- Weatherize Buildings: Seal windows and doors, insulate attics and basements. These small upgrades can make a big difference.
- **Electrify Everything:** Replace any appliances or equipment that burn fossil fuels with their electric counterparts.
- Upgrade Heating & Cooling Systems: Replace old systems with heat pumps or other energy-efficient solutions.

- Install Solar Panels: Look into community solar, rooftop panels, or power purchase agreements. Solar saves money and reduces emissions.
- Tend to Your Grounds: Plant native, drought-tolerant species. Remove turf. Reduce irrigation. Consider adding pollinator gardens.
- 8 Host a Carbon Fast: Invite your congregation to participate in a month-long journey of reducing personal and collective carbon use.
- **Educate & Preach:** Include Creation care in sermons, classes, and spiritual practices. Help people connect faith and climate action.
