The Spa at Camelback Inn Reopens After \$24M Renovation

After a \$24 million transformation, [The Spa at Camelback Inn](#) recently reopened at the [JW Marriott Scottsdale Camelback Inn Resort & Spa](#) in Paradise Valley, welcoming guests to discover wellness and reawaken their senses with treatments inspired by the Sonoran Desert. Arizona Baseball Museum Now Open in Mesa

Baseball fans can discover Arizona's longstanding passion for the sport at the recently opened [Arizona Baseball Museum](#) on the [Mesa Historical Museum](#) campus in [Mesa](#). Wandering through the exhibits, visitors can witness baseball as a favorite pastime for miners and military personnel during the 1800s, learn the origins of the [Cactus League](#) and see fans' favorite Spring Training memories throughout the years. Open year-round. Opened February 2026.

Western Spirit: Scottsdale's Museum of the West Opens Four New Galleries

Families can stroll through four new galleries at the new [Louis Sands IV Center](#), a 12,000-square-foot expansion at [Western Spirit: Scottsdale's Museum of the West](#). The new galleries offer bronze sculptures of the Southwest, American Indian jewelry, clay artwork and the Working Partners exhibit, which displays masterpiece artwork from the Basha Collection. Western enthusiasts and art lovers can spend the afternoon exploring the museum's vast collection of Western attire, tools, movie posters and art. Opened March 2026.

Verde Canyon Railroad Revives Morning and Starlight Train Rides

Families can ride into Verde Canyon in [Clarkdale](#) on the [Verde Canyon Railroad's](#) Morning or Starlight Adventures train rides, both now available every Saturday through the end of 2026. The Morning ride offers views of the canyon's towering walls, massive cottonwood trees and the Verde River's emerald water, combined with brisk morning weather and the golden light, best taken in from the train's open-air viewing area. Or, riders can catch a signature Arizona sunset on the [Saturday Starlight Adventures](#) ride, watching the colorful sky transform into a dark blanket of stars for a one-of-a-kind stargazing experience. Available all year round till 2027.

International Dark Sky Discovery Center

Families will be able to peer into the galaxy at the new [International Dark Sky Discovery Center](#) in [Fountain Hills](#), which will feature the largest telescope in the Phoenix metro area open for public viewing. At the center, visitors will learn about astronomy by marveling at the Craig and Ruth Gimbel Planetarium, equipped with state-of-the-art tilted dome technology. Visitors will also enjoy views of dark skies at the Inspiration Theater. Space enthusiasts of all ages will be eager to explore the interactive exhibit hall and become scientists with hands-on learning experiences. Opening January 2027.

The Rough Rider: A New Biking Race

Bikers can race through the Prescott National Forest competing in [The Rough Rider](#), a new three-day gravel stage race in [Prescott](#) that combines challenging terrain, scenic views and Western charm for a one-of-a-kind race. The three-day race starts in the mining town of Jerome with racers conquering switchbacks before arriving at Watson Lake in Prescott. On the second day, riders pedal through the pines of the Prescott National Forest until racing back into downtown Prescott. On the last day, racers take off from downtown to the Thumb Butte corridor into the wilderness before finishing the race at downtown Prescott's Courthouse Square. Race is Oct. 30 - Nov. 1, 2026.

Reimagined Dorrance Planetarium in Phoenix

Visitors and locals can explore the galaxy at the reimagined [Dorrance Planetarium](#) at the [Arizona Science Center](#) in downtown [Phoenix](#). The planetarium is the most technologically advanced in North America, 100 times brighter than most planetarium projection domes, thanks to a partnership with the immersive tech company Cosm. This 8K+ resolution digital dome transports guests into space, black holes and the stars of Arizona's dark skies. It's a must-visit for space lovers, science enthusiasts and anyone looking for an awe-inspiring journey beyond Earth. Reopened in October 2025.

New Mountain Bike Trail System Opens in Prescott

The new [Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail System](#) in [Prescott](#) is designed so every biker, including recumbent hand-pedaled bikers, can experience the thrill of mountain biking through towering ponderosa pines. The first of its kind in the state, the 9.2 miles of gravity flow trails are bike-specific for all mountain bikers to enjoy, offering varying difficulties, multi-lap options and bike-only areas. The second phase added 6.9 miles of trails to the public in Fall 2025.

Grand Canyon North Rim Reopens to Visitors

After extensive restoration work, the North Rim of the [Grand Canyon National Park](#) reopened May 15, 2026, signaling the start of the area's annual summer visitor season. This year's gate-raising had special significance because it marked the first time the public has been able to access the area's famous viewpoints, trails and campground since the Dragon Bravo Fire swept across the region last year. Historic Lookout Studio at the Grand Canyon Reopens After Restoration

The historic [Lookout Studio](#) at Grand Canyon National Park's South Rim, designed by famous Southwestern architect Mary Jane Colter in 1914, has reopened after a restoration project to repair original stone and log features, reexpose long-concealed architectural details and remove nonhistoric finishes. Upgrades were also made to improve the visitor experience and the studio's accessibility. The stone and log structure, built into the canyon rim, is now a gift shop known for its unparalleled views of the [Grand Canyon](#). Reopened in May 2026.

New Route 66 Walking Tour in Flagstaff

[Flagstaff](#) visitors can explore 1.3 miles of Route 66 on foot on a [new tour](#) offered by [Freaky Foot Tours](#). During the two-hour walking tour, visitors make 18 stops throughout downtown Flagstaff and are regaled with stories about Mars, murders and the Mother Road, covering both the original 1926 alignment and the 1934 reroute. Freaky Foot Tours also offers Haunted History and Historic Downtown Murals and Mountain Town of Madness tours in Flagstaff. Opened in April 2026.

Meteor Crater Opens Floor Tours to Hikers

For the first time, [Meteor Crater](#) visitors can go beyond the rim. On the new [Floor Tour](#), a two-hour, advanced-level guided hike to an area previously available only to NASA astronauts and scientists, participants follow the historic Astronaut Trail to the crater floor to explore its unique geology, mining history and space-training legacy, making it a bucket-list stop for anyone celebrating the Route 66 Centennial. The tour is available every Saturday morning but is limited to just 30 guests, so advance booking is highly recommended. Opened in May 2026.

New Hopi Art Exhibit Opens at Museum of Northern Arizona

[Flagstaff's Museum of Northern Arizona](#) recently introduced “Artist Hopid Unveiled,” a three-part exhibition series showcasing Indigenous art from the groundbreaking Artist Hopi Collective. This

installation, which runs through April 2027, features historic and recent masterpieces that blend traditional Hopi imagery with modern painting techniques to educate the public on Hopi culture. Don't miss this rare opportunity in Flagstaff to experience a contemporary visual legacy that has redefined Indigenous art for decades.

Meteor Crater Opens New Floor Tours and Full-Rim Guided Hike to Hikers

For the first time, [Meteor Crater](#) visitors can go beyond the rim on the new [Floor Tour](#), a two-hour, advanced-level guided hike to an area previously available only to NASA astronauts and scientists. On the floor tour, participants follow the historic Astronaut Trail to the crater floor to explore its unique geology, mining history and space-training legacy. Visitors can also now take [a guided hike around the full 2.5-mile rim of Meteor Crater](#) near [Winslow](#). On this new private hike, participants go beyond public trails to access hidden vantage points and rare views while receiving insider information on the crater's preserved geology and history. Both tours are offered every Saturday morning, but the floor tour is limited to just 30 guests, so advanced booking is highly recommended.

Seasonal Native Artisans Vendor Market Returns to Grand Canyon

Visitors in search of authentic goods handcrafted by American Indian artists can now browse the wares at the [Native Artisans Vendor Market](#), which recently returned to the Grand Canyon for its fifth consecutive season. At this spring-to-fall outdoor market, visitors can meet with Indigenous artists to learn about their tribal communities and the story behind their artwork, including jewelry, pottery and sculptures. The market will be open 9 a.m.–4 p.m. daily at the Grand Canyon Visitor Center at the South Rim of [Grand Canyon National Park](#), and every Thursday through Monday at the [Tusayan Pueblo Museum](#) through October.

Highway Hot Dog Opens On Route 66

Road trippers can enjoy all-beef hot dogs at the newly opened [Highway Hot Dog](#) in [Seligman](#). Families can stop here for hot dogs, sandwiches, lattes and gelato before exploring Seligman's history and gift shops. Located in a historic building that was a theater and a sweet parlor, Highway Hot Dog is owned by the same restaurant entrepreneurs of Seligman's beloved Westside Lilo's Cafe. Opened in early 2026.

GPS Guided Route 66 Audio Tour

The recently launched [GPS Guided Route 66 Audio Tour](#) provides road trippers with historic information and driving instructions as they cruise along Arizona's Route 66. Created by the [Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona](#) and developed by the Guide Along, the audio tour offers intriguing tidbits and tips. Visitors can purchase the tour for \$26 from the Guide Along website, the App Store or the Play Store. Drivers can also purchase additional tours for area attractions, including the [Grand Canyon National Park South Rim](#) and the [Petrified Forest National Park](#). It is available for download throughout the centennial celebration. Launched in March 2026.

Route 66 Experiences in Flagstaff

In Flagstaff, [Route 66 to the Grand Canyon](#), a family-friendly comedy written by acclaimed filmmaker and writer Peter Kershaw debuted at the [Doris Harper-White Playhouse](#) on February 8, 2026. This interactive and heartfelt play will also be held at the [Museum of Northern Arizona](#) throughout 2026. Along with the play, the Museum of Northern Arizona offers a new exhibit, "[Wagon Road to Mother Road](#)" which showcases the evolution of travel in northern Arizona from the Beale Wagon Road to Route 66. The exhibit runs through October 26, 2026, and is based on the museum's archaeological surveys in [Petrified Forest National Park](#). Lowell Observatory has opened a new tour called "[Cosmic Highways: A Centennial Tour](#)" that follows the astronomical discoveries of Percival Lowell, the founder of Lowell Observatory, made along Route 66 in Arizona. In addition, Flagstaff will host a Route 66 Centennial celebration on June 6, 2026.

Route 66 Dog Park Newly Opened in Kingman

[Kingman](#) erected a drive-thru Route 66 shield for visitors to take the perfect photo and commemorate their drive along Route 66. For those traveling with their fur babies, Kingman offers yet another reason to make a stop. The newly opened [Route 66 Dog Park](#), located next to the Route 66 Museum, provides plenty of space for dogs to run and offers a dog drinking fountain. The most bark-worthy attraction at the park is a 5-foot-tall dog walk-through Route 66 shield. Opened September 2025.

Enjoy New Musical Road Driving Into Winslow

Route 66 roadtrippers can now hear their tires play the iconic tune of The Eagles' "Take it Easy" while cruising into [Winslow](#), thanks to the new custom-designed singing road installed as part of the Route 66 centennial celebration in 2026. The city of Winslow, with the help of ROADTUNES, installed a synthetic asphalt material that, when driven over at the exact speed of 35 miles per hour, will make the tires vibrate and create the tune of a verse in the song "Take it Easy" that mentions Winslow. Located on the east side of town near the 9/11 Memorial Park, drivers can roll down their windows and hear their tires play the catchy verse, "Standin' on a corner in Winslow, Arizona, such a fine sight to see," to kick off their visit before exploring Winslow's Standing on the Corner Park, Old Trails Museum and La Posada Hotel. Opened in September 2025.

Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn Reopens

Travelers in Northern Arizona can once again explore [Grand Canyon Caverns & Inn](#), located along Arizona's Historic Route 66 and home of the largest dry caverns in the U.S. The famous site reopened to visitors in June after extensive renovations. Visitors can descend 220 feet underground to tour the caverns, winding through the rock walls while learning about the cavern's history. After working up an appetite, visitors are encouraged to enjoy a meal at the [Crystal Restaurant](#), which is located directly inside the caverns. The property also has newly renovated accommodations, including a ranch house, cabins, a bunkhouse, standard rooms or a tent site. Visitors can also stay at the [on-site RV Park](#), which features bathhouses for roadtrippers to enjoy. The Caverns make a great stop when driving along Route 66 to celebrate its centennial in 2026. Reopened in September 2025.

Petrified Forest Museum Association's 'The Bend on 66' Opens in Holbrook

The Petrified Forest Museum Association recently opened ['The Bend on 66'](#), its new headquarters, educational outlet and store in downtown [Holbrook](#). The store offers a blend of park information, books and nostalgic collectible items. Designed to embody the classic retro flair of Route 66, the store serves as a great starting point for visitors to learn more about the Petrified Forest before visiting the park. Opened July 2025.

Embark on Tucson's New Sonoran Hot Dog Trail

Foodies can devour delicious Sonoran hot dogs all across [Tucson](#) by following Visit Tucson's new [Sonoran Dog Trail](#), a free, self-guided culinary tour showcasing this unique regional entree. A Sonoran dog is a bacon-wrapped hot dog tucked into a bolillo roll and topped with Southwestern ingredients, including salsa verde, pinto beans and jalapeños. Local stands and restaurants on the tour include [BK Tacos](#), [Percheron Mexican Grill](#) and the famous [El Güero Canelo](#), which offers a James Beard Award-winning version. Known as the home of America's Best Mexican Food, Tucson offers many culinary experiences as the first UNESCO City of Gastronomy in the United States. Offered to the public in Spring 2026.

Prescott's New Whiskey Trail Pass

Visitors can immerse themselves in the Western charm of [Prescott's](#) famous Whiskey Row with the new [Prescott Whiskey Trail](#), a free digital pass that showcases the best bars downtown. After downloading the pass, thirsty participants can explore 24 bars and saloons, each offering signature whiskeys or pints. At each stop, users check in by completing a custom trivia challenge or scavenger hunt-style riddle to earn points to unlock prizes and perks along the way. Download the pass [here](#). New Arizona Wild Bunch: Family Pass

Families traveling with kids can discover all of Arizona's best family-friendly activities with the new [Arizona Wild Bunch: Family Pass](#). Adaptive Mobility Vehicles Debut at Arizona State Parks

Paleontologists Name A New Species of Tanystropheid Reptile at Petrified Forest National Park

Paleontologists at [Petrified Forest National Park](#) named a new aquatic reptile whose fossils were discovered in the park. The Akidostropheus oligos, a tanystropheid reptile that lived in the Triassic period, was smaller than a pinky and had a long neck for its body size. In collaboration with the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History, the Petrified Forest named the reptile after its distinct appearance, with Akidostropheus oligos meaning "tiny spiked back bone," referring to its distinctively small neck vertebra with a unique spike on top. The fossils were found in the "Thunderstorm Ridge" area of the park by collecting rocks, rinsing the rocks with water through a fine metal screen and looking at the sediments under a microscope to find the microfossils of the Akidostropheus oligos.
