Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Hornung Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and some requirements of state laws. Our staff is available to help you understand this information. Please contact Mr. Jack Yates, Principal for assistance.

For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the "Every Student Succeeds Act" (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2024-25. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2024-25. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. These reports contain the following information:

Key challenges we continue to face are the staffing shortages in all positions. We offer several supports throughout the building and finding qualified applicants to fill and remain in the positions are obstacles we face daily. Hornung Elementary, in conjunction with all other buildings in the district, are working to strengthen our MTSS to meet the needs of all or our students, through our RTLC processes. Hornung has strived to meet the wellness needs of our students through our counselor and *Huddles* (a school-based program to connect each student with staff). Additional supports include an Instructional Coach and grade and content level Curriculum Coordinators. We continue to review our

curriculum and resources to best meet the ever-changing individualized needs of learners.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

- Students are assigned to the school in their attendance area where they live. As part of state law, the district participates in the Schools of Choice (SOC) program for non-resident families. Students admitted to the district through SOC are assigned to various schools on a space-available basis.
- Hornung Elementary uses an ongoing continuous improvement process (MICIP). We collaboratively work together to evaluate current goals, establish new goals, and improve the school's performance through student proficiency and growth. Hornung is focused on improving and providing a tiered instruction to meet the needs of all of our learners.
- Hornung Elementary is not a "Specialty School."
- Our curriculum meets or exceeds the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) grade level benchmarks and Michigan Academic Standards. Curriculum committees composed of teachers and administrators, work to align and update content at the district level and ensure it is aligned with state standards. Curriculum is accessible at your child's school, or MDE provides information about the academic standards that parents may find helpful at [Michigan Academic Standards](#).
- Data in Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies from the state's M-STEP and MME tests may be found at [Mischooldata.org](#) in the AER Combined Report. In addition, Brighton Area Schools assesses students in grades kindergarten through second in reading and math using DIBELS and Delta Math. In grades 3 and 4, we assess in math and reading using MAP NWEA.
- Parent-Teacher Conferences are held in the fall and spring. This is an opportunity for parents and teachers to communicate regarding each student's needs. Fall Parent-Teacher Conferences (percent of attendance):
 - Fall 2023 = 97%
 - Fall 2024 = 98%
 - Fall 2025 = 98%

Hornung Elementary continues to be proud of our great students, strong families and amazing staff. Brighton is committed to continuous improvement and focuses on giving our young people the skills to grow, explore, and apply while embracing innovation and striving for personal best. In addition, Hornung Elementary has earned the status of *Unified Champion School* from the Michigan Special Olympics. Coupled with the "*Peer to Peer*" program, these incredible initiatives helps *all students* feel a sense of belonging, because it teaches treating everyone with kindness.
