## **Pre-show checklist** for hosts



Get ready for the recording	
	Have Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge browser installed and updated
	Restart your computer and only open what is needed for recording (i.e.: Chrome and any notes you might need)
	Have your equipment ready and tested
	Turn off alerts on your phone and computer. If your phone is set to vibrate, move it away from where you're recording - those vibrations get picked up during the recording
	Close any open windows
	If you have any pets or family in the house, close the door
	If possible, turn off your HVAC system. Ceiling fans can be left on if set on the low setting and there is no audible clicking
Sound check with guest(s):	
	Are you hearing the right mic? If they are using something other than the built-in mic on their device, have them do a scratch test
	Check the mic position and guide them to get it in the right position
	Check their volume
	Is the meter showing green and spending most of its time in the middle of the bar or a little higher when they're speaking?
	Is it low? Walk them through the process to increase their volume
	Is the guest using wired earbuds?
	Ask them to hold the cable in their hand an inch or two away from their body to prevent it from rustling across their clothing as they speak
	If they have a beard, ask them to hold it further away if the mic is rubbing against the beard
	If they have long hair, ask them to tie it back to prevent it from rustling over the mic
	Turn off alerts on guest's phone or computer. If their phone is set to vibrate, have them move it away from where they're recording - those vibrations get picked up during recording
	Close any open windows
	If they have any pets or family in the house, have them close the door
	If possible, have them turn off their HVAC system. Ceiling fans can be left on if set on the low setting and there is no audible clicking

## **General recording notes:**

- Rebooting your computer will preemptively solve most technical issues that could cause problems with your recording
- Headphones improve the quality of your recording considerably. Please use them if you have them available to you and your guest
- Find a quiet space to record in
- Microphones aren't smart and will record all of the noises around you: HVAC, fans, TV, noisy neighbors, children, pets, etc.
- Airpods and similar Bluetooth devices are not good sounding. If you have the wired earbuds that came with a phone, please use those instead
