I. GOD’S GRACE IN MARY’S LIFE

- God chose Mary to be the God-bearer - *Theotokos* (Luke 1:26-38; 43).
- God looked on her “humble estate” (Luke 1:48).
- God confirmed his plan to both her and Joseph, her betrothed, via angelic visits (Matt. 1:18-25).
- God will pour out his grace upon Mary, for she is “highly favored” (Luke 1:28).
- Further confirmation and a prophetic word concerning her son (Luke 2:22-38).

II. GOD’S PURPOSE IN MARY’S LIFE

- To bring forth the Savior of the world, who will do at least six things to accomplish his mission:
 1. He will be called Jesus - “He saves” (Luke 1:31).
 2. He will be great (Luke 1:32).
 3. He will be called Son of the Most High (Luke 1:32).
 4. He will receive the throne of David (Luke 1:32).
 5. He will reign forever (Luke 1:33).
 6. There will be no end to his kingdom (Luke 1:33).

III. GOD’S GREATEST GIFT TO MARY

- Salvation through her earthly son, and God’s eternal Son, and a place in the community of believers (Acts 1:12-14).
- Mary has received honor, and in some instances, worship, in this world. It pales in comparison to what she experiences now (1 Cor. 13:12; Phil. 3:7-11).

KNOW: Mary was a humble servant of the Lord. In response, the Lord blessed her more than any woman has ever been blessed. She was given the honor of bearing the Christ child. She bore Jesus in the flesh, and Jesus saved her soul in return.

DO: Choose Jesus over a name in this world.
