

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Council of Eva held in regular session at 7 p.m. on December 13, 1979, attended by the Mayor and Councilmen Mobley, Morgan, Page and Livingston.

Minutes of the November 15 meeting were read and approved. Financial report was accepted as presented, giving the end of November balances as follows:

General Fund	\$322.19 (+ \$1500 in passbook savings)
Gasoline Tax Fund	180.92
Revenue Sharing Fund	1336.76

The Mayor introduced Eva citizen Mrs. Eloise Livingston who had the following information which she presented to the Council: The Wheeler Basin Regional Library has offered a Bookmobile to the Town of Eva, with the plan that they would come out once a month to bring additional books and materials and change them out. They would supply the kinds of books and periodicals that we request. They would also provide records and tapes for the handicapped, and whatever other materials might be needed by senior citizens. The Town of Eva would be required to pay the utility bill (the bookmobile has a 120 heater in it), and to staff it. It was recommended that we arrange for 2 regular staff members and 2 backup members which Mrs. Livingston said that she would be willing to work with to get them set up and trained on a checkout program. The Mayor asked the question as to whether or not the Town of Eva would be held responsible in the case of vandalism, to which Mrs. Livingston replied that they would not. After discussion, Mr. Page offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Mobley, that we accept the offer of the Wheeler Basin Library. Mrs. Livingston will work out the details with Ms. Nancy Agnew who heads up the Library. It was decided to start a program of keeping the Bookmobile open two afternoons or mornings a week, depending on what can be worked out with the volunteers. Mrs. Livingston will ask the Library to bring the bookmobile out in January at their convenience. Plan is to park it at the East end of the Town Building.

The Mayor reported that members of the Eva Senior Citizens Site Council had talked to him about buying a Kiln for the Center to fire their ceramics. They offered to pay the extra amount, if any, on the electric bill for use of the Kiln.

This led to a discussion about our not getting billed from Mr. Childers on the electricity. even though we have asked several times for the amount we owe. We have not been billed since May. It was decided that we would try to get the billing transferred from Childers' account to the Town of Eva. Mr. Mobley in the meantime will try to find out how the account is running.

Mr. Mobley will try again to get some maps needed for further work in extending the Town Limits.

The Mayor reported on the success of the chicken supper on November 17 sponsored by the Eva Volunteer Fire Department which netted \$880.35. He announced that there will be enough money in the treasury to pay for the alarm system when it arrives. He then went over the incoming mail briefly, saying that before the next meeting we will have to certify and return to the Census Bureau the boundary limits of the Town of Eva. He talked briefly about the report from the Mental Health Council, and told of the availability of these periodicals if the members of the Council wished to look at them: NARCOG's Region Report, The Consumer's Counsel, News from the North Alabama Health Systems Agency, Alabama Development News, Alabama Education News and the Alabama Digger.

Bills presented for payment were: Clerk's salary for November (after deductions) \$67.70; Petrolane for gas at Senior Citizens Center \$124.96; National Butane for gas at Fire Dept. \$44.08; Water Bill \$6.76; Phone bill \$40.79 less \$8.75 paid by Senior Citizens. Mr. Page offered motion, seconded by Mr. Morgan to pay the bills. There being no further business, Mr. Mobley offered the motion to adjourn.
