If anyone is inclined to be contentious, we have no such practice, nor do the churches of God. - 1 Corinthians 11:16

I. TO COVER OR NOT TO COVER

- Paul opens this new thought in his letter with a commendation. The Corinthians are holding to apostolic teaching.
- The head of every man is Christ, the head of the wife is her husband, the head of Christ is God. Man is the glory of God, woman is the glory of man. Woman came from man (originally). Man was not created for woman, but woman for man (Vss. 3, 7-8, Gen. 2:21-23).
- In Corinthian culture (likely all Christian culture in Paul's day), women who prayed or prophesied with uncovered heads brought shame upon themselves and their husbands. Men who prayed or prophesied with a covered head dishonored themselves and God.
- Husbands exercise headship over their wives. Wives submit to husbands. Nevertheless, neither is independent of the other. God is the ultimate source of life (Vss. 7, 11; Col. 3:18; Eph. 5:22-33).
- Again, Paul appeals to the Corinthians' intelligence and ability to think. "Judge for yourselves," he says. What does your culture teach you? (Vs. 13-14; 1 Cor. 10:15).

II. TAKEAWAYS

- There are some biblical passages that remain somewhat opaque to us.
- Paul is clearly mixing theology here with cultural expressions and norms.
- Women in Corinth were to wear a head covering when praying or prophesying publicly. Men were not to cover their heads.
- As a general principle, women are not to make themselves masculine, men are not to make themselves effeminate.
- These practices were not salvific.
