This state-of-the-art facility, bringing together eight specialties into one advanced location, wasn't just built with bricks and mortar; it was built with belief.

Through the Love, Scarborough campaign and the generosity of donors, including a transformational gift from the Northpine Foundation, a vision that was 20 years in the making turned into a vibrant reality. No longer would patients navigate multiple locations for crucial diagnostic tests. Now, advanced technologies like Scarborough's first 3T MRI, and thoughtfully designed spaces including two interventional radiology suites, offer comfort, privacy, and timely diagnoses.

"Today, we are no longer imagining better care; we are witnessing the reality," shared Alicia Vandermeer, President & CEO of SHN Foundation, at the grand opening in February. This milestone is a powerful testament to the impact of community coming together. Because of our donors, the **850,000** people who rely on SHN now have access to exceptional diagnostic imaging, right here in Scarborough. Your belief has built more than just a

IMPACT UNLOCKED:

THE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTRE OPENS

The new Community Mental Health Centre began welcoming patients in June—a space made possible entirely thanks to donor support. Since opening, our team of psychiatrists, mental health specialists, and staff has had more than 20,000 visits to this easy-to-access, beautiful new centre, which consolidates our services under one roof to remove barriers to care and reduce stigma.

"We used to have a lot of small, less than ideal spaces where we would see patients. They were outdated and didn't always feel like the safest places to visit. They weren't that accessible," says Dr. Ilan Fischler, Chief of Psychiatry. "In the new centre, patients have access to everything they need in one place. They can receive psychiatric care. They can get medications through a pharmacy dispensary. And they can even get group or individual therapy, all right there."

More than 6,000 patients rely on SHN for life-saving hemodialysis each year—many spending 3–4 hours per visit, several times a week.

Thanks to donor support, we're expanding and modernizing our dialysis clinics to create calmer, more comfortable spaces for care:

- Building a new 22-bay dialysis clinic at Centenary to meet growing demand.
- Six new treatment stations at the General, including isolation units for vulnerable patients.
- Renovations throughout the General clinic to enhance patient and staff experience.

SUPPORTS WORLDCLASS CARE

In 2025, **Rodolfo and Elizabeth Ong** will celebrate their 48th wedding anniversary—a milestone that reflects a life built on love, hard work, and a deep commitment to community. Since immigrating to Canada from the Philippines in 1983 with four young children, they've called Scarborough home. Just six months after arriving, they launched APO Products Ltd./UNO Foods Inc. from Rodolfo's parents' kitchen, filling a gap in the availability of affordable Filipino and Asian foods. Today, it's Canada's largest distributor of its kind, serving over 1,000 retail partners nationwide.

Now, as proud members of SHN Foundation's Founders' Circle, an exclusive group of visionary donors to SHN, the Ong family is making history again, becoming **SHN's first transformational donors from the Filipino community.**Their extraordinary gift is advancing three of our most critical priorities: the new Northpine Diagnostic Imaging Department, the expansion of the Coronary Care Unit, and the development of a new inpatient mental health centre at Birchmount Hospital.

In 2024, **Dr. Ken Lee Choi** and his wife **Lisa Seeto** committed to a **landmark \$1** million donation to support medical education, one of the first endowment gifts to **SHN**. Their gift will establish two awards for incoming medical students from the University of Toronto Scarborough Campus' new medical school, who will train at the upcoming Scarborough Health Centre of Excellence at SHN. Support will begin for the inaugural cohort in 2027.

Believing that financial barriers shouldn't stop someone from becoming a doctor, the couple aims to support students from modest backgrounds. Dr. Lee Choi, a dermatologist who practiced nearly 40 years in Scarborough, also mentored future physicians. Lisa is a retired project management consultant who shares his passion for education.

After years of considering legacy giving, they chose to act now. "We wanted to see the fruits of our labour," says Dr. Lee Choi. Their gift reflects a deep commitment to mentorship, learning, and giving back.



LEAVING A LASTING LEGACY AT SHN

HOW SHN IS REDEFINING THE EMERGENCY EXPERIENCE

Emergency department (ED) wait times are a persistent issue across Ontario. But at SHN, that's changing—thanks to **AcceleratED Care.**

For Jessica* and her 18-yearold daughter, Maya*, past ED visits had been frustrating and exhausting.

On March 1, Maya finished work with an aching wrist. The pain from a growing cyst was unbearable. The two headed to SHN's Birchmount ED, bracing themselves for a long night.

"I hate going to the emergency department," Maya says. "The waiting, the uncertainty, being around sick people—it's always been really stressful."

Except this time, the experience was completely different.
Within 50 minutes, Maya was registered, triaged, assessed, referred for surgery, and discharged. "It was such a relief," says Jessica. "We were in and out so fast."

It was such a relief. We were in and out so fast.

This seamless experience was made possible by AcceleratED Care—SHN's innovative frontend model that quickly connects patients with nurses and doctors to start treatment sooner. The first of its kind in Canada, the model has drawn national attention. Other hospitals, including Nova Scotia Health, have visited SHN to explore adopting similar approaches.

Since launching the model in May 2023, SHN has improved first-hour physician assessments from 33% to 54%, even during peak months. In 2024, despite record-breaking ED volumes, SHN maintained reduced wait times.

Maya's story is one of many that reflect the program's impact. "It barely felt like an emergency room visit," she says.

Following Birchmount's success, the model launched at SHN's General Hospital in December 2024. Next, SHN will expand AcceleratED Care to the Northpine Emergency Department at Centenary Hospital after transforming the space to support the model.

"These improvements are only possible thanks to our incredible donors and partners," says Alicia Vandermeer, President & CEO, SHN Foundation.

THE ROAD TO BETTER EMERGENCY CARE HAS BEGUN



Thanks to the incredible generosity of our donors, pre-construction work is now underway at Centenary Hospital for the new Northpine Emergency Department (ED)—a key priority of the Love, Scarborough campaign. On December 2, 2024, crews began shifting Neilson Road (south of Ellesmere Rd.) to create a temporary roadway, the first major step toward building Canada's first ED to feature the AcceleratED Care experience.

This milestone marks the beginning of a multi-phased transformation that will significantly improve emergency care and reduce wait times for our community.

GIVING BACK

Last July, Nim Hing Yip went to the Emergency Department at the Birchmount Hospital with shortness of breath.

Within 10 days, he was diagnosed with lung cancer and had his first consultation with Dr. Victor Lo at Centenary Hospital. Dr. Victor Lo and his team have been there for him ever since.

"He has always gone the extra mile to ensure I receive the right treatment and ongoing support," he says. "He always communicates clearly about my condition and treatment plan. This has brought great comfort to me and my family."

Nim Hing says his team has been "so kind, patient, and helpful," singling out the many people in his office for their ongoing help, and to Jennifer, a nurse on the team. "We are deeply grateful for everything they have done for us during this challenging time."

Nim Hing and his family have made a donation in honour of the oncology team as part of our *With Gratitude* Program to recognize the compassionate and outstanding care he has had since receiving a life-changing diagnosis.



CREATING THE BEST ENVIRONMENT FOR MENTAL HEALTH CARE

Now that the new **Community Mental Health Centre** opened for adults and youth seeking treatment for mental illness, SHN has turned its attention to improving the inpatient experience. Plans are underway to create a calming environment at Birchmount Hospital for healing and recovery that provides a seamless transition between our in-hospital services and our wide array of outpatient services.



EXPANDING CARDIAC CARE AT SHN

SHN has a premier **Cardiac Care Program** across our health network, as the designated Cardiac Centre for the Scarborough–Durham region at our Centenary Hospital. From advanced cardiac procedures and diagnostics to rapid intervention to treat a severe heart attack, our teams are changing and saving lives. Now to continue meeting the needs of our growing community, plans are underway to build an **expanded, modern Coronary Care Unit** to meet the growing demand in caring for our sickest patients.



A HISTORIC REDEVELOPMENT OF THE BIRCHMOUNT HOSPITAL

This will be the largest redevelopment in our history. Our community of supporters is investing in **a new Birchmount Hospital** to better meet the growing needs of Scarborough. A new patient tower will be home to new surgical suites, areas for critical care, and more inpatient beds, along with a three-storey podium for an expanded Emergency Department.



INVESTING IN EDUCATION

With donor support, SHN will build the **Scarborough Health Centre of Excellence** to address the shortage of health professionals in this region. This facility will offer best-in-class education, combined with research and primary care to University of Toronto medical students and other learners. This dynamic environment will feature simulated environments for hands-on learning and training, a dedicated space for research, and a new Family Medicine Teaching Unit.
