Fee Free Eligibility

The WA State Government, through Jobs and Skills WA, subsidises vocational education and training (VET) courses in priority areas, to reduce or remove the fees to make training more accessible to all Western Australians.

- Have a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Primarily reside in Western Australia
- Be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia or hold an approved visa subclass
