Discover – age 6 months to 4 years

All children are natural explorers, they just need to be in a creative environment. Their cognition is developing faster than at any other time in their lives and at the Conservatoire we want to give our **Young Artists** and **Young Musicians** the freedom, opportunity, and imaginative space to explore in a supportive setting. Our Young Musicians and their parents [and carers] will discover a wonderfully revitalised programme with lots of exciting and rewarding new features.

Foundation – age 4 to 9/11 years

As our **Young Artists** and **Young Musicians** gain confidence, they are keen to pick up an instrument or paintbrush, and take their first independent steps, learning new skills. At the Conservatoire, we believe in the power of learning together as part of their musical and artistic **Foundation** – they learn by watching and listening to each other, as well as our expert teachers.

Specialism – 9 and beyond

With strong **foundations**, our **Young Musicians** are ready to move on to one-to-one lessons and develop their music theory and choral and ensemble skills. Our **Young Artists** can now choose areas in which they would like to **specialise** and they also have the option to continue in the more general Foundation classes up to age 11, which are designed to adapt to suit all of the ages covered in the class.

Not forgetting our Adults

Anyone who has been in our building will know that we are the home of lifelong learners. We know what it gives them – a boost to their mood, wellbeing and creativity, feeling a connection with others, achieving something in what can be a difficult world – and we hope they know what it gives us, a vibrant building where students and tutors thrive! From 9am to 9pm it feels like the building hums with the creativity of these adults still thinking *what if....?*

Individual Tuition

Discover

– the home of natural explorers

What is Discover?

In **Discover** classes, with our expert tutors guiding but standing back when needed, the children are **discovering** and creating, expressing feelings they may not be able to verbalise. As their minds explore and express, their bodies are responding: building up motor skills, developing hand-eye co-ordination and, as they make patterns (both musically and artistically), count and play with textures, shapes and sizes, beats and rhythms, and use tools and puppets; they are also making their first forays into the worlds of maths and science.

Discover Skills

Through art, music and imagination, they start to use language and express themselves through stories and word repetition. With their classmates they are learning to share, listen, problem-solve, take turns and help each other. With their parent or carer, they are strengthening that bond in a new way. And parents are creating too! Together, the groups build a sense of community.

Young Musicians

In our music classes, through stories, song and percussion, our Young Musicians [and the parents or carer who accompanies them] explore tempo, pitch and rhythm. Our new programme draws upon well-established music pedagogies together with our Team Lead's own experiences as a musician, Early Years practitioner and parent. Here are some of the highlights:

Makaton hand signs: Our tutors have been trained in Makaton for Singing to support communication between adults and pre-verbal babies or speech-delayed bilingual children.

Songs for Grown Ups in our 6-18month classes: a moment for adults to enjoy the physical and mental health benefits of singing in a supportive group in the knowledge that their little ones are cocooned in sound.

Solfa and Kodály hand signals for our 4-year-olds to support pitch, sight-singing as well as getting ready for our **Foundation** classes: **Musicianship, Roundabout, Play!** and **Junior Choir**. Also, for the first time they will experience a stringed instrument – the ukulele, (which they can also have fun with in our Ukulele for age 3+.)

Young Artists

Our art classes are a playful creative start to art for children ages 0-4. Inspired by special days and seasonal events, there is a loose theme each week, although overall these sessions are child-led. They explore a variety of techniques including drawing, painting, printing, 3D, cutting and sticking, with lots of help and tips to inspire mark making, colour, texture and storytelling. They provide a fantastic opportunity for self-expression, and parents can breathe a sigh of relief that the mess stays with us!

What if I mix these colours? What if the bear has a loud booming singing voice but moves quickly? What does it feel like when I dip this sponge into this paint? What if I help the tutor hand out the tambourines to my classmates? What if we carry this curiosity throughout our whole lives...?

Young Artists Discover (6mths–4yrs)

A wonderful introduction to the world of art. These child-led, exploratory sessions will enable you and your child to discover different materials, textures and art forms in an engaging and stimulating environment. Children acquire new skills on a week-by-week basis and gain more confidence in the vocabulary they use to describe what they see and feel.

Activities are kept relevant and interesting by linking classes to seasonal activities and celebrations and stations focused on different inventive skills and activities are set up for children to explore at their leisure (with support from our fabulous artist-tutors). They can make as much or as little mess as they want on their creative journey! As they get older they can move up through the Young Artists Discover and Foundation stages.

Young Musicians Discover (Up to 18 mths)

You will focus on a theme; perhaps it will be the change of season to autumn and the animals and humans harvesting food for winter. Musicianship topics such as stopping and starting, high and low pitches, steady beat and loud and soft will be gently incorporated through song, percussion instruments and movement. You will notice your tutor using Makaton hand signs in the session to support non-verbal communication. Later in the session, whilst the babies are busy with our play bag, grown-ups can take a moment for themselves and sing a variety of world songs in unison or cannon lead by the tutor – Songs for Grown-Ups.

Young Musicians Discover (18mths–3yrs)

This term, as the summer turns to autumn the children might help squirrels gather nuts; they might walk in the woods amongst the falling leaves and find bears hiding. Eventually thoughts will turn to winter; soups need to be made, mince pies sold. They are going to be busy! As your tutor leads you through these and other stories, families will be unconsciously experiencing pitch, pulse, dynamics and other musicianship concepts. Together, week-by-week you will create a Song Box – a box full of small objects and puppets that remind us of all our favourite songs learnt throughout the term. Your tutor may also incorporate some Makaton hand signs into each lesson. There is so much to Discover!

Young Musicians Discover (3 & 4 yrs)

Using a selection of carefully curated books as a passport, children and adults are going on magical musical journeys with the tutor as the tour guide. It could be a trip to Kenya where some greedy animals help us learn about dynamics; or perhaps a night-time flight to a mysterious playroom where the toys teach us about pulse; there is a sleep-deprived bear whose stomping feet help us understand notation and a weather-loving elephant who with his friend Eddy helps understand rests. Gradually we are learning more consciously. Over the term we will also create a Song Box of "treasures" to remind us of certain songs as we learn Solfa which will improve sight-reading. The four-year-olds will, for the first time, move away from percussion and experience their first stringed instrument as they learn the rudiments of the ukulele.

Ukulele (3-5yrs)

In this class, the children learn basic techniques on this little instrument in an engaging and fun way. Together as a group, we explore all the sounds a ukulele can make, as well as strumming open string pieces and plucking with simple chords. We even work together to write our own little pieces of music. Best of all: ukuleles always sound good! This class is the perfect introduction to playing a stringed instrument. Students will progress through classes and are then able to join one of our many group string classes, Foundation Musicianship or Roundabout.

We have classes for 3-5 or 4-5 year olds to suit your schedule and groups for beginners and those who have some experience.

– bringing the building blocks together

Foundation Framework

At the Conservatoire, we believe in the power of learning together as part of children's musical and artistic **Foundation** – our **Young Artists** and **Young Musicians** learn by watching and listening to each other and any professional creative will tell you that collaborating and socialising through art and music is the **Foundation** of their developing practice. From this point they attend our classes independently as they move towards producing independently created art and music with the scaffolding support provided by a solid framework.

Foundation Skills

Our thoughtfully devised group courses are structured to develop a wide range of skills, explore new concepts across the arts and build social skills in a fun, informative and collaborative way. We hold termly performances and exhibitions – looking at and listening to the work of other students provides an important opportunity to develop a visual and musical vocabulary about what they see, what they hear, what they like and what they could try next.

Young Musicians

For our **Young Musicians** high-quality group lessons allow students, to develop increasingly sophisticated musicianship, instrumental and vocal skills in a fun and motivating environment. In **Foundation Musicianship**, students meet the orchestra, experience music from around the world, try out the ukulele and even start to

compose! Our flagship **Roundabout** programme introduces children to six instruments over the course of a year. They are then ready to choose their favoured instrument for the follow-on programme **Play!** which is designed to help children to progress further through small-group learning. In **Junior Choir** they can sing together, harmonising and exploring how the voice works. **Ukulele** age 4-5 gives them a chance to play and sing together in small, supportive groups.

Young Artists

Our **Young Artists** in **Foundation 4-6** build their skills throughout the term with step-by-step guidance and suggestions to help them along the way, alongside the opportunity to make their own choices and exert creative freedom! The inspiration is from exhibitions currently taking place across London and seasonal events. Children develop their knowledge of colour, texture, and their skills with brushes and scissors, while expanding their notions of what constitutes art with the emphasis still on fun!

The next step in **Foundation 6-11** is building upon and applying the knowledge and skills they already have, developing focus, deepening an understanding of the world and extending their self-expression. Using inspiration from current exhibitions, the tutor guides the children through the creative process teaching a broad range of skills but with more independent decision-making and problem-solving, developing the perseverance to overcome what they may perceive as mistakes.

Our Young Artists now take the next big step of attending on their own. They gain a fantastic wide-ranging artistic education, forming a bridge into a more structured (but still fun and imaginative!) learning environment where they take more ownership of their work, whilst still being supported. Step by step making done on their own pieces and simplified methods of each material process help children gain confidence with a variety of tools and techniques, helping them transition into their school years. Children's fine

motor skills develop at different rates, so scaffolded choices are always offered.

Activities are kept relevant and interesting by linking classes to seasonal activities and celebrations and inspirational artists. As they progress they can move on to Young Artist Foundation 6–11.

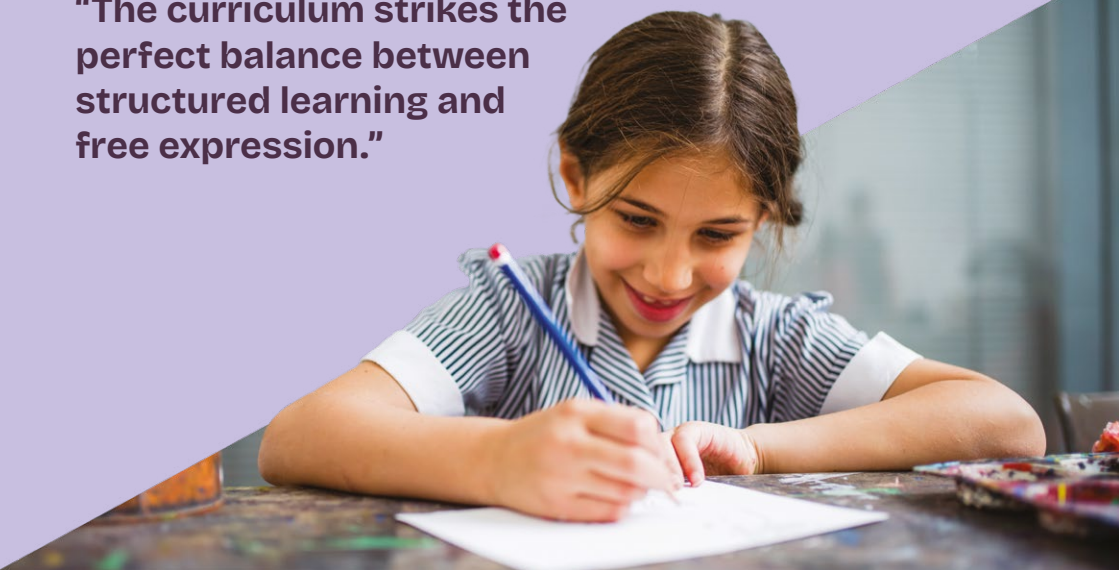

Foundation Musicianship (5–6yrs)

We have created this musically rich and diverse course to introduce children to the wider universe of classical and world music whilst continuing to deepen their knowledge of musicianship. There are four strands of learning: Meet the Orchestra with an opportunity to try instruments from the different orchestral families; Walk this World and understand the styles of music making in other countries; Carnival of the Animals where the children focus on a composer and learn how music can be written to illustrate different animals; Jack and the Beanstalk which is used to introduce pitch and writing short compositions on a 3-line staff with dynamic markings. In addition to the above, they will also be learning ukulele and Solfa.

This class is a perfect follow-on from our **Young Musicians Discover** classes, and also complements **individual tuition**, **Junior Choir** or **Roundabout**.

Roundabout (5-7yrs)

Programme Lead: Phil Entwistle

This is a 12-month class

Tutor(s): This course is taught by a range of our outstanding tutors.

A unique and very popular one-year introduction to six instruments for those who would like to try out a series of options before deciding which instrument they would like to learn. Children learn in small groups, spending half a term on each of the following: strings, brass, guitar, piano, flute and percussion.

Classes include a mixture of songs, musical games, instrumental techniques and creative projects. Over the course of the year, in three terms, children develop skills in rhythm, pitch, notation, performance and composition, as well as learning the basic technique for playing each instrument. This is structured as follows:

Term 1 - Rhythm – understanding and physicalising rhythm, using the French sounds (taa etc) used in our Discover classes.

Term 2 - Composition – Taking those rhythms and making them the student's own, through composition as an individual or as a group.

Term 3 - Improvisation – using everything the student has built up so far to explore expression and musicianship through improvisation.

Classes include a mixture of songs, musical games, instrumental techniques and creative projects. Each term, after spending a few weeks being introduced to their instrument, they come together with another instrument group for Chamber Week and then with all the other instruments for Orchestra Week, giving them their first experience of the small and large ensemble dynamic.

Each half term includes a Show & Share class, where all the children come together to perform. This provides an opportunity for friends and family to share in the children's achievements and celebrate their progress and culminates in an end-of-year Celebration Concert.

You will receive termly reports on your child's progress to keep you informed of their achievements.

Roundabout is very popular and places are often filled by those on the waiting list. Please contact us to see if we have spaces or to join the waiting list.

Please note that this is a year-long course, so when you enrol your child, you are committing to a year of weekly term-time classes at the same day and time every week, with a cost of £260-£338 a term dependent on the number of weeks in each.

This is a 12-month course

This is a year-long course of group teaching on one instrument taught by a range of our outstanding tutors, all of whom are very experienced teachers and performers. It is the perfect preparation year before embarking on one-to-one lessons. The instruments on offer are piano, violin, flute, guitar, percussion and brass (usually trumpet).

Play! is the perfect follow-on course from Roundabout or for beginners who would like to learn one instrument for a full year and graduate from the programme with their Play! Certificate. Children are taught in small groups and, by the end of this year-long programme will be able to:

- play a short piece from memory
- clap back rhythms
- read and play back a melody
- read simple rhythms and notes
- demonstrate a good knowledge of their chosen instrument

One of the many joys of learning to play an instrument is getting to play alongside other people. To enable this to happen, we run the weekly Play! Together Orchestra which brings cello, violin and flute together. Please see the combined time of the orchestra and group tuition sessions below.

At the end of term 1 & 2 (every term for Play! Together Orchestra), there is a performance week for you to hear how your children are getting on. This gives the children an opportunity to perform and be proud of their progress. The year ends with a Celebration Concert where all the children perform within their groups, as well as with all the instruments as a mass Play! Orchestra and are awarded their Play! Certificates.

You will receive an end-of-year report on your child's progress to keep you informed of their achievements.

Students work predominantly from first hand observation with additional use of photographic resources, to enable a deeper understanding of representation through mark-making and colour. The students study the work of other artists which helps to inform their own practice and expand their visual literacy.

Mould Making and Casting (10–16yrs)

Have you ever wanted to turn your clay creations into plaster? Have you ever wondered how life like body parts are made in film or TV or how plaster can be made to look like metal for special effect? Then this course is for you! In these safely supervised workshops, we will be exploring and making a range of mould making and casting techniques where you can create beautiful resin and floral keepsakes, replicate your clay sculptures with silicon and plaster that will last forever, cast delicate botanical tiles and even come away with a body part or two!

Over the course, we will explore how to make and use waste moulds and silicone moulds. We will explore life casting using alginate and plaster and decorative techniques using bronzing powder and wax. We will also create resin pieces using dried flowers and Terazzo tiles using pigments and acrylic resin. Perfect for anyone interested in sculpture, model making, prop making, the decorative arts or anyone with an enthusiasm for 'hands on' making.

Please note that any plaster or resin items will be available to be picked up after 3 days from making, this is to allow for drying time.

Discover how observation, memory, atmosphere and everyday experience can become starting points for abstract painting. This thoughtful and accessible course is designed for anyone who would like to move beyond representation, loosen their approach and develop a more personal visual language.

Using landscape, objects, architecture, colour and lived experience as inspiration, we will explore how artists simplify, reduce and reinterpret what they see and feel. Looking at prominent abstract painters from the 20th century to the present day, each session will focus on different aspects of abstraction – including colour, rhythm, mood, geometry, texture, composition and surface.

Working primarily in acrylic, with opportunities to incorporate drawing and collage, students will experiment with a range of techniques through guided exercises, artist references and practical demonstrations. The course encourages process-led discovery while balancing structured projects with space for individual interpretation and development.

Sessions include demonstrations, group discussion and individual feedback within a supportive studio environment.

By the end of the course, students will have developed greater confidence in approaching abstract painting, strengthened their understanding of colour and composition, and created a body of work that reflects their growing artistic voice.

Through master copies, students will deepen their understanding of atmosphere, depth, colour harmony and composition by learning how great painters organised shape, tone and edge to create powerful landscape paintings. The course will also look at the expressive colour simplifications of Nicolas de Staël, offering contrasting approaches to observation and abstraction.

Weekly studio exercises may include limited-palette landscape studies, tonal thumbnail sketches, colour-mixing drills, atmospheric perspective exercises, reduction of complex scenes into major value shapes, brushwork studies from master paintings, and developing small plein-air studies into resolved studio compositions. Come along to explore portraiture in this beginner-friendly class, designed for artists of all levels to develop their skills in portraiture while encouraging experimentation.

Students will strengthen their observational abilities, learning to judge proportions, understand the underlying structure of the face, and investigate how different artists have approached these challenges. The course also covers how to handle light, shadow, and skin tones in paint, working in oils (or acrylics if preferred).

Alongside these technical elements, students will be encouraged to consider expression, context, and narrative-how a portrait can convey identity or tell a story. As the course progresses, students will have the opportunity to paint portraits of a variety of sitters in the studio.

Lee has over fifteen years of experience as a practicing artist in Greenwich, specialising in portrait commissions and landscape drawings. Lee's portrait of broadcaster and author Michael Rosen can be seen at the National Portrait Gallery.

This course covers a full introduction to lino, mono, photo transfer and dry point printmaking techniques working with full instruction from a professional printmaker. Working in Watercolour

Beginners Welcome!

All levels are welcome to come and explore watercolour! Over this course artist Sophie Knight will show you some of her own methods which will help you to really have fun with the medium and work more impulsively. Starting with a few simple exercises for applying washes, Sophie will show you how to achieve amazing things with just four colours. Taking inspiration from photographs of landscape and seascape Sophie will show you some ways to apply the paint quickly using large colour washes and learning to cover the paper quickly so that you can develop a large composition. 'I will show you some techniques for working 'wet on wet' and drawing directly with your brush, we can also create large washes of rich colour by squeezing the paint straight onto damp paper.' Whether you are a beginner or have a little bit of experience but would like to develop a sense of freedom with watercolour, this course would suit you. Sophie Knight is a member of The Royal Watercolour Society and has her work in The British Museum, The House of Lords and several high-profile collections.

Our Baroque Ensemble is an exceptional training ground for music from the Middle Ages to early 19th century. Players of recorders, flutes, oboes, strings, piano/harpsichord, viola da gamba, theorbo, lute and archlute are welcome to join our thriving community of instrumentalists who share a love for making Early Music. The Conservatoire also has its own harpsichord, a French-style five-octave single manual.

These ensembles offer students of Grade 6 and above the opportunity to play with a wide range of instruments in a chamber setting. We explore the orchestral repertoire written before 1800 in a historically informed way with mostly one or two instruments per part, usually working towards a termly performance. The classes are friendly and welcoming, and music is played and enjoyed in a relaxed atmosphere. Students generally have access to a music room to warm up for half an hour beforehand.

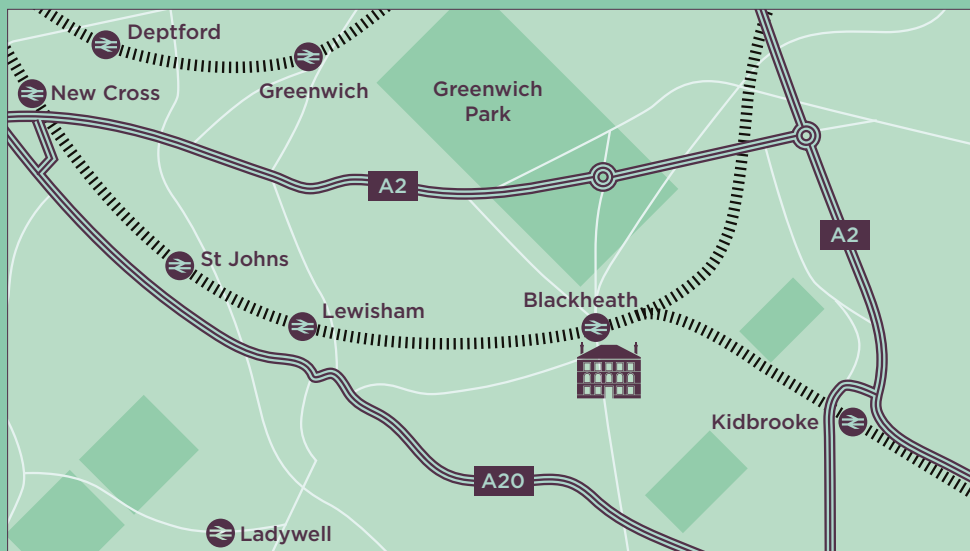
