### Wyvern Day

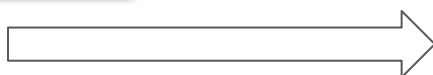


On 13th February, the whole school came together to celebrate Wyvern Day, inspired by our theme for the Royal Horticultural Society Spring Garden Show school garden.
