#### THE BIBLE

#### **God Wrote a Book**

The Bible is God's Word to all people. It was written by human authors under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. Because it was inspired by God, the Bible is truth without any mixture of error and is completely relevant to our daily lives. Its authority is final and eternal.

#### **TRINITY**

#### **God: Three in One**

God has existed in relationship with himself for all eternity. He exists as one being in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Although each member of the Trinity serves different functions, they each possess equal power and authority.

# God Is Great, God Is Good

God is great: He is all powerful, all knowing, ever present, unchanging, completely worthy of our trust, and above all, holy. It is in Him that we live, move, and exist. God is good: He is our Father. He is loving, compassionate, and faithful to His people and His promises.

#### THE SON

#### **God Became Man**

Jesus Christ always existed as God the Son. In the beginning, He was with the Father and the Holy Spirit, and all things were made through Him. He was born of a virgin and is completely human, but at the same time, completely God. He is the only plan for bringing people who are separated from God back into a right relationship with God. He lived a perfect life, so that He could be a substitution for us in satisfying God's demands for perfection. He defeated death in His resurrection so that we could have life.

#### God In Us

The Holy Spirit is God. He is coequal to and has always existed with God the Father and Jesus, God the Son. He is present in this world to convict non-Christian people of their sin and need for Jesus. He lives inside of every Christian from the moment they accept Christ. He is in us to provide the power to conquer sin, walk through and overcome the trials of this life, produce fruit, serve God, understand the Bible, guide us, change us from the inside out, and help us in a myriad of other ways. He will baptize any Christian who so desires, releasing the fullness of the Spirit in them which produces gifts of the Holy Spirit.

# **God's Image Bearers**

Man is made in the image of God and is the supreme object of His creation. Man was created to have fellowship with God, but became separated in that relationship through sinful disobedience. As a result, man cannot attain a right relationship with God through his own effort. Every human personality is uniquely created, possesses dignity, and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

# **SALVATION**

# God's Only Way

The blood of Jesus Christ, shed on the cross, provides the only way of salvation through the forgiveness of sin. Salvation occurs when people place their life in the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ as sufficient payment for their sin. Salvation is a gift from God and it cannot be earned through our own efforts. There is no other way to heaven but through placing faith in and calling on Jesus.

# **An Outward Display**

Jesus commanded all believers to be water baptized. Water baptism is an outward sign of your inward commitment to follow Jesus. It is a symbol of the miracle God did inside of you when you accepted Christ. We baptize people in the name of Jesus in whom the fullness of the Godhead dwells bodily – the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Church is a local community of baptized believers unified through faith in Christ.
