

Minutes of the meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Eva held in regular session December 14, 1978, at 7 p.m., present: Roland Ryan, Mayor, and the following members of the Council: Jerry Mobley, Terrell Livingston, Donald Ray Morgan, and Alton Page.

The minutes of the November 9 meeting were read and approved. Financial report was given as follows:

The Mayor handed out copies of the proposed 1979 budget to Council Members. It was discussed briefly and approved. He then brought the Councilmen up to date on the progress of the Senior Citizens Center for Eva Community, stating that all that is needed now is funding for salaries of the Site Manager and the Van Driver. Applications have been made for these funds.

Mrs. Holmes reported briefly on plans for the Christmas Party for Senior Citizens to be held at the Eva School Lunchroom and Auditorium on Thursday, December 21. Plans are progressing well and there seems to be a lot of interest.

The Mayor reported that the planned Seminar at Wallace State Community College on Federal Programs and Procedures, Agendas, Council meetings and resolutions, had been postponed until late January or February. Since Mrs. Holmes is interested in attending this Seminar, Mr. Page offered the motion that the City pay her \$7.50 registration fee to attend whenever it is rescheduled. Mr. Morgan seconded the motion and it carried.

After some discussion about a Butane tank for heating the Volunteer Fire Department, Mr. Page offered the motion that we get a tank for the extra butane gas needed by the VFD during winter. The Motion was seconded by Mr. Mobley and carried.

The following four bills were presented for payment: Telephone \$40.30; Water \$5.72; Jack Hopper for insulation \$2.75; Clerk's Salary for November (56 hours) \$148.40. Mr. Livingston offered the motion that said bills be paid; seconded by Mr. Page.

The Mayor presented plaques to the widow of Roamer Lee Livingston and the widow of Claud Patton, expressing appreciation for the time that their late husbands spent as Council Members, and for their contributions to the work of the City. He also displayed a commemorative plaque to be hung in City Hall recognizing the people who were charter members of the City Council in 1963. Two charter councilmen, Mr. L. G. McDonald and Mr. Mitchell Hipps were present to witness the ceremony. Other guests for these presentations were Mrs. Mitchell Hipps, Miss Rosemary Livingston, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Eddleman and daughter. The Mayor offered the option to Mrs. Livingston and Mrs. Patton that they could take the plaques home with them, or leave them to be hung in Town Hall. Both elected to take them home to pass on to their children. Following the presentation, and words of thanks from the Livingston and Patton families, the City Council had an informal coffee for the guests.
