

YouTube Video Creation – Best Practices

Pro tips to save time, improve quality, and stay consistent

Whether you're using AI tools or editing from scratch, follow these best practices to create professional-quality YouTube videos with less effort.

Audio & Script

- · Keep videos under 5 minutes for stronger engagement
- Use a consistent voice style and pacing throughout
- · Always save a **clean copy of your script** in your project folder
- · Record audio after script is final to avoid redos

Visual & Layout

- Stick to 1 font family and a few brand colors
- Use the same intro/outro animation across videos
- Add clear titles for each section (scene, tip, or step)
- · Use high-quality B-roll or images that reinforce what you're saying
- · Keep text big, bold, and easy to read on mobile

Editing Flow

- · Set project to 1920x1080, 30fps, light gray background
- · Keep tracks organized: audio on bottom, visuals above
- · Use **behaviors or animations** to guide the viewer's attention
- · Zoom in/out on the timeline for precise control
- Use **simple transitions** avoid gimmicky effects



Project Organization

· Create a main folder with these subfolders:

/Script — Your prompts and final script

/Audio — Voice tracks

/Visuals — Images, B-roll, icons

/Assets — Music, transitions, extras

/Exports — Final MP4s

/ Before You Export

- · Watch it **start to finish** fix sync or timing issues
- · Check for typos in titles and on-screen text
- · Make sure every visual matches the voice
- · Thumbnail: 1280x720px, clear title, consistent style
- · Keep file size reasonable **H.264 at 1080p** is ideal

💡 Final Tip

If you ever get stuck, don't guess — ask ChatGPT. Use it to fix text, check pacing, or walk you through a step.
