THE MAGNIFICENT A380

For anyone who loves flying, this is [one of those unforgettable experiences of a lifetime](#). I've flown on the A380 — the largest passenger aircraft in the world — a bunch of times, and let me say, it's a *real* treat. Flying isn't always enjoyable, but on the luxurious A380 it's practically guaranteed to be interesting, and particularly so with Emirates First Class complete with showers on board.



THE PREMIUM A380 SEAT

At the time of publication, Emirates has reintroduced the A380 on their New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Washington, DC, routes. The Emirates First Class suite is one of the best First Class suites in the air. The shoulder-high enclosed compartment offers sliding doors for a very comfortable, private experience. Depending on the specific aircraft and route, the number of suites ranges from 8 to 14, in a 1x2x1 configuration.

Each suite has an 80.5"-long lie-flat seat, a personal mini-bar, vanity table, mirror, wardrobe, and a 27" monitor for entertainment viewing. And to top it all off, A380 suite passengers also get to use the in-flight Shower Spas. [You can take a closer look at the experience here.](#)



NO EMIRATES MILES? NO PROBLEM.

Getting Emirates miles is relatively simple. They're a point transfer partner with three credit card reward programs — Amex, Chase, and Marriott — so it's a breeze to transfer points over. Our research shows that transfer times from Amex and Chase are nearly instantaneous, while Marriott points can take up to three days.

NO POINTS? NO PROBLEM.

You can buy up to 500,000 Amex Rewards points per year for just 2.5 cents each. Given that the baseline First Class fare from San Francisco to Dubai is \$26,300, and you can buy 247,500 Amex Rewards Points for \$6,187, and add in taxes with the Emirates loyalty program for ~\$400, you **save \$19,713** — that's 75% off.

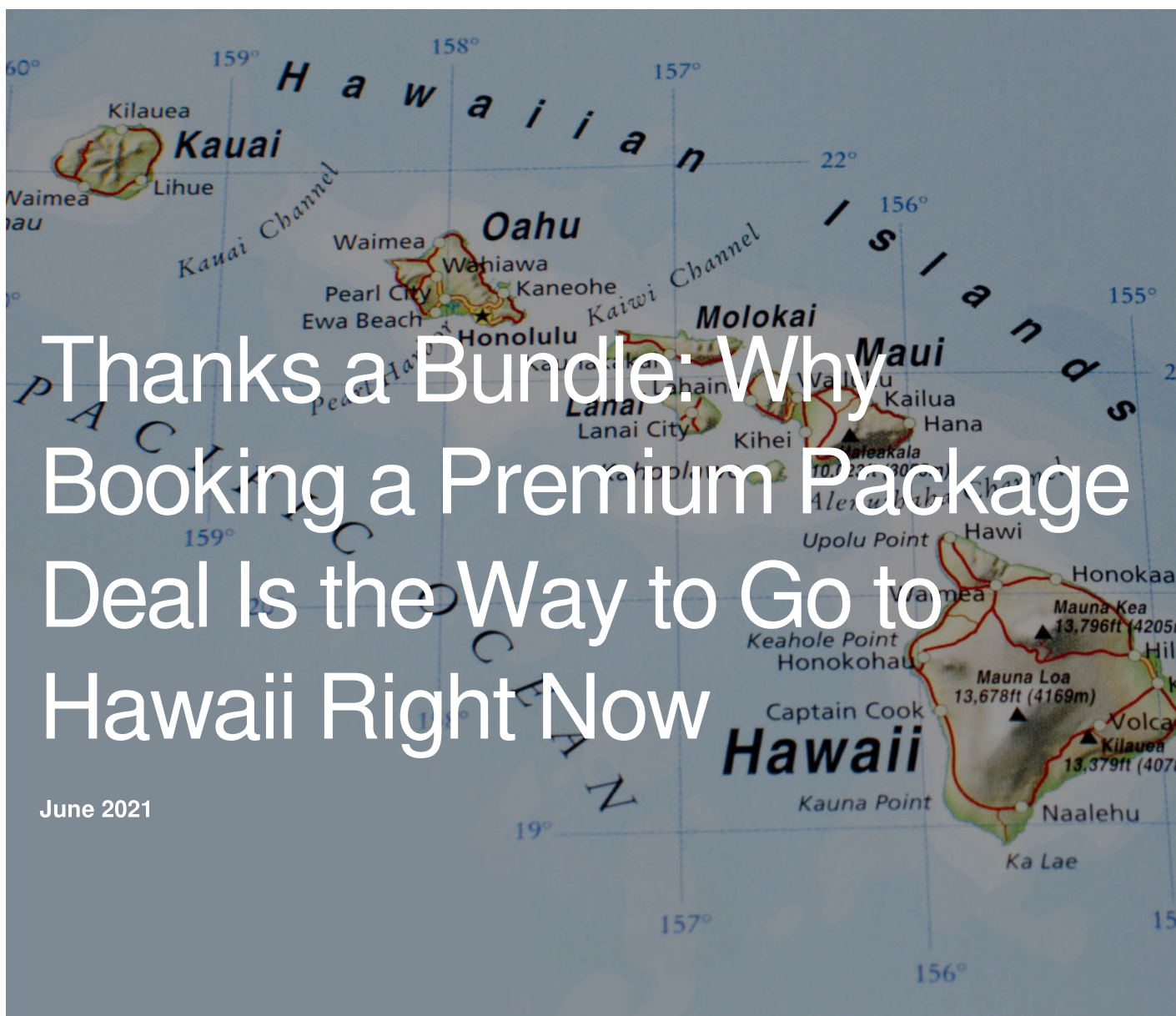

USE EMIRATES FOR OPPORTUNITIES TO DUBAI AND BEYOND

The airline offers flights to bucket list destinations all over the globe like Tanzania; Mauritius; Cape Town, South Africa; and Nairobi, Kenya, just to name a few.



Separation anxiety: Why you might package up that Hawaii trip rather than book your airfare and price-gouging hotel separately

With lockdowns getting behind many of us, here's a place for you to go: sunny Hawaii. And to add some ice to the Mai Tai, we've found package deals that will save you between 28% and 49% versus booking the flights and accommodation separately.

THE DYNAMICS

You're not the only one thinking about Hawaii, however, and that means **hotels are charging up to 50% more than normal** given the limited supply and pent-up-demand-busting limited supply when booking directly.

One reason air and land packages are able to offer this level of discounting is because their contract rates don't fluctuate mid-contract as circumstances do on the ground, especially when so many places are opening up and fast. This is all while airlines are ramping up more and more (not limited) flights by the day. In other words, it's the opposite of the [gouging coming from airlines on flights to Europe](#).

The example deals we'll highlight today look at seven-night packages with premium class round-trip fares and four- and five-star hotels. Just the refreshing break you need after the roller coaster that was 2020. The packages feature nonstop flights from the mainland to Hawaii in Business/First Class on American, Delta, and United. Bookings are made through American Vacations, Delta Vacations, United Vacations, and Orbitz.

PACKAGING VERSUS SEPARATING: THE DIFFERENCE IN \$ IS BIG

Here's where the coconut hits the coral. If you were to fly from Chicago to Maui and back, you'd pay \$5,608 in Business/First Class on United. And don't forget the accommodation on top of that. Fairmont Kea Lani Hotel is gorgeous but it costs \$15,342 for those seven days. Altogether you're paying \$20,950 for two travelers. (Packages usually work best for more than one traveler.)

Compare that cost to the package deal we spotted with United Vacations for \$11,459 for the exact same getaway. That's \$9,491 (45%) in savings.

SEPARATION ANXIETY EXAMPLE #2

Let's say you need a Kona minibreak. A Los Angeles-Kona trip in Business/First Class sets you back \$1,976 on Delta. A seven-night stay at the Fairmont Orchid costs \$4,498, making the total cost for the trip (aside from your massages) \$6,474. Go with a Delta Vacations package deal, on the other hand, and that same trip costs \$4,648, **a savings of \$1,826 (28%)**.

On Europe Gouge Routes, Wrap Yourself in a Package and Send It

How to save up to 43% on gouge fare routes to Europe on American, Delta, and United with air-and-land packages

While we're thankful that Europe is opening up, airlines are price-gouging on some routes. So we say, if you can't beat 'em, package 'em.

Our favorite airline, Delta (dripping with sarcasm here), has high fares across the board, while certain routes such as New York-Venice are gouge (think 2X to 3X more) opportunities for multiple airlines. You can also

find disproportionately high fares from cities like Savannah, Atlanta, and Miami to destinations like Athens and Rome. More on fare trends [here](#).

Package pricing, on the other hand, doesn't fluctuate like fares do. That's because the tour operators generally get flat-rate, year-long contracts that aren't renegotiated any time there's a lockdown, political situation, or anything else.

The tour operators typically negotiate with airlines and hotels and commit to high-volume buying in exchange for rates that are attractive to online and offline travel agencies and airline's leisure marketing units who then go on to sell the packages to their leisure travel customers.

When fares skyrocket as we're seeing now on a number of routes, package deals make for big wins for travelers in the know.




WRAP IT UP

We're talking seven-night packages with premium class round-trip airfares, staying at four- and five-star hotels. Just the refreshing break you need after all this lockdown nonsense. The packages also feature nonstop flights from the U.S. to Europe in Business Class on American, Delta, and United. Today's report covers bookings made through American Vacations, Delta Vacations, United Vacations, and Orbitz.

PUT A BOW ON IT

If you were to fly nonstop from Dallas to Rome and back, you'd pay \$10,027 in Business Class on American for two tickets. Then there's accommodations at the St. Regis Hotel, which is gorgeous, but it costs \$3,987 for those seven days. Altogether you're paying \$14,014.

Compare that cost to the package deal we spotted with AA Vacations for \$9,793 for the exact same trip. **That's \$4,221 (30%) in savings**, as evidenced in the following screenshot.

If you were to fly nonstop from Chicago to Zurich, you'd pay \$8,709 for two Business Class tickets in late August on United/Swiss, plus accommodations at the Kameha Grand Marriott's Autograph Collection, but it costs \$2,467 for seven days. Altogether you're looking at a hefty payment of \$11,176.

Now compare that to the package deal with Orbitz for \$6,408 **for (again) exactly the same trip. That's a savings of \$4,768 (43%).**

FCF's Europe Guide to Gouge- and No-Gouge Routes

June 2021

Strap yourself in for some scary price differences.

FCF's motto is to book while the booking is good. We *hate* telling you that you could have purchased flight X last month at half the price it is now. It's much better to stay ahead of the curve.

But we think it's always good to be reminded because it makes for better "upgrade mindset thinking" (where upgrade means flying cheaper and/or in more comfort).

Most leisure travelers book around 90 days in advance. But hey, guess when the fares are often through the roof? For travel 90 days out. To get you motivated to fly, airlines have lower fares 60 days out, higher for 90

days out, and if you are an advance planner, at 120 days out, they're just plain gouging, for those that feel the need to lock in very far in advance. Security is often costly. See more on that [here](#).

Ah, and the cost of loyalty. If you're locked into one airline, you have a high probability of *really* getting stung, and the airlines know it.

DELTA.COM CHARGES HALF PRICE FOR BUSINESS CLASS FLIGHTS ON VIRGIN. SAY WHAT?

Delta clearly thinks that flying on Delta's own aircraft is worth significantly more than flying on their partner Virgin Atlantic's aircraft. So Delta.com is selling seats on Delta flights for \$4,782 round-trip, and selling Virgin's flights for \$1,982 round-trip. Is the difference in product that much better?! Not really.

Jab or No Jab: Here's the Hot Caribbean Islands You Can Visit Right Now

June 2021

Some are making it even easier to enter if you've been vaccinated.

Ah, the Caribbean. Velvety trade winds rustling the palms. Bathtub-warm water lapping at your toes. Powdery-soft sand beneath your feet. And the soul-warming sun to lift your spirits. There's nothing quite like a Caribbean beach vacation to put the lockdown behind us. Indeed, there's no better time to reward yourself with a relaxing tropical escape.

The good news is that the Caribbean is wide open for business and the welcome mat is out for U.S. tourists everywhere. Even the French islands of Guadeloupe, Martinique, and St. Barts will open up on June 9 when France finally lifts its U.S. visitor restrictions. But while all the islands are eager to see American tourists again,

about half are making it even easier for those who have been fully vaccinated by waiving or reducing their testing and quarantine requirements.

TWO-TRACK ENTRY PROTOCOLS: VACCINATED AND UNVACCINATED

But it's complicated. To help you sift through all the entry complexities, we've identified which islands have adopted "two-track" arrival requirements for vaccinated and unvaccinated travelers. They are:

- Anguilla
- Bahamas
- Barbados
- Bermuda
- British Virgin Islands
- Cayman Islands
- Dominica
- Grenada
- Puerto Rico
- Saba
- Eustatius
- Kitts & Nevis
- Lucia
- Martin
- Vincent & the Grenadines
- S. Virgin Islands

Each one takes a somewhat different approach to how they welcome those who have been jabbed and those who haven't. The Bahamas, Cayman Islands, and Puerto Rico, for example, have waived Covid tests for vaccinated travelers to ease their entry, while the rest continue to require tests among other restrictions — even for those who have been inoculated. (See island-by-island requirements below.)

A few islands, meanwhile, are moving to accept *only* fully vaccinated travelers. Turks & Caicos started accepting only those who've been jabbed on May 29. St. Barts will start on June 9, and Anguilla, on July 1.

NEGATIVE COVID TESTS, APPROVED ACCOMMODATIONS, AND INSURANCE

Apart from the Dominican Republic, all the islands require proof of a negative Covid test prior to arrival (unless you've been vaccinated). But they vary widely in their other requirements.

Many, like Anguilla, Aruba, Barbados, the British Virgin Islands, Cuba, Dominica, Grenada, Jamaica, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent & the Grenadines, and Turks & Caicos, require visitors to stay only at Covid-approved lodging.

Islands like Aruba, Bahamas, British Virgins, Cuba, Curacao, Grenada, Saba, Sint Maarten, and Turks & Caicos require medical/travel insurance that covers Covid. And virtually all request some type of travel authorization to enter.

SOME COUNTRIES REQUIRE QUARANTINE, WHICH CAN BE AT AN OPULENT RESORT'S BEACH

Half of the islands oblige you to quarantine upon arrival unless you've been vaccinated. It can range from 24 hours to a whopping 14 days. This may seem like a huge deterrent to some. After all, who wants to be locked in for days after arriving in your tropical paradise. But you can quarantine in your resort and enjoy all the on-property dining and sports facilities — not to mention the lovely beach — until the quarantine ends. That may be worth it if it's just for a few days.

Still, if quarantining is just too much for you, consider islands that don't make it mandatory at all. They are:

HOTELS OFFER COVID TESTS FOR RETURN TO THE U.S.

Keep in mind that all passengers flying into the U.S. from the Caribbean (except from Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands) will need to provide proof of a negative Covid test received no more than 72 hours before boarding their flight.

But to facilitate this, many hotels in the Caribbean are now offering their guests pre-travel testing on site — some of them even for free. They include big chains like Marriott, Meliá, Sandals, Hyatt, Playa, and Karisma, as well as many individual hotels.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

We've pulled together all the complex entry requirements for every island. Here is what you need to know right now before you book your trip. But as you plan your visit, be sure to check your destination close to departure time as conditions are fluid and requirements can change quickly. (Note: All references to "vaccinated travelers" below refer to those who have received all required doses more than two weeks prior to travel.)

ANGUILLA

Vaccinations: Vaccinated travelers must submit proof of vaccination. Starting July 1, unvaccinated travelers will **not** be allowed to enter.

Covid test required: All travelers must submit a negative PCR test three to five days before travel and be tested upon arrival. Unvaccinated travelers must also be tested on Day 14 of their stay.

Quarantine required: Vaccinated travelers must quarantine for seven days, but unvaccinated travelers for 14 days.

Medical insurance required: No.

Travel authorization required: Travelers must apply for an official travel authorization certificate at least seven days prior to travel for a fee of \$300-\$400 per person, which covers two tests.

Covid-approved lodging required: Travelers must stay at a Safe Environment Certified Accommodation.

ANTIGUA & BARBUDA

Vaccinations: Not specified.

Covid test required: Travelers must submit proof of a negative PCR test taken within seven days of travel.

Covid-approved lodging required: Travelers must stay at a Certified Accommodation.

Quarantine required: No.

Medical insurance required: Insurance is included in the price of Bahamas Travel Health Visa.

Travel authorization required: A Bahamas Travel Health Visa is required.

Covid-approved lodging required: No.

BARBADOS

Vaccinations: Vaccinated travelers must submit proof of vaccination. Accepted vaccines are AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, Pfizer, and Sinopharm.

Covid test required: All travelers must submit a negative PCR test taken within three days prior to travel. Vaccinated travelers must also have a Covid test done upon arrival, and unvaccinated travelers must also have a test done five days after arrival.

Quarantine required: Vaccinated travelers must quarantine for one to two days, but unvaccinated travelers for five to seven days.

Medical insurance required: No.

Travel authorization required: Travelers must complete the online Immigration and Customs form 24 hours prior to arrival.

Covid-approved lodging required: Travelers must stay at an approved accommodation during their quarantine.

BERMUDA

Buy the Dip, Upgrade Your Trip

Want to trade up after you've bought your ticket? There's plenty of upsides as options explode with the elimination of change fees.

There are so many ways to improve your flying experience **after you've bought your ticket**.

Most people think of just one: "I got an upgrade!" But to me, "upgrade," like love, is a many-splendored thing.

And right now, given post-lockdown travel reality, your many splendors just increased. That's good news.

TAKE A DIP, THE TEMPERATURE'S PERFECT

Ever heard of the term, "[buy the dips](#)"? It refers to buying stocks when their price drops on the presumption they will subsequently rise much higher. Makes sense, right? Now think about travel.



What if you have a stock (let's call it a plane ticket), and you spot it now pricing for a lot less? You want that lower price, right? So you offload that first ticket with no penalty, and get the cheaper one. The airline will give you a credit.

You can't do that in the stock market, but now you can in travel.

That's because airlines have, for the most part, abandoned cancellation and change fees.

But a cheaper fare is just one of the ways to fly better.

THE AFTER-LIFE: THERE'S PLENTY OF UPSIDE EVEN AFTER YOU'VE BOUGHT YOUR TICKET.

Of course anyone can pay more to fly better—you just get a more expensive ticket, cabin, airline... But now you can do it *after* you've bought the ticket, **paying no more, or even less.**

You trade up your flying experience thanks to taking advantage of fare volatility or dips.

You could, for example, “trade up” your cabin... Find a new sale fare in Premium Economy to exchange your coach ticket; a new Business fare that's little more than the Premium Economy ticket you bought; or a First Class fare war surfaces to trade up from that no-deal Business Class fare you bought.

“Up” your destination. You wanted to go to Nice in France but found a much better price to Paris, and you're happy to take the train down to Nice. Trains are fun. But after some “dipping” now you find that Nice is about the same price as Paris. So scratch the otherwise fun train and go straight to Nice because fares dropped and there are no change fees.

“Up” your dates. You booked to fly in August but then spotted a drop in September options, which, as it turned out, suited you better anyway.

“Up” your routing. You spot a better airport option, closer to home or your destination. Think Munich or Zurich over Heathrow.

“Up” your stopover situation. You score a nonstop after a price drop instead of a one-stop or a one-stop instead of a two-stop.

Trade up. Trade up. Trade up. All these “ups” are enabled by the downs—AKA, fare dips.

All of these better options can become available after you purchase because fares are volatile and there's no fee to make changes in most cases.

Don't think of your ticket as the ending. Think of it as the beginning — the beginning of a beautiful “upgrade.”

IN TRAVEL, RISK IS EFFECTIVELY ELIMINATED. SO MAKE HAY AND FIND THE GOLDEN NEEDLES

Canceling or changing your ticket for free gives you a **new tool in your travel bag** because it opens up the possibility of free or low-cost upgrades more easily.

Above, we talked about ways to upgrade that didn't involve fares. Now let's get down and dirty with the dollars in familiar scenarios.

What if you bought a Business Class ticket for \$2,200, because First Class was \$3,000 at the time of purchase, but now First Class is \$2,400? That means you can upgrade your ticket to First Class for \$200 instead of \$800.

Or let's say you bought an economy ticket for \$1,000 because other people in your travel party were anxious to have their ticket in hand so they could book their cruise or hotel. Then you spot a premium economy fare sale that happens weeks later, and premium economy is now \$900. You can upgrade for what we affectionately call, in this case, "cheaper than free" — MORE value for LESS money.

Because there's no change fee now, you don't have to figure in fees which run \$200 to \$600+ depending on the type of ticket you originally bought. Oftentimes, you could get a **better ticket for less money**. Cheaper plus better. Those are my favorite kinds of upgrades.

AWARENESS. YOUR NEW FAVORITE MANTRA.

If you can change for no fee, just be aware of what your dream ticket would be, and monitor your dream ticket cost from time to time. Maybe you settled for Premium Economy or Business Class one-way only, or Business Class rather than First.

You won't get that dream ticket if you're not looking out for it.

Fares are volatile, but there are times that people book when fares aren't the lowest. That's OK because by practicing that awareness you can **flip your trip and buy on the dip**.

A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO THE AIRPORT

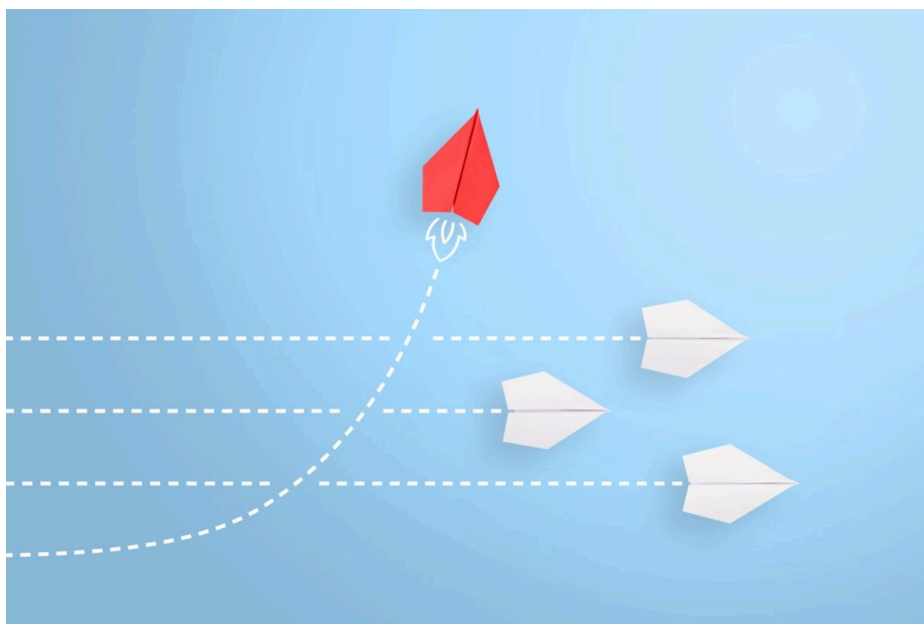

EMIRATES BUSINESS CLASS TO THE MALDIVES

FCF has found Business Class award availability on Emirates to the Maldives via Dubai from Chicago, New York, San Francisco, and Washington, DC. These international tickets would typically run you \$6,600 to \$11,000 if you bought a normal ticket.

GETTING EMIRATES MILES

No miles? No problem. Emirates is a point transfer partner with three credit card rewards programs — Amex, Chase, and Marriott — so you can easily get the miles you need. FCF research has found that the typical transfer time from Amex and Chase to Emirates miles is instantaneous (though this shouldn't be taken as a hard-and-fast rule), while a transfer from Marriott points can take up to three days.

You can buy up to 500,000 Amex Rewards points per year and they only cost 2.5¢ each. Given that the baseline Business Class fare from New York is often \$6,600 to \$11,000 to the Maldives and that you can buy 170,000 Amex Rewards Points for about \$4,250 and that taxes with the Emirates loyalty program cost about \$400, you'd end up saving up to \$6,350 or 58%.
