El Güero Canelo](#), which offers a James Beard Award-winning version. ### **Tucson Auto Museum Reopened**

Visitors can catch a glimpse of two rare Davis Divan cars, of which only 17 were ever produced, and an Aqua Car that can ride on water, and take a picture in front of a replica of the Batmobile from the famed Batman TV series of the 1960s. Car meet-ups and car shows are held in front of the museum all year-round. The museum reopened in April 2025.

### **STARLUX Airlines Announces Partnership with American Airlines**

Following the announcement of its new nonstop flights between [Phoenix](#), Arizona, and Taipei, Taiwan [STARLUX](#) has revealed a new partnership with American Airlines. As a key hub in the Southwestern U.S. for American Airlines, Phoenix offers strategic advantages for travelers. STARLUX has scheduled its Phoenix flights to allow smooth connections to American flights bound for major U.S. cities such as New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, Charlotte, Miami, Dallas, Las Vegas and more. Announced in August 2025.

### **New Nonstop Frontier Flight between Tucson and Dallas-Fort Worth Began in October**

Frontier Airlines offers nonstop service between [Tucson International Airport \(TUS\)](#) and Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) twice a week, starting Oct. 9, 2025. This marks Frontier Airlines' third nonstop destination since returning to TUS earlier in the year. The new flight was announced in July 2025.

### **Air France Increases Nonstop Flights between Phoenix and Paris**

Air France now offers nonstop service between Phoenix and Paris five times a week on an Airbus A350-900, a fuel-efficient aircraft known for its reduced environmental impact. This increase in flights for Air France's first-ever nonstop flight between [Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport \(PHX\)](#) and Paris Charles de Gaulle International Airport started just in time for the inaugural flight's first anniversary in May 2025. The news of the increase in flights was announced in May 2025.

### **New Aeromexico Nonstop Flights Between Phoenix and Mexico City Commenced Spring 2025**

In March 2025, Aeromexico and Delta Airlines partnered to launch new daily nonstop flights between [Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport](#) and Mexico City International Airport. This marks the second airline at Phoenix Sky Harbor to offer non-stop flights between Phoenix and Mexico City, as demand for routes between these destinations keeps growing.

Stargazers can dance under the stars at the Full Moon Concerts in Buffalo Park held throughout the summer and participate in the 25th Anniversary Celebration events occurring on October 24, 2026. Space enthusiasts can learn and observe Flagstaff's dark skies anytime by visiting [Lowell Observatory](#) and the [Astronomy Discovery Center](#) at Lowell. Celebrate throughout 2026.

#### **Paleontologists Name A New Species of Tanystropheid Reptile at Petrified Forest National Park**

Paleontologists at [Petrified Forest National Park](#) named a new aquatic reptile whose fossils were discovered in the park. The Akidostropheus oligos, a tanystropheid reptile that lived in the Triassic period, was smaller than a pinky and had a long neck for its body size. In collaboration with the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, the Petrified Forest named the reptile after its distinct appearance, with Akidostropheus oligos meaning "tiny spiked back bone," referring to its distinctively small neck vertebra with a unique spike on top. The fossils were found in the "Thunderstorm Ridge" area of the park by collecting rocks, rinsing the rocks with water through a fine metal screen and looking at

the sediments under a microscope to find the microfossils of the Akidostropheus oligos. Announced in August 2025.
