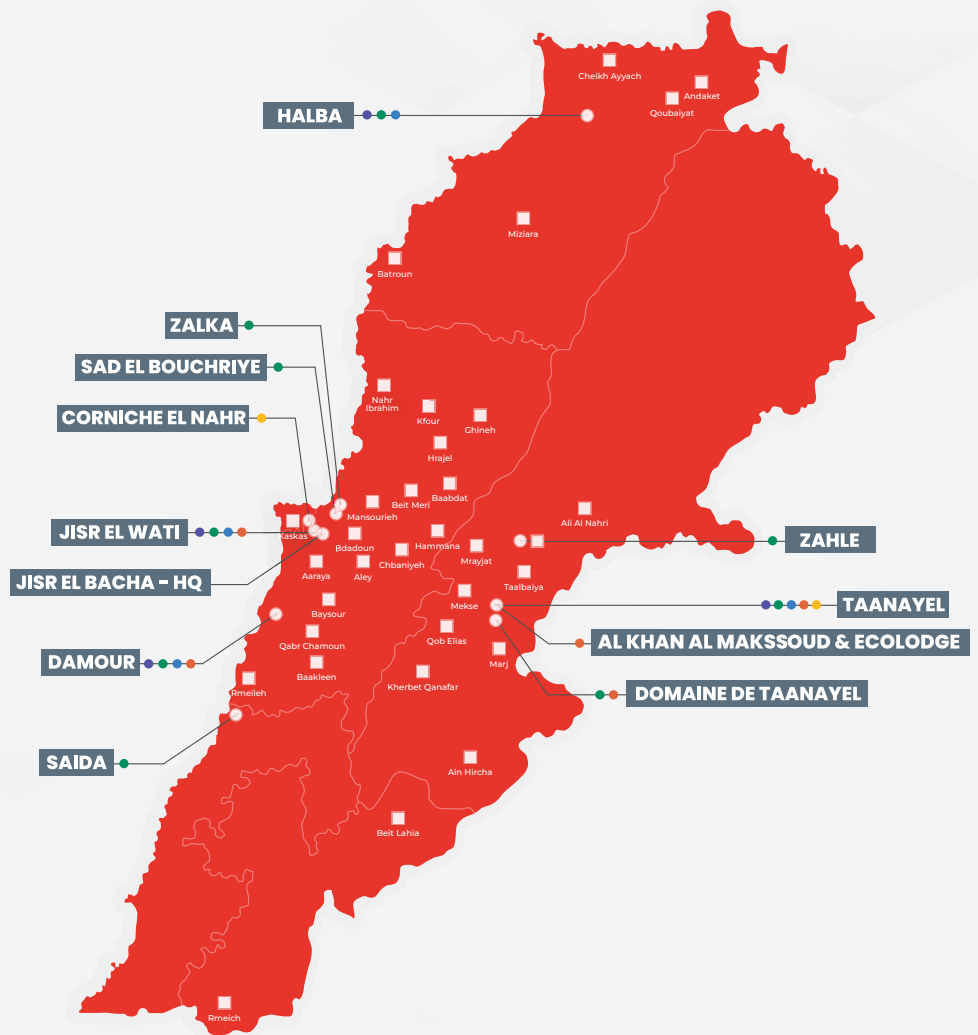

40 years ago, amid the Lebanese Civil War, arcenciel emerged from a simple yet powerful belief: that every person, regardless of ability or circumstance, deserves dignity, opportunity, and a place in society. Recognized as a public-interest NGO by Presidential Decree No. 7541, arcenciel operates nationwide in Lebanon. Rooted in inclusivity and sustainability, arcenciel works with and for the most vulnerable, fostering social inclusion and long-term development in a non-confessional and apolitical manner.

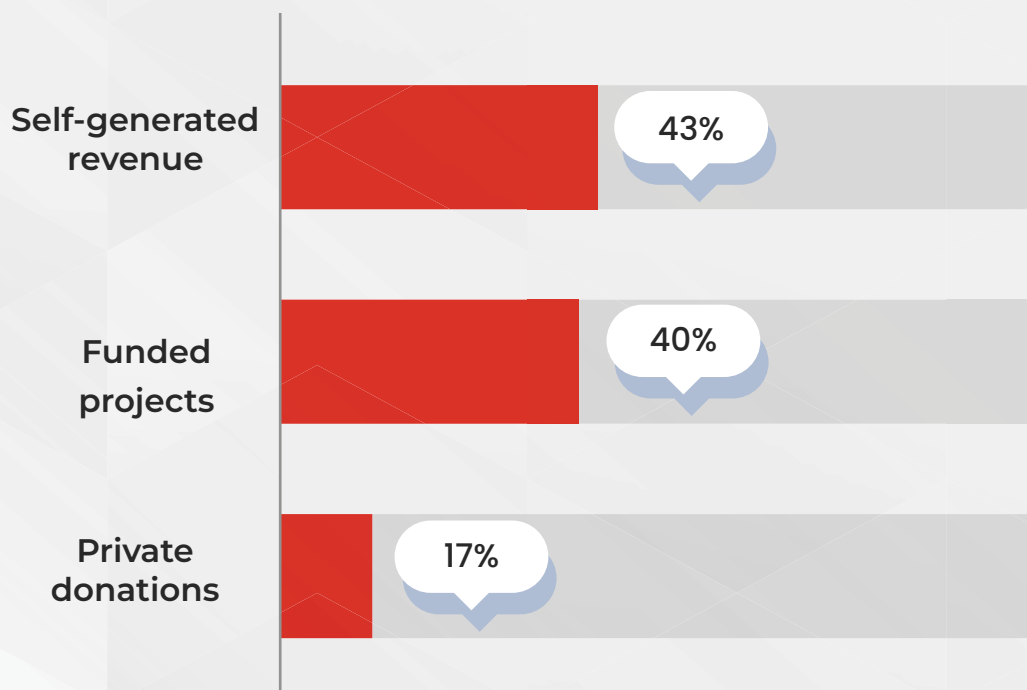

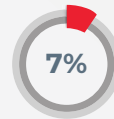

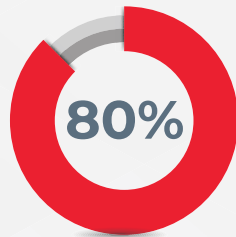

HIGHLIGHTS



Zalka Hub

In 2025, arcenciel reached an exciting milestone with the opening of its eco-hub in Zalka, a vibrant space that quickly became a symbol of sustainability and community empowerment. This dynamic hub brought together three of arcenciel's key environmental units under one roof, creating a powerful ecosystem of impact.

La Brocante gave a second life to donated furniture and household items, making them accessible at affordable prices, or even free to families in need. Just next door, Al Manchara, the organization's woodworking and upcycling unit, turned discarded materials into beautifully crafted, custom-made pieces, blending creativity with purpose through repair and reuse.

At the same time, the Déchets recyclables "DERE" sorting center played a crucial role behind the scenes, carefully sorting recyclable materials and preparing them for specialized processing. By the end of the year, plans were already underway to take this a step further, with arcenciel preparing to recycle these materials in-house marking the beginning of an even more sustainable chapter.

Cirquenciel

In November 2025, during the General Assembly meeting of the Caravan Network, Rose Abou Elias was elected as a board member in Caravan to represent Cirquenciel.

This new position on the board will be a new responsibility for Cirquenciel to contribute to the development of international circus community and contribute to the inclusion and support of circus schools from different cultures and countries.



Cirquenciel was invited by L'Institut de Tramayes and arcenciel france to support in bridging efforts with local communities, and to provide social circus trainings to persons living in disadvantaged and rural regions of Lyon and la Bourgogne in France.

HIGHLIGHTS

Aleph

In June 2025, arcenciel celebrated World Music Day at its Jisr el Wati center with a special performance by acclaimed Lebanese pianist Aleph, ambassador of arcenciel. His music filled the space, bringing the community together and creating a powerful moment of connection and shared emotion.

Following this memorable evening, Aleph carried that spirit beyond Lebanon, taking it with him on tour across the United States. Through his performances, he not only shared his music with new audiences but also raised awareness and support for arcenciel's mission.

Each concert gave people a chance to support a meaningful cause, helping fund arcenciel's work and assist communities across Lebanon.



First Lady Office Collaboration

In July, arcenciel had the honor of welcoming the First Lady of Lebanon to its Jisr el Wati center, marking a key moment in a growing collaboration.

This partnership has led to tangible progress in advancing disability inclusion, including accessibility improvements at the Presidential Palace and the recruitment of a person with disability as a Project Coordinator within the Office.

In parallel, arcenciel has become a key partner in the implementation of the School of Citizenship initiative, a national program led by the First Lady Office that aims to foster civic engagement across Lebanese schools.

Through this collaboration, arcenciel continues to contribute its operational expertise while supporting the long-term vision of building a more engaged and responsible generation.

HIGHLIGHTS



40 Years

As 2025 came to a close, arcenciel marked a meaningful milestone 40 years of commitment to supporting the most vulnerable and building a more inclusive and sustainable Lebanon. What began as a moment of reflection quickly turned into a season of celebration that extended across cities and communities.



The journey started in Lyon with Les Couleurs du Liban, a vibrant cultural evening that brought people together around dialogue, art, and shared experiences. Through discussions, a photo exhibition, Lebanese cuisine, and a live concert, the event celebrated the prosperity and resilience of Lebanese culture.



The celebrations continued in London, where guests gathered for a warm Lebanese evening filled with meaningful exchanges. Over dinner, stories of arcenciel's impact were shared, followed by moments of laughter and a festive lottery featuring products from its social enterprises.



In Paris, the anniversary took on a lively and artistic tone. The evening blended music, storytelling, and visual memories, including a concert, a special screening highlighting 40 years of impact, and the "arcenciel Heroes" exhibition offering a space to reconnect and celebrate the journey.



Barcelona brought a more intimate gathering, centered on reflection and purpose. The evening highlighted the "Access for All" initiative, sparking conversations around inclusion and equal opportunities, while bringing people together through shared values and experiences.

Back in Beirut, the celebration turned toward those who made it all possible: arcenciel's volunteers. In a heartfelt and joyful gathering, their unwavering dedication through years of challenges was honored. Alongside performances by Cirquenciel, arcenciel volunteers also took part in the celebration through their own artistic contributions, adding a deeply personal touch to the day. I am a former Lebanese army soldier. I was injured in 1989 and lived in Beit Chabab. We were a group of youths with no work, no purpose, and many problems. We decided to produce equipment to help other people. That idea became arcenciel.

arcenciel is like a school where you learn many things, like serving others before serving yourself. I've been here since 1990. I was a soldier who understood nothing, but little by little I became responsible for four workshops and for all manufacturing and people's technical needs. We work on studies to understand how we can improve further. arcenciel changed my life.

I've been with cirquenciel for more than eleven years. I joined arcenciel when I was a young student, and now I'm a teacher passing on to children everything. I learned the experience and the joy through circus games and performances.
