The Catholic Funeral Rite is a very simple, and yet profound Ceremony.					
The Funeral Rite itself basically consists of four very distinct parts: -					
 The Introductory Rites The Liturgy of the Word The Liturgy of the Eucharist (if a Requiem Mass) The Final Commendation 					
The Introductory Rites is where your coffin is blessed with Holy Water and the White Pall (reminder of Baptism) is placed over the coffin. The Easter Candle is lit (reminder of Christ's Resurrection and victory over death), before praying the Opening Prayer. There is nothing to be chosen in this part.					
The Liturgy of the Word takes place after the Opening Prayer. You will need to choose a First Reading, a Psalm (which may be read or sung), a Second Reading (optional) and a Gospel. At the conclusion of the Gospel, there is a Homily concentrating on ou faith in the Resurrection, and can also touch on your life. This is delivered by the celebrant or concelebrant.

If you choose to have a Requiem Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist will now be celebrated.					
Then, the final part of the Funeral Rite takes place.					
The Final Prayers of Commendation are the Church's prayers for the dead, and use of incense (to honour your body, and that our prayers might rise like the incense). We pray God will forgive sins and welcome you into paradise. Once again, there is nothing to choose for this section.					
<u>Music</u> : It is quite fitting to have music at your Funeral. For a Church service, suitable religious Hymns or songs are recommended to be used.
