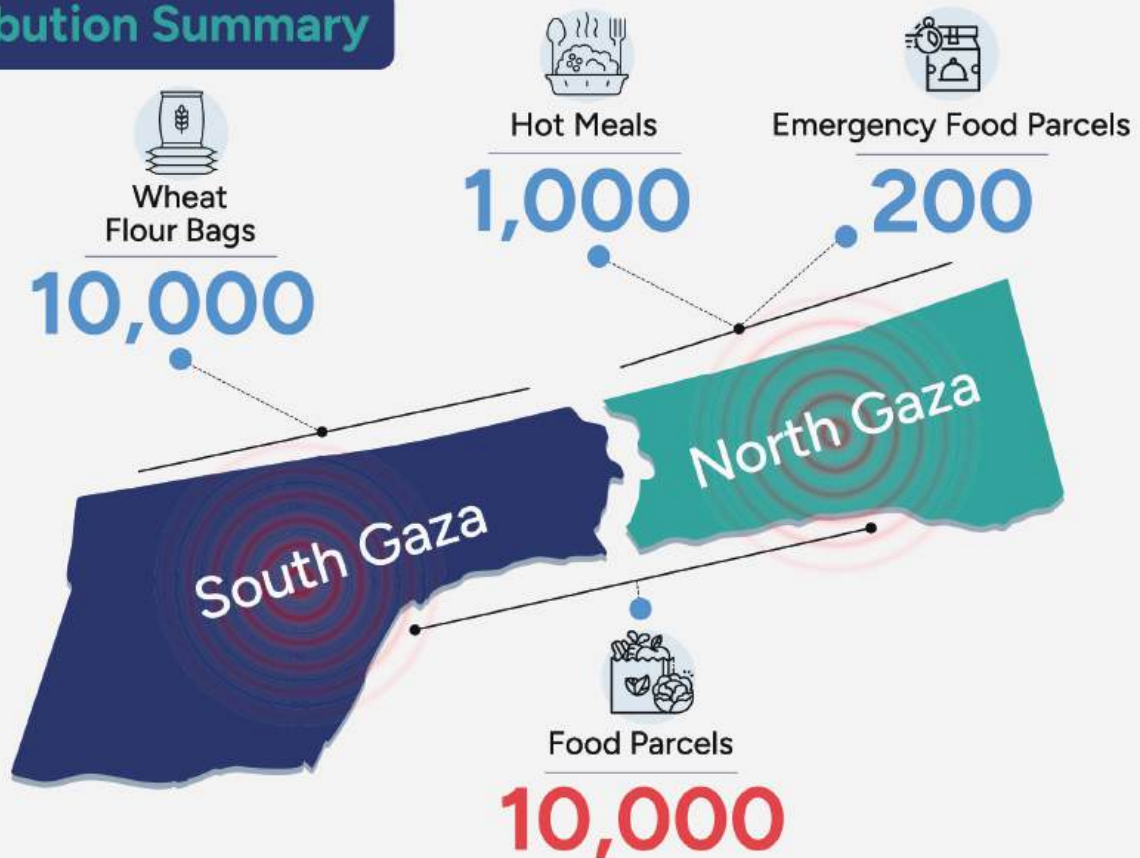

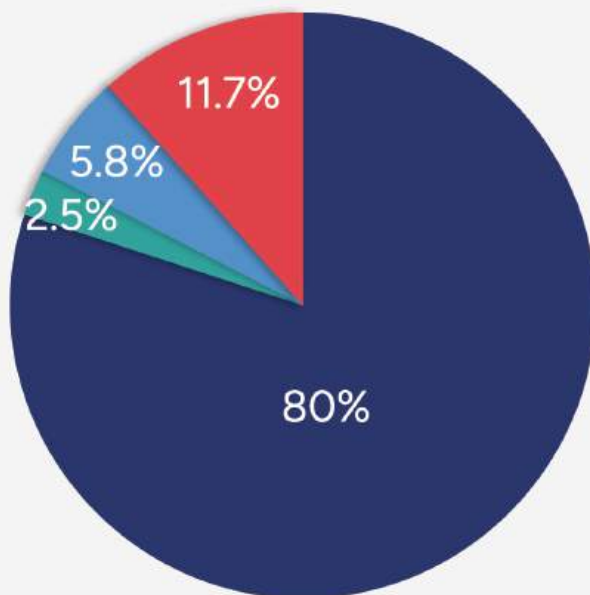

FAJR Global Financial Report

FAJR Global has achieved remarkable growth in its programs and successfully expanded the scope of its operations through the efficient allocation of financial resources. Between 2022 and 2025, the organization witnessed a significant transformation in its financial and administrative performance, which translated into positive outcomes and an increased impact on the communities it serves.

The organization recorded substantial growth in program funding aimed at improving the living conditions of target communities. In 2025 alone, more than \$2.8 million was allocated to program implementation. This increase in funding enabled FAJR Global to broaden its reach and serve a larger number of beneficiaries. Alongside this expansion, the organization achieved net revenues of \$1.9 million, reinforcing its financial sustainability and allowing it to channel additional resources into new initiatives or the expansion of existing ones.

Despite the considerable scale-up in programs and operations, FAJR Global maintained strong cost-efficiency. In 2025, administrative expenses accounted for just 6% of total revenues, a clear indicator of the organization's ability to dedicate the vast majority of its resources directly to programs and services that positively impact beneficiaries' lives. This reflects a high level of operational efficiency and a strong commitment to ensuring that funds are spent where they are most needed.

Even with expansion, administrative costs remained under strict control, never exceeding 10% of annual revenues. For example, in 2024, administrative expenses totaled \$318,504.90. While this represented a natural increase compared to previous years due to organizational growth, the figure remained proportionate to the overall scale of programs and activities.

Over the four-year period, FAJR Global generated a financial surplus exceeding \$8.5 million, establishing a strong reserve that positions the organization to fund future projects and further expand its services. This surplus also provides the flexibility to respond to emergencies or invest in new strategic initiatives.

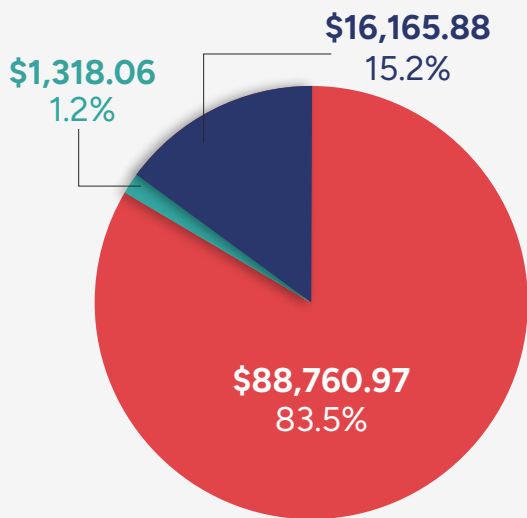

Program vs Overhead vs Net Revenue

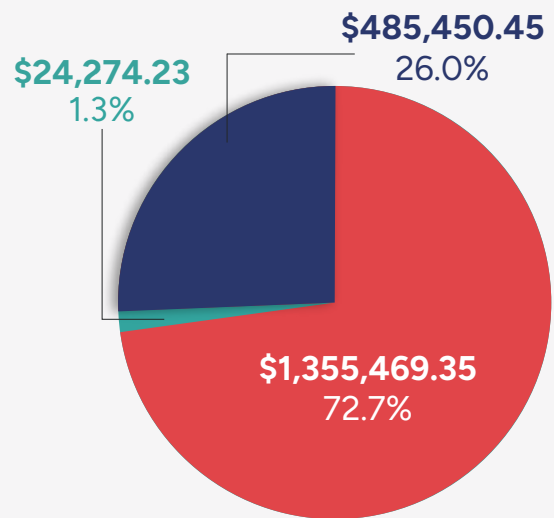

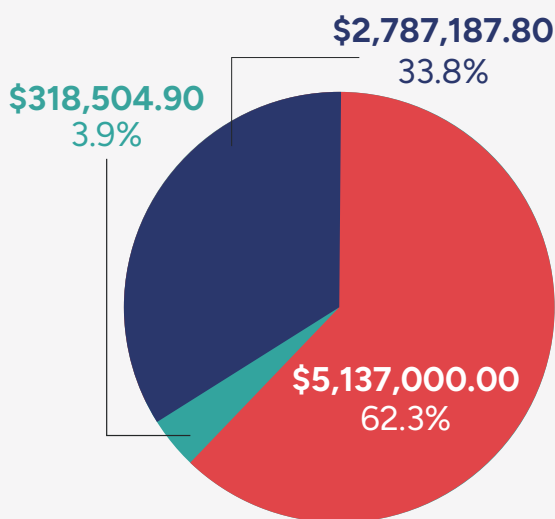
Programs Overhead Net Revenue

Financial Summary 2023



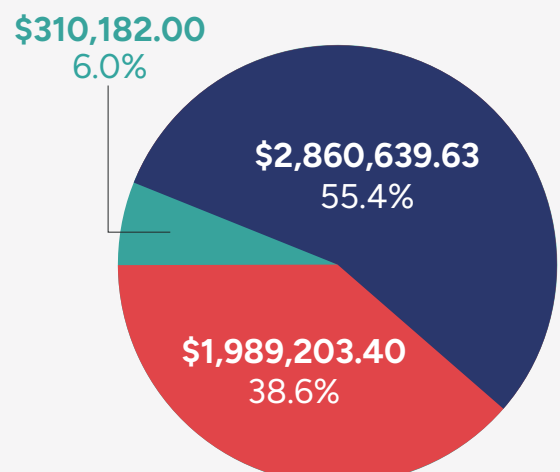
Programs Overhead Net Revenue

Financial Summary 2024



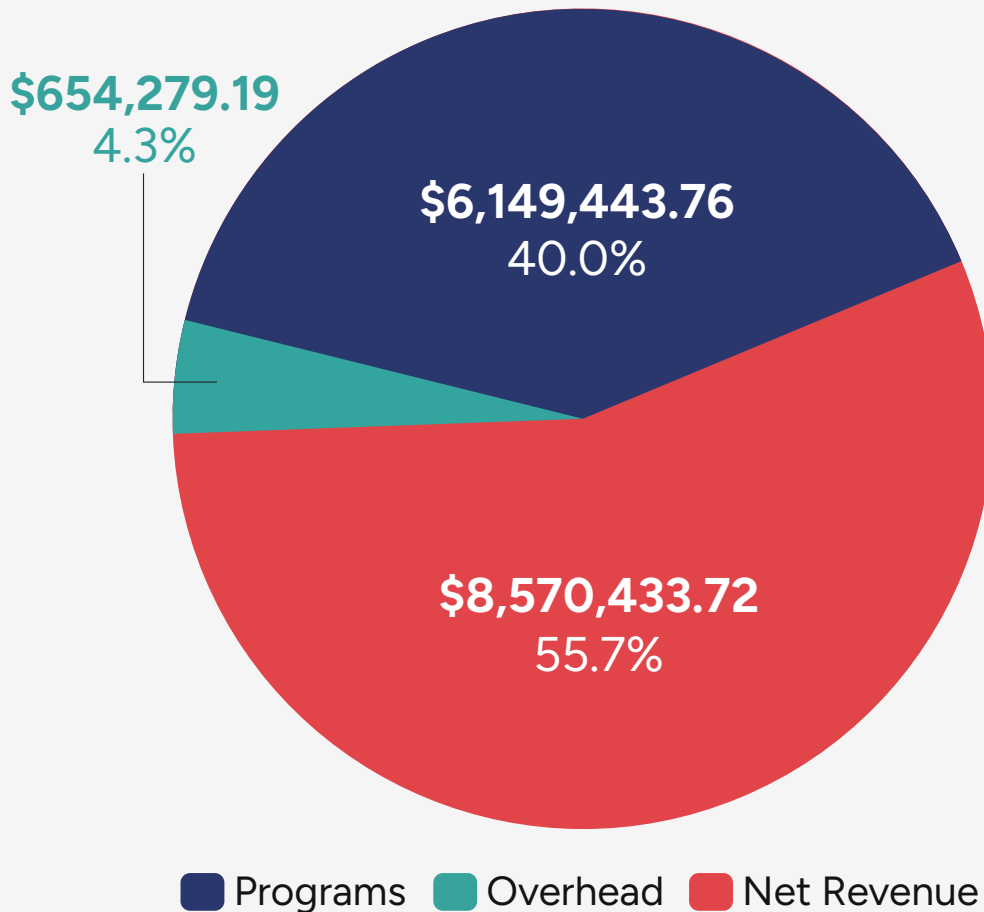
Programs Overhead Net Revenue
