Impact on Client Safety

- Has the nominee significantly improved security safety for clients through their advice or strategies?
- Are there examples of reduced risks, successful audits, improved security plans, or code compliance outcomes?

Training & Professional Development

- Does they stay up to date with evolving codes, technologies, and fire science?
- Do they pursue CPD (Continuing Professional Development) and encourage knowledge sharing?

Client Satisfaction & Trust

- Are there strong endorsements or testimonials from clients?
- Do they maintain long-term relationships based on trust, professionalism, and performance?

***Legal proceedings**

If your company has been subject to any prosecution in relation to fire safety law or health and safety law since 1 January 2022, or has been subject to any enforcement notices, then your entry will automatically be disqualified

Essential tips for a successful entry

A successful application must try to address all of the points above. Marks will be allocated only on the evidence provided.

Use the headings shown to highlight your answers to those specific questions. Include information on your exceptional successes during the year such as systems, innovations or techniques that have reaped significant benefits.

Concentrate on facts that can be substantiated. Attachments can be included, which are particularly important for the judges to be able to see your successes or innovations.

Please remember that ONLY THE FIRST 2000 words of core information (and supporting material that you may have provided) of your submission will be assessed
