I. BE INFORMED

- Be informed about spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 12:1).
- Test "spiritual experiences" in light of Scripture (1 Cor. 12:2-3; Acts 17:11).

II. UNITY WITHIN DIVERSITY OF GIFTS

- Different gifts come from the same Spirit (1 Cor. 12:4).
- The same gift can be used in different ways (1 Cor. 12:5).
- All gifts are empowered by the same God (1 Cor. 12:6).
- Every believer has a spiritual gift (1 Cor. 12:7).
- All gifts are important to the church (1 Cor. 12:7).
- Spiritual gifts are to be used for the common good (1 Cor. 12:7; 1 Peter 4:10).
- God is not giving new revelation today (Jude 1:3; Rev. 22:18).
- There are differing opinions concerning spiritual gifts (1 Cor. 12:8-10).

III. GOD IS SOVEREIGN OVER SPIRITUAL GIFTS

- God decides who gets what gifts (1 Cor. 12:11).
- There is no room for jealousy or envy concerning spiritual gifts.
- Rejoice in the Giver of gifts and not only the gifts (Luke 10:17-20).

DO: Use your spiritual gifts to serve God and people for God's glory.
