

Sunrise Echigo-Tsumari Tour - Echigo-Tsumari Art Field 1-Day Tour (Round Trip from Tokyo)

Experience plan details

1. This special 1-day tour with a National Government Licensed English Guide Interpreter takes customers to a satoyama (regions comprising arable flat lands near villages and mountain foothills) which serves as a setting for the Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale, one of the world's largest international art festivals.

2. Tunnel of Light (Kiyotsu Gorge Tunnel) by Ma Yansong/MAD Architects

This approximately 750-meter-long pedestrian tunnel in Kiyotsu Gorge, one of Japan's 3 great gorges, was reborn as the Tunnel of Light by Ma Yansong/MAD Architects in 2018. The stainless steel reflective material creates a fantastic view of the gorge, and the observation point at the end is a popular sightseeing spot where visitors can enjoy a beautiful kaleidoscope-like view of the scenery reflected on the basin at one's feet.

3. For Lots of Lost Windows by Utsumi Akiko

Using the surrounding landscape as a backdrop, this artwork of a window frame without glass standing on a small hill allows onlookers to appreciate the changing seasons of Echigo-Tsumari through curtains swaying in the wind. As the title "For Lots of Lost Windows" suggests, this artwork alludes to the windows that were shattered in the 2004 Chuetsu Earthquake, conveying memories and scenes of the earthquake that can only be told in this region.

4. The Last Class by Christian Boltanski+Jean Kalman

This Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale artwork by Christian Boltanski and Jean Kalman set in the former Higashikawa Elementary School expresses human absence. Heartbeats echoing in the darkness, countless flickering light bulbs, fans, images, straws, and other objects stimulate all the senses at this artwork that can be experienced with the whole body.

5. Matsudai NOHBUTAI Field Museum

With the building itself as an artwork, this facility designed by Dutch architect group MVRDV features works by Ilya and Emilia Kabakov, Yayoi Kusama, and other world-renowned artists scattered throughout the area. Enjoy the charm of colorful forms and contemporary art standing out against the backdrop of the satoyama scenery that changes with the season.

6. Museum on Echigo-Tsumari, MonET

This contemporary art museum opened after a renewal in 2021 as a base facility for the Echigo-Tsumari Art Triennale. The museum features an exhibition space that combines the natural environment of satoyama with contemporary art, and has permanent and planned exhibitions of works that make use of local culture and nature. Leandro Erlich's "Palimpsest: Pond of Sky," an iconic permanent exhibition, is a popular experiential installation that creates the illusion of being in water.

The menu lineup has about 20 kinds of local flavors and homemade dishes. - Drink charges are not included. - As lunch is a buffet, requests for vegetarian meals cannot be accommodated.
<p>[Important Notes/Supplements: What to Wear/Bring]</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Please wear shoes and clothing which are easy to walk in. - This tour involves walking outdoors. Please take measures against heat depending on the season. <p>Summer: Temperatures can reach up to 35°C. Please bring items that protect from the heat such as sunglasses, hat, parasol, neck cooler, etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - As there may be a lot of mosquitoes in June to August, please bring insect repellent. - In rainy weather, using a raincoat is recommended as it offers better visibility than an umbrella, won't break in strong winds, and keeps the hands free. - Large luggage such as suitcases cannot be brought during the tour.
